TONIGHT'S GAME: Arkansas

Tech (7-3 overall in 2006) will open its 93rd season of intercollegiate football Thursday, Aug. 23 when they travel to Maryville, Mo., to face two-time defending NCAA Division II National runners-up **Northwest Missouri State** (14-1 in 2006) at **Bearcat Stadium** (6,500/field turf). Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. and will mark the first night game at Northwest Missouri State since the early 1970s. In addition, the game is the earliest season opener for the Wonder Boys in school history.

Tech enters Thursday's season opener looking to continue its recent run of success that has seen it post a 24-8 record over the past three seasons, including back-to-back 7-3 campaigns, while Northwest Missouri State has finished as runner-up the past two seasons to Grand Valley State in the D-II National Championship game. Since 2004, the Bearcats have posted an amazing 36-7 record and won back-to-back NCAA D-II national titles in 1998 and 1999.

TECH RETURNS TO BUERKLE

FIELD IN 2007: After playing all five home games during the 2006 season at Russellville High School's Cyclone Stadium thanks to renovations on Tech's home stadium - Buerkle Field - as part of the school's \$4-million 'Return to Glory' capital campaign, the Wonder Boys will return to the renovated Buerkle Field when it plays its first home game of the 2007 season on Sept. 8 against Texas College.

The 'Return to Glory' campaign raised money to support the construction of a residence hall as a wrap-around to the current football stadium, revitalization of the field, enhancements to the school's women's sports facilities and the addition of a permanent bandstand in the end zone for Tech's band. The new and improved Buerkle Field features a 226-bed residence hall, a new press box, controlled entrances to the stadium, new ticket

booths, new concession stands, revamped restroom facilities, an auxiliary bookstore for the sale of Tech spirit merchandise, a new and improved scoreboard and four new and improved field lights.

THE COACHES: The Wonder Boys are coached by **Steve Mullins** (Ark.-Monticello, '80). Mullins is 66-41 in his 11th season as head coach and is 56-32 all-time in GSC games. Tech's assistant coaches for 2006 are: **Benyard Jones** (defensive coordinator/linebackers), **Scott Preston** (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks & running backs), **Les Boyum** (offensive line), **Erik Kruppe** (defensive line), **Ryan Wallace** (receivers), **Greg Williams** (defensive backs), **Brett Hobbs** (GA/linebackers), **Andrew Jackson** (SA/secondary), **Garren Rockwell** (GA/defensive line), **Kyle Shipp** (GA/offensive line) and **Antonio Whitfield** (GA/receivers). The Bearcats are coached by **Mel Tjeerdsma** (Southern State '67). Tjeerdsma is 132-36 in his 14th season at Northwest Missouri and has compiled a 191-75-4 record in his 24th season as a collegiate head coach. The Bearcats assistant coaches for 2007 are: **Scott Bostwick** (defensive coordinator/linebackers); **Adam Dorrel** (offensive coordinator/offensive line); **Charlie Flohr** (passing game coordinator/recruiting coordinator/receivers); **Will Wagner** (assistant head coach/defensive backs) and **Rich Wright** (defensive line/special teams/strength coordinator).

LAST GAME vs. NORTHWEST MISSOURI: In the first and only meeting between the two schools, Northwest Missouri State scored 24 first half points enroute to posting a 31-14 win over the Wonder Boys at Rickenbrode Stadium in Maryville, Mo., on Aug. 28, 1999. In the game, Tech was outgained 459 to 299 by the top-ranked Bearcats, as the Wonder Boys were held to minus-1 yards rushing on 24 attempts. Tech's two touchdowns were scored in the first quarter on an 89-yard pass from **George Harp** to **Greg Washington** and a 27-yard pass in the fourth quarter from Harp to **Lance Strother**. Harp finished the game 17-for-30

through the air for 300 yards and one interception to go with two touchdowns. Strother led the receiving corp with seven catches for 130 yards, while Washington caught four passes for 112 yards. Meanwhile, the Bearcats were led offensively by quarterback **Travis Miles**, who was 20-for-33 through the air for 238 yards and one touchdown, while running backs **Dan White** and **David Jansen** combined for 31 carries and 136 yards and wide receiver **Seneca Holmes** caught three passes for 68 yards in the victory.

THE NORTHWEST MISSOURI SERIES: Thursday's game against Northwest Missouri State marks just the second meeting between the teams and the first since the opening game of the 1999 season. The Bearcats won the team's only meeting 31-14 in Maryville, Mo., on Aug. 28, 1999. Thursday's game will also mark Tech's first game against a school from the MIAA (Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association) since facing off against Southwest Baptist in Alma, Ark., on Sept. 4, 1999.

ON THIS DATE: Arkansas Tech has never played a football game on Aug. 23 and in fact, Thursday's game is the earliest-ever football game in Tech's 93-year history. In addition, Tech has played just seven previous games in the month of August and Thursday's game will mark the fourth straight season that the Wonder Boys have begun the season in August. Tech is 3-4 all-time in games played during the month of August, but have won three straight games in the month, all of which have come against next Thursday's opponent, Northeastern State. ABOUT THE NORTHWEST MISSOURI BEARCATS: Northwest Missouri enters Thursday's season opener looking to repeat the success the Bearcats have enjoyed the past two seasons as they have compiled a 25-5 record and have lost to Grand Valley State in the last two Division II National Championship games. In fact, since the beginning of the 2000s, Northwest is the third winningest D-II program with 74 wins and the fourth-best winning percentage over that same stretch (.822). Last season, the Bearcats went 14-1 and became the 38th team to go undefeated in MIAA (Mid-America Intercollegiate Athletics Association) play as the Bearcats went 9-0 last season. It was Northwest's 10th unblemished campaign in MIAA play in school history and its first league title since winning back-to-back titles in 2002 and 2003. This season, Northwest Head Coach **Mel Tjeerdsma**, who is in his entering 14th season with the Bearcats, returns 16 starters, including eight on offense, five on defense and top kicker, punter and return specialist from last season. One of the strengths of this season's Northwest team is its offense, which returns eight starters, including Preseason All-Americans, senior running back **Xavier Omon** and senior tight end **Mike Petersen**. Omon, who was a Harlon Hill finalist last season as a junior, holds the Northwest career records for rushing attempts, rushing yards, rushing average per game and 100-yard rushing games. He enters the sea-

son having rushed for 4,736 career yards, including rushing for 3,344 yards in regular season contests and has had 55 career rushing touchdowns and 60 overall touchdowns. Last season, he gained 1,518 yards on 343 carries (4.4 avg./per carry) and scored 22 rushing touchdowns and 24 overall touchdowns, while Petersen caught 38 passes for 536 yards and had five touchdowns for the Bearcats in 2006. In addition to Omon and Petersen, senior quarterback **Josh Mathews** and junior receiver **Kendall Wright** return to help the offense. Mathews, who earned All-MIAA honors last season, completed 65.9 percent of his passes and threw for 3,336 yards on 251 completions and tossed 10 touchdowns, while Wright, who also was a First-Team All-MIAA performer, caught 83 passes for 1,151 yards last season and had six touchdowns, including one on a punt return. As a returner, Wright tallied 341 yards on 36 returns (9.5 avg./game) last season. On defense, Northwest returns just five starters from one of the top defenses in Division II last season. Among the key returners are senior defensive end **Dallas Flynn** and senior linebacker **Jared Erspamer**. Flynn, who is one of the team's four captains, enters his senior campaign with 16 career quarterback sacks, while Erspamer, who was a Preseason Second-Team All-American by Lindy's, recorded 72 total tackles, which was second on the team and had nine tackles for loss.

TECH RECORDS 500TH ALL-TIME WIN: In its win last season on Oct. 27, 2006, at Southern Arkansas, the Wonder Boys made history as they became the 11th NCAA Division II program to win 500 football games all-time. Since beginning football in 1911, Tech has compiled a 501-316-41 all-time record and is the 11th all-time winningest D-II football program. In addition, Tech is just the second football program in the state of Arkansas to record at least 500 all-time wins, as the Arkansas Razorbacks have won 637 games in 113 seasons of competition.

TECH IS 11TH ON D-II ALL-TIME WINNINGEST TEAMS LIST:

Since beginning football 93 years ago, Tech stands in 11th place on the list of all-time winningest NCAA Division II football programs. Tech has recorded 501 wins all-time entering Thursday's season opener and the Wonder Boys are one of 12 schools to win at least 485 all-time games. Tech enters Thursday's season opener with a 501-316-41 all-time record, winning nearly 61 percent of their 858 games.

Pittsburg [KS] State headlines the list of all-time winningest programs with 613 wins, while Tuskegee [AL] is second all-time with 587 wins. North Dakota is third with 580 wins, while Central Oklahoma is fourth with 574 and Hillsdale [MI] is fifth in wins all-time with 554. Texas A&M-Kingsville is sixth all-time with 548 wins, Carson-Newman is seventh with 521 wins and Truman [Mo.] State is eighth with 514 all-time wins. Northern State is ninth with 509 all-time victories, while West Chester is 10th with 504 wins and Virginia Union is 12th with 493 wins.

THE MULLINS FILE

STEVE MULLINS - HEAD COACH / ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

University of Arkansas-Monticello, 1980 (B.S. Science)

University of Central Arkansas, 1982 (M.Ed. Physical Education)

Steve Mullins is entering his 11th season at the helm of the Wonder Boys. He enters the upcoming season with an overall record of 66-41 (.617) and a Gulf South Conference record of 56-32 (.636).

Since joining the sidelines as Tech's head coach in 1997, Mullins has brought the Wonder Boys into the upper echelon of the toughest NCAA Division II football conference in the country. He has led Tech to one Gulf South Championship (1999) and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory (2004).

Mullins enters the 2007 season as the second winningest active coach in terms of wins in the GSC and is the third winningest coach in Arkansas Tech's 94-year history of football.

Last season, Mullins led Tech to a 7-3 overall record and a 5-3 mark in the GSC. The seven wins was Mullins' sixth season of winning at least seven games with the Wonder Boys.

In 2004, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to the school's fourth-ever 10-win season and first since 1971 and led the squad to the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the second time in five seasons. In addition, Tech won its first ever play-off game at the Division II level and set the school record for total offense (4,949 yards).

For the season, Tech finished the season with a 10-2 record and an 8-1 mark in the Gulf South Conference, which led Mullins to be named the GSC and AFCA Division II Region Coach of the Year.

In his first two seasons at Tech, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to records of 4-7 in 1997 and 5-5 in 1998 before breaking through in 1999 with a 9-3 record and the school's first GSC Championship, which earned Mullins the league's Coach of the Year honor. The 1999 team featured three All-Americans and seven All-GSC selections.

Following the 1999 season, Mullins led Tech to records of 7-3 in 2000, including a 24-10 win over eventual national champion Delta State and 8-2 in 2001.

Since coming to Tech, Mullins' impact can't just be measured in mere wins and losses. In the past nine years, 38 Wonder Boys have been selected to the GSC All-Academic Team and 115 football players have qualified for the GSC Academic Honor Roll. In addition, 14 Wonder Boys have been named CoSIDA Academic All-District VI and four Tech players have received CoSIDA Academic All-American honors.

Along with that, five different Tech football players have been named to the GSC 'Top 10' Student-Athlete list and two Wonder Boys have received the GSC's Commissioner's Cup as the top male student-athlete in the league.

After six successful years at the helm of the football program, Mullins added the title of athletic director to his duties on April 16, 2003. In that capacity, he oversees the day-to-day operations of the athletic department and the school's 10 sport program.

Mullins began his Tech career in 1997 after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I-AA Northwestern State in Natchitoches, La.

Prior to Northwestern State, Mullins, the Camden, Ark., native, served for two seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State, two seasons as an assistant at Southwestern Oklahoma State and four years as an assistant coach at Lamar University.

The former University of Arkansas-Monticello defensive tackle began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Central Arkansas in 1981. As a player at UAM, Mullins was a three-time All-Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference selection, a three-time All-NAIA District 17 selection, a two-time NAIA All-American, an Associated Press Small College All-American as a senior in 1979 and is a member of the UAM Athletic Hall of Fame.

Mullins, who graduated from Camden [Ark.] High School in 1976, is married to the former Elizabeth (Liz) Morgan of Groves, Texas. The couple have three children, Katie (19), a sophomore at Tech, Hunter (16) and Mason (12).

Statesmen are ranked seventh, while Valdosta State is ranked eighth, North Alabama checks in at No. 16 and Henderson State is ranked 23rd in the poll. Two-time defending NCAA D-II national champions Grand Valley State sits atop the D-II poll, while NW Missouri State is ranked second and Chadron State is No. 3. North Dakota and Bloomsburg [PA] round out the Top 5 at No. 4 and No. 5 respectively. The Wonder Boys face all four of the GSC ranked teams in the Lindy's poll on four successive weeks and they open the season

tonight at No. 2 ranked Northwest Missouri State. In addition to ranking the Top 25 D-II teams, Lindy's also compiled a list of key D-II games this season and Tech's game on Oct. 6 at Delta State is one of those 25 key D-II games. Other key GSC games listed are Henderson State at Delta State on Sept. 15, Delta State at Valdosta State on Oct. 11 and North Alabama at Valdosta State on Oct. 27.

OPENING THE SEASON AGAINST NORTHWEST MISSOURI NOT ALL BAD:

The only time that Tech has faced off against Northwest Missouri State came in the season opener in 1999 and even though Tech fell 31-14 to the Bearcats, the game seemed to spur the Wonder Boys on as they went on to finish the season with a 9-3 record and win their only Gulf South Conference Football title and also earn the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff appearance. Following the loss to the Bearcats, Tech won nine of its next 10 regular season games, including going 8-1 in GSC play to become the first Arkansas school to win a GSC football title. During league play, Tech collected home wins over both North Alabama (24-21) and Valdosta State (21-14), but suffered its only league loss at Delta State (17-10). The Wonder Boys ended the season by falling 40-28 at Carson-Newman in the first round of the D-II Playoffs. In fact, the loss to Carson-Newman snapped an eight-game winning streak for the Wonder Boys.

TECH ENTERS NEW SEASON HAVING WON FOUR STRAIGHT GAMES:

Tech enters the 2007 season in the midst of a four-game winning streak as they ended last season winning its final four games, holding its four opponents to a combined 73 points (18.3 points/game) and scoring 124 points (31 points/game) after losing three straight games to fifth-ranked Valdosta State, third-ranked North

Alabama and 16th-ranked Delta State in the middle of the season. The four-game winning streak is the longest for Tech since winning five straight games during the 2005 season. The four-game winning streak is the longest such streak for a GSC team entering this season.

TECH IN THE NATIONAL POLLS:

Tech enters the season opener unranked in two of the three major Division II national polls. The Wonder Boys received five votes to be 19th among teams receiving votes in the AFCA D-II Coaches Preseason poll that was released on Tuesday, Aug. 21. In addition, Tech was unranked in the D2Football.com Preseason poll and finished last season ranked 20th in *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* Top 40 Poll.

tabbed to finish sixth in the pre-season Gulf South Conference Coaches Poll, which was released on July 31. Tech received 55 points in the poll that was voted on by the league's head coaches and the coaches couldn't vote for their own teams. In the poll, Tech received three votes for fourth, two votes each for fifth and sixth place and three votes for seventh. Defending GSC champion North Alabama was tabbed as the preseason favorite for the second consecutive season as the Lions garnered 95 points and six of a possible 11 first-place votes. Valdosta State was picked second as they received 89 points and three first-place votes, while Delta State was tabbed third as the Statesmen received 84 points and a first place vote. Henderson State was picked fourth as they earned 75 points and the final first place vote, while Harding was tabbed to finish one spot in front of Tech as the Bisons earned 56 points. Behind Tech in the poll was West Alabama (54 points), Southern Arkansas (33 points), West Georgia (30 points), Ouachita Baptist (19 points) and Arkansas-Monticello (15 points).

VANHOOK NAMED PRESEASON ALL-GSC SELECTION: After earning First-Team All-GSC honors last season after rushing for 507 yards and scoring six touchdowns, senior tailback **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.) enters his senior campaign as Tech's lone preseason All-GSC selection. Vanhook, who is 818 yards shy of becoming the fourth Wonder Boy to surpass the 3,000-yard career rushing plateau, was one of two running backs named to the preseason offensive team and one of 15 returning First-Team All-GSC selections from last season. In addition to naming Vanhook a member of the Preseason All-GSC Team, junior offensive tackle **Jeremy Ashcraft** (Marshall, Texas), a transfer from East Texas Baptist University, was named to the league's Top Newcomers List. Ashcraft, who transferred to Tech before the beginning of the 2007 spring semester, is listed as 6-foot-6 and

**VANHOOK CLIMBING UP
SCHOOL'S CAREER RUSHING**

CHART: Senior running back **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.) enters his final season at Tech just 818 yards shy of becoming just the fourth Wonder Boy to surpass the 3,000-yard rushing plateau. In his career, he has gained 2,182 yards (4.9 yards/carry) and has scored 21 total touchdowns, including 19 career rushing touchdowns. With is 21 touchdowns, Vanhook stands 13th on the school's career scoring chart with 140 points. In Tech's 55-35 win last season at Ouachita Baptist, Vanhook gained 50 yards on the ground and became just the 11th player in Tech history to gain at least 2,000 rushing yards. Last season, he gained 507 yards (5.1 yards/carry) on the ground and scored six touchdowns. Vanhook's best season as a Wonder Boy came in as a redshirt freshman in 2004 when he gained 1,089 yards (5.7 yards/carry) and scored 11 rushing touchdowns in helping Tech compile a 10-2 record.

Williams** (1972-90) headlines the list with 124 wins, while former North Alabama head coach (1988-97) and current West Alabama coach **Bobby Wallace** is second on the list with 89 wins and former North Alabama coach **Wayne Grubb** (1977-87) is third with 82 all-time victories. Boy to earn AFCA D-II Coaches' First-Team All-American honors and was the fifth-ever Tech player to be named an AP Little All-American as he was a third-team selection and also earned Third-Team *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-Southeast Region honors.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN: Tech had one player named a 2006 Preseason All-American by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* - senior defensive tackle **Andrew Murphy**. As a junior in 2006, Murphy, who was named a Third-Team *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-

Southeast Region selection, ranked sixth in the final NCAA D-II national football statistics in forced fumbles (0.4 per game) and recorded 38 total tackles, including 18 solo stops, 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 quarterback sacks. In addition, he forced four fumbles, had three fumble recoveries and an interception, which was returned 42 yards for a touchdown against Valdosta State, which led to Murphy being named the GSC's Defensive Player of the Week.

Murphy, a native of Booneville, Miss., and a transfer from Northeast Mississippi Community College, was one of 20 GSC players named to the Preseason *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-American team.

This season's All-American team features 154 players and is comprised of 86 seniors, 50 juniors and 18 sophomores from all four geographic regions of NCAA Division II.

QUINCY SKINNER NAMED TECH'S 28TH ALL-AMERICAN IN 2006:

In his only season at Tech, cornerback **Quincy Skinner** (Coral Springs, Fla.) made quite an impression as the Florida Atlantic transfer became the school's 28th different Wonder Boy to earn All-American status and the 12th Wonder Boy to earn All-American recognition under Mullins. Skinner, who was a Second-Team All-GSC selection, finished last season ranked fifth nationally in Division II in interceptions (0.8 per game) and recorded 63 tackles, including a team-best 43 solo stops and had 2.5 tackles for loss, five pass break-ups, one fumble recovery, one forced fumble and defended 1.3 passes per game, which was 20th in the final D-II national statistics. Skinner became the third Wonder

TECH THIRD WINNINGEST GSC TEAM SINCE 1999:

Since 1999, Tech is the third winningest team in the GSC with 56 overall wins in 85 games and is also third in GSC wins with 47 over that same span. Valdosta State is the winningest team in the league since 2000 with 78 overall wins in 97 games and has recorded 57 GSC victories, while Delta State is second with 60 overall wins in 87 games and is second in GSC wins with 49.

In addition to being the third winningest team overall in the GSC since 1999, Tech is also the winningest football program at any level in the state of Arkansas over that same span with 56 wins, while NCAA Division I-A Arkansas is second with 55 and Central Arkansas is third with 53 wins. SAU is fourth with 47 wins, while Harding is fifth with 45 wins. Arkansas-Pine



Bluff is sixth with 36 wins, NCAA Division I-A Arkansas State is seventh with 32 victories and UAM is eighth with 31 wins. Henderson State is ninth with 24 wins and Ouachita Baptist is 10th with 23 wins.

CURSH SET TO RETURN TO FIELD IN 2007:

Tech's defense will be bolstered this year by the return of the 2004 GSC Defensive Player of the Year, junior linebacker **Cedric Cursh** (Foreman, Ark.). Cursh, who sat out the past two seasons to deal with some off-the-field legal issues, will be a welcomed addition to a defense that returns just six starters from a year ago. As a sophomore in 2004, Cursh, who was also named an AP Little All-American, recorded 95 total tackles, including 21 tackles for loss, nine quarterback sacks, five forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and one interception as he helped lead the Wonder Boys to a 10-2 record and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory. In the NCAA Playoff victory against Catawba, Cursh finished with 10 tackles, including five solo stops and had two tackles for losses of nine yards, one sack, one forced fumble and recovered two fumbles enroute to earning National Defensive Player of the Week honors from *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*. His forced fumble and subsequent fumble recovery at

Tech's 47-yard line with 38 seconds remaining in the game sealed Tech's 24-20 win over Catawba. Cursh enters this season ninth on the school's career sack list with nine and has recorded 179 career tackles, including 95 solo stops and has had 28 tackles for losses of 129 yards.

TECH UNVEILS NEW HELMETS, COLOR SCHEME THIS SEASON:

During the offseason, Arkansas Tech changed the color schemes for the school. Tech has switched from its traditional Green and Old Gold color to a Green (PMS 343) and Gold (PMS 116) scheme. The gold color is similar to the Green Bay Packers yellow that is worn on its helmets. With the change in colors, the Wonder Boys had to change its helmets this season from gold to yellow. In addition, they have added new uniforms for both home and away games this season.

WONDER BOYS WELCOME NEW COORDINATORS THIS SEASON:

For the first time since 2004, Tech enters a season with both a new offensive and defensive coordinator. During the offseason, Mullins promoted **Benyard Jones** to defensive coordinator and brought in 18-year coaching veteran **Scott Preston** as the offensive coordinator. Jones, who is in his second tour of duty at

Tech after spending five seasons from 1999-2004 at Tech as an assistant and then returning last season as the defensive line coach after spending the 2005 season as the defensive coordinator at Butler University, an NCAA Division I-AA member. Meanwhile, Preston brings a wealth of experience to Tech as he spent four seasons (2000-03) as the offensive coordinator, quar-



terback, running back and receivers coach at Illinois State University. In addition to Illinois State, Preston also had stints at Murray State University, Ventura [CA] College, Georgia Military College, San Francisco State and began his collegiate coaching career working with Hal Mumme at Valdosta State University.

SCORING STREAKS: Tech enters Thursday's season opener having scored in 33 straight games since being shutout 30-0 by Valdosta State in the next to last game of the 2003 season. In fact, since Mullins took over the program in 1997, Tech has failed to score in a game only twice and has scored in 121 of its last 123 games.

Meanwhile, Tech's opponents have scored in 45 consecutive games, including 12 of its last 20 opponents scoring 30-plus points,

since the Wonder Boys held West Alabama scoreless on Nov. 2, 2002. In the last eight years, Tech has held only one opponent scoreless and has held nine opponents under 10 points, including two opponents last season.

BARTHEL LOOKS TO DIRECT OFFENSE UNDER CENTER: One season after sharing quarterback duties with junior **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.), junior **Cole Barthel** (Decatur, Ala.) enters 2007 as the Wonder Boys starting signal caller, as the Tech coaches moved Ray to a receiver spot to take advantage of his athleticism and is big-play ability. As a sophomore last season, Barthel, who transferred to Tech from the University of Arkansas, saw action in nine games and was 121-for-196 through the air for 1,290 yards and threw 17 touchdowns and had nine interceptions. He finished the season with a 136.46 efficiency rating, which was 37th among all Division II quarterbacks and fifth in the league and he completed nearly 62 percent of his passes and averaged 143.3 yards per game, which was seventh in the GSC. With Ray's move to receiver, Barthel will be backed up by junior **Carter Hallock** (Walnut Creek, Calif.), a transfer from Palomar Community College and redshirt freshman **Ben Johnson** (Hamburg, Ark.).

TECH STRONG AT PROTECTING THE BALL IN 2006: Tech closed out the 2006 season ranked 28th in NCAA D-II Football in turnover margin as the Wonder Boys had a +0.6 margin for its 10 games. On the season, Tech's offense committed 22 turnovers as they had 11 interceptions and lost 11 fumbles, while its defense forced 14 fumbles and picked off 14 passes on the season. Tech was tied for the second in the GSC in turnover margin with Delta State. North Alabama led the league with a +0.7 margin as they committed 16 turnovers and forced 24 turnovers.

35 POINTS IS THE MAGIC NUMBER: Since taking the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, Coach

DID YOU KNOW FACT. . .

Cole Barthel and Tech assistant baseball coach **Wes McCrotty** share a common similarity. That similarity is that both of them were drafted in the 2001 Major League Baseball Draft, as Barthel was a second-round selection (71st pick overall) by the Atlanta Braves out of Decatur (Ala.) High School, while McCrotty, a graduate of Russellville High School, was drafted in the 23rd round (692nd overall) by the Florida Marlins after a stellar pitching career with the Arkansas Razorbacks.

Mullins' Tech teams are 25-2 all-time in games in which they score 35 or more points in a single game. In fact, Tech is 30-10 when it scores between 21-34 points during the Mullins era, including being 4-0 last season. Tech has won 23 straight games when scoring at least 35 or more points and hasn't lost since falling 53-36 to UCA in 1997 when scoring 35 or more points.

TECH IN HOME GSC GAMES: Since joining the GSC in 1995, Tech is 29-13 all-time at home in GSC games and has won 10 of its last 12 at home in league play, with the only losses coming in last season's finale to Central Arkansas and earlier this season to Delta State. Last season, Tech was 4-1 at home in league play and is 21-8 at home in GSC play since 2000.

BARTHEL IS AN ACE IN TWO SPORTS: Sophomore **Cole Barthel** (Decatur, Ala.), who is in his first season at Tech after transferring last winter from the University of Arkansas, was a second round draft pick (71st pick overall) in the 2001 Major League Draft by the Atlanta Braves out of high school. Barthel decided to forgo college originally (he signed a National Letter of Intent with the Razorbacks as a quarterback) and played four seasons in the Atlanta Braves organization as a third baseman, including playing two seasons in Rome, Ga., an A-level minor league affiliate of the Braves. In his four-year minor league career, Barthel hit .251 with five home runs and 36 RBIs. Last season as a freshman with the Razorbacks, Barthel went through spring drills and played in two games before leaving Fayetteville at the end of the first semester and enrolling at Tech. As a high school player, Barthel was selected as the North Alabama Player of the Year and was one of three finalists for the top back of the year and a finalist for the Class 6A Player of the Year as a senior after throwing for 2,074 yards and 21 touchdowns on 269 passing attempts and also rushing for 700 yards. In addition, he was a three-time All-Area selection and was ranked 69th nationally among high school quarterbacks by Rivals100.com.

STIGER LOOKING FOR MORE IN 2007: Junior receiver and return specialist **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) is looking for more success on special teams this coming season. Stiger averaged 20.8 yards on 30 kickoff returns last season, despite missing the final two games of the season due to an injury. The 20.8 average was second in the GSC and helped

Stiger earn Second-Team All-GSC honors in 2006. In addition to his kick returning, Stiger also averaged a team-best 118.6 all-purpose yards, which was fourth in the GSC and 38th nationally in NCAA Division II. On the season, he caught 32 passes for 319 yards (10.0 yards/reception) and scored five touchdowns. In his two-year career, Stiger has gained 2,080 total yards, including catching 37 passes for 372 yards, rushing for 340 yards on 92 carries and has returned 54 kickoffs for 1,099 yards (20.4 yards/return) and has scored 15 touchdowns.

NCAA RULES CHANGES FOR 2007 SEASON: In 2006, the NCAA changed the way it started the clock as it decided to start the game clock when the ball is kicked off, as opposed to previously starting the clock when the ball was touched legally in the field of play. This season, the NCAA has decided to abandon last year's new rule and return to the old clock rule that states, that on a kickoff, the game clock starts when the ball is touched legally in the field of play or crosses the goal line after the receiving team touches it in its end zone. In addition, on a change of possession, the clock will start on the snap of the ball. Other clock rules this season include that during televised games only, charged team timeouts will be one minute rather than 1:30. Another rule change this season is that teams will kickoff from its 30-yard line. Previously, the ball was kicked off from the 35. For fouls by the kicking team on kickoffs and punts (other than kick-catch interference), the receiving team has the option to tuck on the penalty where it will subsequently have the ball. The receiving team still may choose to have the down replayed after enforcement of the penalty at the previous spot. A third rule change this season is that no

defensive player in an attempt to block, bat or catch a kick may be picked up, elevated, propelled or pushed by a teammate. This is an addition to an existing rule, with "elevated, propelled or pushed" added a new language.

HISTORY MADE IN 2004: Tech Football made history in 2004 as the Wonder Boys won its first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff game with its 24-20 victory at Buerkle Field over Catawba. In addition, Tech was the first-ever team from the state of Arkansas to host an NCAA Division II playoff game and they also was the first team from Arkansas to ever win an NCAA Division II play-off contest. The Wonder Boys, who finished with a 10-2 overall record in 2004, ended the season with its 42-24 loss at Albany State in the second round of the NCAA Playoffs. Prior to Tech's postseason win over Catawba, the Wonder Boys last postseason win came in 1971 against Northern State in the semifinals of the NAIA National Playoffs.

TECH FINISHES 2006 RANKED 26TH IN HOME ATTENDANCE: Despite playing all five of its home games last season at Russellville's Cyclone Stadium, Tech finished the year ranked 26th amongst 143 NCAA Division II teams in home attendance as the Wonder Boys averaged 5,467 for its five games at Cyclone Stadium. On the season, Tech had 27,336 fans attend their home contests. Fort Valley State led all of D-II in attendance with an average of 13,682 per game, while Tuskegee was second with an average of 11,195. UNA was the first GSC team ranked as they finished fourth with an average of 10,091 per game, while Delta State was 21st with an average of 6,030 per game and West Alabama was 22nd as they averaged 5,783 per game last season. In addition, Tech's opponent in the season opener, Northwest Missouri State finished ranked 16th as they averaged 6,572 per game for eight home contests and Tech's second opponent, Northeastern State finished the year ranked 18th as they averaged

WHAT IS A WONDERBOY, YOU ASK?? Here is the story and history of the Wonder Boys. In 1919, Arkansas Tech's football team upset the highly-favored Jonesboro Aggies (now known as Arkansas State University) 14-0 behind a pair of 70-yard punt returns for touchdowns and two point-afters by a 17-year old quarterback by the name of **John Tucker**. The Jonesboro team had staked a claim to the mythical state football championship prior to the game.

Henry Loesch, the sports editor of the *Arkansas Gazette* in Little Rock, covered the game and coined the name "Wonder Boys" in complimenting the Tech team, then known as the Aggies, in his postgame story.

Tech's men's athletic teams have been known as the Wonder Boys ever since, and Tucker was thereafter labeled as "The Original Wonder Boy." Tucker went on to complete his education at the University of Alabama, but returned to Arkansas Tech and served in several capacities, including head football coach, athletics director and chemistry professor from 1925-72.

GSC RETURNS TO TELEVISION ONCE AGAIN IN 2007: For the third consecutive year, the GSC returns to live television this season.

This season's "GSC-TV Live" schedule features eight Thursday night contests, all of which will kick off at 7 p.m. CST and Tech's game with VSU, which will be aired on Saturday, Aug. 22 and will kickoff at 3 p.m. CST.

CSS will continue as the primary carrier for the

"GSC-TV Live" games once again this season, bringing more than 5 million potential households, while Cox Sports (which is on channel 119 in Russellville) adds its 1.7 million customers to the mix for the second straight season.
