TONIGHT'S GAME: Arkansas

Tech (2-0 on the season) returns to action Saturday to open up the Gulf South Conference portion of its schedule when it welcomes **West Georgia** (0-2 on the the season) on Family Day to **Cyclone Stadium** (6,000/natural grass).

Tech, who is ranked 24th in the latest AFCA Division II Coaches Poll, enters tonight's game sporting a 2-0 record and is looking to begin 3-0 for the third consecutive season after surviving a second-half rally to hold on to claim a 33-21 victory last Saturday at Texas College. Meanwhile, West Georgia enters Saturday's contest still seeking its first win of the season after falling 24-7 at NCAA Division I-AA Furman last Saturday.

NEW HOME VENUE IN 2006:

Tech will play all five of its home games this season at Cyclone Stadium, which is located on the Russellville High School campus. The change is only for this season as Tech's home stadium - **Buerkle Field** - is undergoing renovation as part of Tech's \$4-million 'Return to Glory' capital campaign. The campaign raised money to support the construction of a residence hall as a wrap-around to the current football stadium, revitalization of the field, enhancements to the school's women's sports facilities and the addition of a permanent bandstand in the end zone for Tech's band.

When the Buerkle Field project is completed in time for the 2007-08 school year, the new and improved Buerkle Field will feature a 226-bed residence hall, a new press box, controlled entrances to the stadium, new ticket offices, new concession stands, revamped restroom facilities, an auxiliary bookstore for the sale of Tech spirit merchandise and a new and improved scoreboard.

THE COACHES:

The Wonder Boys are coached by **Steve Mullins** (Ark.-Monticello, '80). Mullins is 61-38

in his 10th season as head coach and is 51-29 all-time in GSC games. Tech's assistant coaches for 2006 are: **Gregg Ricono** (offensive coordinator/quar-

terbacks and running backs); **Dave Wheeler** (defensive coordinator/linebackers); **Les Boyum** (offensive line); **Benyard Jones** (defensive line); **Ryan Wallace** (receivers); **Greg Williams** (defensive backs); **Brett Hobbs** (GA/linebackers); **Andrew Jackson** (SA/linebackers); **Kyle Jackson** (GA/offensive line); **Garren Rockwell** (GA/defensive line); **Kyle Shipp** (SA/secondary) and **Antonio Whitfield** (GA/receivers). The Wolves are coached by **Mike Ledford** (Tennessee Tech, '75). Ledford is 15-29 in his fifth season at West Georgia and as a collegiate head coach. West Georgia's assistant coaches for 2006 are: **Phillip Banko** (defensive coordinator/linebackers); **Tommy Laurendine** (offensive coordinator/wide receivers); **Josh Clendenin** (defensive line); **Don Gibson** (secondary); **Spencer Riley** (offensive line); **Matt Buenning** (GA/tight ends); **Gus Condon** (GA/defensive assistant); **Chuck Darbonne** (GA/running backs) and **Dave Ware** (kickers/punters).

LAST GAME vs. WEST GEORGIA: Tech was able to come back from a 9-0 deficit early in the second quarter to post a 14-9 win against the Wolves at Buerkle Field. The game was a defensive struggle as Tech held UWG to 201 total yards in offense, including 71 yards passing and 130 yards rushing and Tech's offense was held to 267 total yards, including 27 yards rushing on 25 carries and 240 yards passing. All of the points in the game were scored in the first half as neither team was able to mount a scoring drive after halftime. Trailing 9-0, Tech scored its first touchdown with 5:54 left in the second quarter on a 32-yard touchdown pass from **Jason Campbell** to senior receiver **Mark Caldwell** (Crossett, Ark.). Caldwell added a second touchdown with 1:29 left in the first half on a 5-yard pass from Campbell. For the game, Campbell was 20-for-40 through the air for 240 yards with two interceptions and two touchdowns. Caldwell caught four passes for 62 yards and **Thomas Hosey** had eight catches for 119 yards in the win. UWG was led offensively by **Abe Felix's** 59 yards rushing on 18 carries and **Stan Rowe's** 53 yards rushing on 13 carries.

THE WEST GEORGIA SERIES: Saturday's GSC game against West Georgia marks the ninth all-time meeting in the series that dates back to 1998, with Tech leading the series, 6-2. Since UWG won two of the first three games in the series, Tech has reeled off five straight wins in the series, including collecting last year's 14-9 victory at Buerkle Field. Mullins is 6-2 all-time against the Wolves. Saturday's home game with UWG is

the fifth all-time in the series in Russellville. Tech leads the series 3-1 in Russellville and leads 3-1 in Carrollton.

TECH IN HOME GSC GAMES: Since joining the GSC in 1995, Tech is 27-12 all-time at home in GSC games and has won eight of its last nine at home in league play, with the only loss coming in last season's finale to Central Arkansas. Last season, Tech was 4-1 at home in league play and is 19-7 at home in GSC play since 2000.

ABOUT THE WOLVES: West Georgia enters the Tech game struggling offensively as they are averaging 3.5 points per game and have yet to score an offensive touchdown after two games. UWG's only score was a 34-yard fumble return for a touchdown by junior strong safety **Jermaine Gadson** in its 24-7 loss last Saturday at Furman. The Wolves, who were picked to finish sixth in the preseason GSC Coaches Poll, are averaging 136 yards (215 total yards passing / 57 total yards rushing) of total offense per game on the season. Meanwhile, the strength of UWG's team is its defense, which is allowing 230.5 yards per game on the season and has allowed 17 points per game. The Wolves are returning six starters on a defense that led the league in total defense (284 yards per game) last season. Leading the way for UWG on offense is sophomore quarterback **Brett Yenser**. Yenser is 26-for-55 through the air for 215 yards and has thrown one interception and is averaging 107.5 yards per game. Sophomore **Adam Patrick** is the Wolves leading rusher on the season as he has gained 91 yards on 27 carries (3.4 yards per carry) and is averaging 45.5 yards per game, while senior **Raffinee Gonzalez** has caught five passes for 49 yards (9.8 yards per catch) and 24.5 yards per game. On defense, UWG has recovered six fumbles and has returned them for 68 yards, including a 34-yard touchdown against Furman. In addition, they have recorded 11 tackles for 34 yards in losses and have had four quarterback sacks. Leading the defense is senior linebacker **John Perkins**, who has 22 tackles, including 13 solo stops and has forced and recovered a fumble. Senior defensive back **Adam Carter** has had 16 tackles, while senior defensive end **Odell Willis** has had 11 tackles, three tackles for loss and two sacks for 13 yards.

ON THIS DATE: Arkansas Tech has played just seven previous football games on Sept. 16 and Saturday's contest with West Georgia is the first game on Sept. 16 since posting a 42-24 win over Harding at Buerkle Field in 2000. Tech is 4-3 all-time on Sept. 16 and Mullins is 1-0 in games played on Sept. 16.

WONDER BOYS IN SEPTEMBER: Saturday's game marks the Wonder Boys' 197th game all-time in the month of September. Tech is 103-87-6 all-time in games during the month, including winning nine straight in the month since falling 32-14 at home against Harding on Sept. 28, 2002. Mullins is 26-10 all-time in the month of September as a head coach.

TECH IN THE NATIONAL POLLS: Tech moved into this week's AFCA Division II Coaches' Poll after last Saturday's victory at Texas College improved the Wonder Boys to 2-0 on the season. In addition to being ranked in the AFCA Poll, Tech moved up two spots this week to 34th in the *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* Top 40 Poll and is still unranked in this week's D2Football.com poll. All three of the Division II polls are released each and every Tuesday during the season. For the second consecutive season, Mullins is one of the 28 coaches that will vote in the AFCA Coaches Poll.

GSC PRESEASON POLL TABS TECH TIED FOR FOURTH: Tech was tabbed to finish in a tie for fourth place with Southern Arkansas in the preseason Gulf South

Conference Coaches Poll, which was released on Aug. 1. Tech and Southern Arkansas each received 65 points in the poll that was voted on by the league's head coaches and the coaches couldn't vote for their own teams. In the poll, Tech received one vote for third, five votes for fourth and two votes each for fifth and sixth place. North Alabama was tabbed as the preseason league favorite as the garnered 95 points and six of the possible 11 first-place votes. Valdosta State was picked second as they received 92 points and four first-place votes, while Delta State was tabbed third as it received 82 points and the lone remaining first place vote. Behind Tech and SAU was West Georgia, who was tabbed sixth as they received 64 points. Harding was next in seventh place after receiving 45 points, while Henderson State (34 points), Ouachita Baptist (26 points), West Alabama (20 points) and Arkansas-Monticello (17 points) round out the poll.

With the victory, Tech improved to 2-0 on the season and has opened 2-0 for the third consecutive season. In addition, the Wonder Boys have now won 19 of its last 24 games since the beginning of the 2004 season.

"It was another ugly win tonight for our football team," Tech Head Football Coach **Steve Mullins** said. "Much like our first game against NSU, we were able to overcome turnovers again, but unlike the first game, we committed too many penalties."

It appeared as if Tech wouldn't need to stage another fourth quarter comeback in the first half as they opened the game's scoring on a 5-yard touchdown run by junior tailback **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.). The Steers would answer as Saul de LaCruz connected on a 42-yard field goal to complete a 10-play, 55-yard drive to drop Tech's lead to 7-3.

The Wonder Boys offense would come alive in the second quarter as they scored three touchdowns in a span of seven minutes and also added a safety when Texas College had an errant snap on a punt just a minute into the second quarter. In the quarter, redshirt freshman **Travis Cockerham** (Bryant, Ark.) hit a 41-yard field goal with 7:27 left, before Vanhook added another touchdown on a one-yard plunge with 4:47 remaining. Tech completed the quarter by scoring on a 38-yard touchdown pass from sophomore quarterback **Cole Barthel** (Decatur, Ala.) to junior receiver **Robert Woods** (Dardanelle, Ark.) to give the Wonder Boys a 26-3 lead at the half. Barthel finished the night 13-for-21 through the air for 160 yards and had five carries on the ground for 12 yards.

Texas College, who fell to 0-3 on the season, finally got untracked in the third quarter thanks to two costly turnovers by the Wonder Boys. The first turnover, an interception by Barthel that was returned 66 yards by the Steers Xavier Lane, set up Texas College's first score, a one-yard run by quarterback Allen Webb and then the Steers scored with seven seconds left in the quarter on a 9-yard run by Webb, which was set up thanks to a muffed punt junior receiver **Chris Gunter** (Beebe, Ark.).

"Our turnovers put our defense up against the wall in the third quarter. They scored seven points off an interception and another seven points on a punt return miscue," Mullins said. "But, I thought our defense played well throughout the game, despite allowing 21 points."

The Steers made the game even closer in the opening 40 seconds of the fourth quarter as they scored a touchdown after blocking a punt from sophomore **Nick McCaskill** (Camden, Ark.). Following the blocked punt, Tech's defense stiffened up as the

THE MULLINS FILE

STEVE MULLINS - HEAD COACH / ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

University of Arkansas-Monticello, 1980 (B.S. Science)

Steve Mullins is in his 10th season at the helm of the Wonder Boys in 2006. He enters the tonight's game with Texas College sporting an overall record of 61-38 (.616) and a Gulf South Conference record of 51-29 (.638).

Since joining the sidelines as Tech's head coach in 1997, Mullins has brought the Wonder Boys into the upper echelon of the toughest NCAA Division II football conference in the country. He has led Tech to one Gulf South Championship (1999) and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory (2004).

Mullins enters the 2006 season as the third winningest active coach in terms of wins in the GSC and is the third winningest coach in Arkansas Tech's 93-year history of football.

Last season, Mullins led Tech to a 7-3 overall record and a 6-3 mark in the GSC. The seven wins was Mullins' fifth season of winning at least seven games with the Wonder Boys.

In 2004, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to the school's fourth-ever 10-win season and first since 1971 and led the squad to the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the second time in five seasons. In addition, Tech won its first ever playoff game at the Division II level and set the school record for total offense (4,949 yards).

For the season, Tech finished the season with a 10-2 record and an 8-1 mark in the Gulf South Conference, which led Mullins to be named the GSC and AFCA Division II Region Coach of the Year.

In his first two seasons at Tech, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to records of 4-7 in 1997 and 5-5 in 1998 before breaking through in 1999 with a 9-3 record and the school's first GSC Football Championship, which earned Mullins the league's Coach of the Year honor. The 1999 team featured three All-Americans and seven All-GSC selections.

Following the 1999 season, Mullins led Tech to records of 7-3 in 2000, including a 24-10 win over eventual national champion Delta State and 8-2 in 2001.

Since coming to Tech, Mullins' impact can't just be measured in mere wins and losses. In the past nine years, 35 Wonder Boys have been selected to the GSC All-Academic Team and 110 football players have qualified for the GSC Academic Honor Roll. In addition, 13 Wonder Boys have been named CoSIDA Academic All-District VI

American honors.

Along with that, five different Tech football players have been named to the GSC 'Top 10' Student-Athlete list and two Wonder Boys have received the GSC's Commissioner's Cup as the top male student-athlete in the league.

After six successful years at the helm of the football program, Mullins added the title of athletic director to his duties on April 16, 2003. In that capacity, he oversees the day-to-day operations of the athletic department and the school's 10 sport program.

Mullins began his Tech career in 1997 after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I-AA Northwestern State in Natchitoches, La.

Prior to Northwestern State, Mullins, the Camden, Ark., native, served for two seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State, two seasons as an assistant at Southwestern Oklahoma State and four years as an assistant coach at Lamar University.

The former University of Arkansas-Monticello defensive tackle began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Central Arkansas in 1981. As a player at UAM, Mullins was a three-time All-Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference selection, a three-time All-NAIA District 17 selection, a two-time NAIA All-American, an Associated Press Small College All-American as a senior in 1979 and is a member of the UAM Athletic Hall of Fame.

Mullins, who graduated from Camden [Ark.] High School in 1976, is married to the former Elizabeth (Liz) Morgan of Groves, Texas. The couple have three children, Katie (18), a freshman at Tech, Hunter (15) and Mason (11).

Steers failed to cross midfield the rest of the quarter until the final minute of the game.

While its defense responded, Tech's offense put the game away thanks to a 7-yard run by sophomore quarterback **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.) to complete a five-play, 35-yard drive with 1:45 remaining in the game. Ray finished the night with a game-high 63 yards rushing on eight carries, but was just 1-for-6

through the air for 17 yards.

On the night, Tech's offense amassed 334 yards of total offense, including 177 yards passing on a 14-for-27 effort. Meanwhile, the Wonder Boys defense held Texas College to 193 total yards, including limiting the Steers to 90 yards in the first half. In addition, Tech had four sacks and 12 tackles for loss in the win.

Vanhook, who gained 123 yards on 11 carries in the season opener last Thursday against NSU, finished the night with 43 yards on 11 carries and has now rushed for 1,841 yards in his three-year Tech career and has scored 17 rushing touchdowns.

Senior receiver **Mark Caldwell**, who sat out the NSU game nursing a hamstring injury, had five catches for 63 yards, while redshirt sophomore W-Back **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) had five catches for 59 yards in the win.

Webb led the Steers offensively as he was 13-for-21 through the air for 133 yards and gained 12 yards on the ground on eight carries. In addition, Eugene Swearzie carried the ball 16 times for 62 yards, while senior tight end Justin Carter, an All-American last season at Angelo State, caught three passes for 37 yards.

"We will need to eliminate the turnovers and penalties next weekend if we want to have a chance to earn the victory against West Georgia," Mullins aded.

WONDER BOYS UNVEILING NEW SCHEMES IN 2006:

During the spring, Tech unveiled a new offensive and defensive scheme for the 2006 season. Tech switched from a multiple offensive set to a

wide-open, five-receiver spread offense attack that will take advantage of the athleticism of Tech's two quarterbacks **Justin Ray** and **Cole Barthel**.

Tech's new offense veils in comparsion to what fans witnessed last season as Tech has moved to a one-back set, replacing the fullback with just a halfback and revamping its receivers with two inside receivers labeled H and W and two outside receivers labeled W and X. In addition, Tech has moved senior **Josh Rogers** (Russellville, Ark.) and junior **Justin McCutcheon** (Harrison, Ark.) from tight end to an H-Back position and **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) from running back to a W-Back position.

While its offense underwent a transformation, Tech's defense also switched its scheme as Mullins and his defensive coaches switched from its usual 4-2-5 to a more traditional 3-4 scheme, with three down lineman and four linebackers. The switch was necessary for Tech's defenders to be able to counter the spread attacks that are popping up around the GSC. The new defense features three down linemen and four linebackers. One change this season is that the strong safety position has been renamed a Bandit.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN:

Tech had one player named a 2006 Preseason All-American by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* - sophomore return specialist **Tracey Stiger**.

As a redshirt freshman in 2005, Stiger finished eighth in NCAA Division II in punt returns with an average of 15.4 yards per return and averaged 19.8 yards per kickoff return. In addition, he was second on the team in rushing with 341 yards (4.2 yards per carry) and caught five passes for 53 yards (10.6 yards per catch) and scored a total of seven touchdowns, including six rushing touchdowns. He averaged 113.1 all-purpose yards per game and was second on the team

Stiger was one of the 18 GSC players named to the Preseason *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-American team.

MULLINS SIXTH ON GSC CAREER COACHING WINS LIST:

Mullins, who is in his 10th season at Tech this season, stands sixth all-time on the GSC career coaching victories list with 61. Former Mississippi College coach **John M. Williams** (1972-90) headlines the list with 124 wins, while former North Alabama head coach (1988-7) and current West Alabama coach **Bobby Wallace** is second on the list with 84 wins and former UNA coach **Wayne Grubb** (1977-87) is third with 82 all-time victories. Current Valdosta State head coach **Chris Hatcher** is fourth with 70 wins, Jacksonville State's **Bill Burgess** (1985-92) is fifth on the list with 69 wins and Mullins is sixth. Current Delta State coach **Rick Rhoades** is seventh on the list with 56 wins, while former Jacksonville State coach **Jim Fuller** (1977-83) is eighth with 54 wins, current Ouachita Baptist coach **Todd Knight** is ninth with 51 wins and UCA's **Clint Conque** rounds out the list at No. 10 44 wins.

TECH IS 10TH ON D-II ALL-TIME WINNINGEST TEAMS LIST:

Since beginning football 92 years ago, Tech stands alone in 10th place on the list of all-time winningest NCAA Division II football programs. Tech has recorded 496 wins all-time entering Saturday's West Georgia game and the Wonder Boys are one of 12 schools to win at least 485 all-time games. Tech enters Saturday's game with a 496-314-41 all-time record, winning nearly 61 percent of their 851 games.

Pittsburg [KS] State headlines the list of all-time winningest programs with 605 wins, while Tuskegee [AL] is second all-time with 577 wins. North Dakota is third with 570 wins, while Central Oklahoma is fourth with 569 and Hillsdale [MI] is fifth in wins all-time with 550. Texas A&M-Kingsville is

sixth all-time with 546 wins, Carson-Newman is seventh with 515 wins, Northern State is eighth with 509 all-time. Truman [MO] State is ninth with 508 all-time victories, while West Chester is behind Tech at 11th with 495 wins and Virginia Union is 12th with 486 all-time wins.

SCORING STREAKS: Tech enters Saturday's third game of the season having scored in 25 straight games since being shutout 30-0 by Valdosta State in the next to last game of the 2003 season. In fact, since Mullins took over the program in 1997, Tech has failed to score in a game only twice and has scored in 113 of its last 115 games.

Meanwhile, Tech's opponents have scored in 37 consecutive games, including eight of its last 13 opponents scoring 30-plus points, since the Wonder Boys held West Alabama scoreless on Nov. 2, 2002. In the last eight years, Tech has held only one opponent scoreless and has held seven opponents under 10 points.

TECH SECOND WINNINGEST GSC TEAM SINCE 1999:

Since 1999, Tech is the third winningest team in the GSC with 52 overall wins in 78 games and is tied for second in GSC wins with 43 over that same span. Valdosta State is the winningest team in the league since 2000 with 74 overall wins in 91 games and has recorded 53 GSC victories, while Delta State is second with 53 overall wins in 79



games and is tied for second with Tech with 43 GSC wins.

In addition to being the third winningest team overall in the GSC since 1999, Tech is also the winningest football program at any level in the state of Arkansas over that same span with 52 wins, while Central Arkansas, Tech's former GSC rival and NCAA Division I-A Arkansas are tied for second place with 49 wins. SAU is fourth with 46 wins, while Harding is fifth with 40 wins. Arkansas-Pine Bluff is sixth with 32 wins, while UAM is seventh with 30 wins and NCAA Division I-A Arkansas State is eighth with 28 victories. Ouachita Baptist is ninth with 23 wins and Henderson State rounds out the list at 10th with 19 wins since 1999.

STIGER NAMED GSC'S SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

On Monday, Sept. 4, **Tracey Stiger** was named GSC's Special Teams Player of the Week after he returned five kickoffs for 115 total yards (23.0 average per return) in Tech's 33-32 victory last Thursday over Northeastern State. His longest return, a 36-yarder in

the first quarter, helped set up the Wonder Boys first touchdown of the season. In addition to the kickoff returns, Stiger scored two touchdowns, both on pass receptions against the Redmen and finished the night with 31 yards in receiving to give him a total of 139 all-purpose yards.

GSC HONORS ANOTHER WONDER BOY:

On Monday, Sept. 11, **Travis Cockerham** was named the GSC's Special Teams Player of the Week after being a perfect 4-for-4 on point after attempts and connected on a career-long 41 yard field goal to give Tech a 12-3 lead in the second quarter of last Saturday's 33-21 win over Texas College. The field goal was the first of Cockerham's collegiate career. Cockerham's honor follows Stiger's honor on Sept. 4.

35 POINTS IS THE MAGIC NUMBER:

Since taking the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, Coach Mullins' Tech teams are 24-2 all-time in games in which they score 35 or more points in a single game. In fact, Tech is 27-10 when it scores between 21-34 points during the Mullins era, including being 2-0 this season. Tech has won 22 straight games when scoring at least 35 or more points and hasn't lost since falling 53-36 to Central Arkansas in 1997 when scoring 35 or more points.

HISTORY MADE IN 2004:

Tech Football made history in 2004 as the Wonder Boys won its first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff game with its 24-20 victory at Buerkle Field over Catawba. In addition, Tech was the first-ever team from the state of Arkansas to host an NCAA Division II playoff game and they also

ferring last winter from the University of Arkansas, was a second round draft pick (71st pick overall) in the 2001 Major League Draft by the Atlanta Braves out of high school. Barthel decided to forgo college originally (he signed a National Letter of Intent with the Razorbacks as a quarterback) and played four seasons in the Atlanta Braves organization as a third baseman, including playing two seasons in Rome, Ga., an A-level minor league affiliate of the Braves. In his four-year minor league career, Barthel hit .251 with five home runs and 36 RBIs. Last season as a freshman with the Razorbacks, Barthel went through spring drills and played in two games before leaving Fayetteville at the end of the first semester and enrolling at Tech. As a high school player, Barthel was selected as the North Alabama Player of the Year and was one of three finalists for the top back of the year and a finalist for the Class 6A Player of the Year as a senior after throwing for 2,074 yards and 21 touchdowns on 269 passing attempts and also rushing for 700 yards. In addition, he was a three-time All-Area selection and was ranked 69th nationally among high school quarterbacks by Rivals100.com.

DID YOU KNOW FACT. . .

Cole Barthel and Tech assistant baseball coach **Wes McCrotty** share a common similarity. That similarity is that both of them were drafted in the 2001 Major League Baseball Draft, as Barthel was a second-round selection (71st pick overall) by the Atlanta Braves out of Decatur (Ala.) High School, while McCrotty, a graduate of Russellville High School, was drafted in the 23rd round (692nd overall) by the Florida Marlins after a stellar pitching career for the Arkansas Razorbacks.

TECH COACHES NAME MVP'S FROM TEXAS COLLEGE GAME: The Tech coaching staff named its MVP's from the Texas College game this past Sunday.

The Offensive MVP honor went to senior receiver **Mark Caldwell**. The special teams honor went to redshirt freshman kicker **Travis Cockerham** (Bryant, Ark.). Against Texas College, Cockerham was a perfect 4-for-4 on his extra points and connected a 41-yard field goal in the second quarter, which the Wonder Boys a 12-3 lead. Mullins said that Cockerham did an excellent job on his kickoffs throughout the game.

ROGERS IS TOUCHDOWN MACHINE: Senior H-back **Josh Rogers** (Russellville, Ark.) enters his final season as a Wonder Boy looking to continue climbing the school's career touchdown chart. Rogers, who was an All-America tight end as a sophomore and a Second-Team All-GSC selection last season, has hauled in 12 touchdown passes in his career, which is sixth on the school's career chart. The school's career touchdown mark of 21 is held by **Greg Washington** (1999-01).

TWO-HEADED MONSTER AT QUARTERBACK:

Tech enters this season looking to replace departed quarterback **Jason Campbell**, who started the past two seasons and left Tech as the school's No. 2 leader all-time in total offense and passing yards. Looking to replace Campbell under center this season are **Cole Barthel** and **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.). Both Ray and Barthel are listed as co-No. 1s on the depth chart and have been engaged in a battle to determine the starter since fall practice began since both of them missed nearly all of spring practice due to injuries. Ray played in seven games last season and passed for 137 yards and rushed for 131 yards on 18 carries. So far on the season, Barthel is 25-for-39 through the air for 280 yards with four touchdowns and an interception and has carried the ball eight time for 45 yards and Ray is 3-for-11 passing for 41 yards with one interception and a touchdown. In addition, Ray has carried the ball 16 times for 142 yards and has a rushing touchdown.

VANHOOK PROGRESSING UP TECH'S CAREER RUSHING CHARTS:

Through two games this season, **R.J. Vanhook** has rushed 22 times for 168 yards and is averaging 7.5 yards per carry and 83 yards per game. In addition, he has scored two touchdowns. The 168 yards increases Vanhook's career rushing yard total to 1,841 (5.0 avg. per carry) and the two touchdowns gives him 17 career rushing touchdowns and 19 total touchdowns as he has had two pass receptions for scores. The 1,841 yards puts Vanhook 11th on Tech's career rushing chart and the 19 career touchdowns puts him in a tie with former Wonder Boy **Phil Fisher** (1970-71) for 15th in career scoring with 114 points. Vanhook is 159 yards shy of becoming the 11th player in Tech history to rush for 2,000 career yards.

TO SEE ACTION THIS SEASON: The Wonder Boys are expected to suit up six freshmen this season and four of those six freshmen are listed on the two-deep chart, including **Matt Kitchens** (Russellville, Ark.), who is the projected starting deep snapper. The other freshmen on the two-deep chart are **Leonard King** (Little Rock, Ark.) at Bandit; **Torrence Wright** (Sulphur Springs, Texas) at left guard and **Major Baker** (Amite, La.) at X receiver. The two other freshmen expected to suit up this season are quarterback **Ben Johnson** (Wilmot, Ark.) and wide receiver **Chris Vaughn** (Benton, Ark.).

HOSKINSON SWITCHES TO TACKLE FROM GUARD: Senior **Blake Hoskinson** (Osceola, Ark.) enters his final season at Tech playing a new position as he has moved to left tackle from right guard this season. Hoskinson, who is one of Tech's four returning starters on offense this season, was a starter last season at right guard, but made the position switch during fall practice. He enters Saturday's West Georgia game having made 12 consecutive starts.

TECH FINISHES RANKED 22ND IN HOME ATTENDANCE: The Wonder Boys finished last season

ranked 22nd amongst 149 NCAA Division II teams in home attendance as Tech averaged 6,226 fans for its five home games. Tech was one of four GSC teams ranked in the Top 25 in home attendance. West Texas A&M led all of D-II in attendance with an average of 13,089 per game, while Tuskegee was second with an average of 11,307. UNA was the first GSC team ranked at No. 9 as they averaged 8,066 fans per game, while UCA was 15th with an average of 7,326 per game. Tech was next at No. 22 and Delta State rounded out the Top 25 at No. 25 with an average of 5,925 fans a game.

WHAT IS A WONDERBOY, YOU ASK?? Here is the story and history of the Wonder Boys. In 1919, Arkansas Tech's football team upset the highly-favored Jonesboro Aggies (now known as Arkansas State University) 14-0 behind a pair of 70-yard punt returns for touchdowns and two point-afters by a 17-year old quarterback by the name of **John Tucker**. The Jonesboro team had staked a claim to the mythical state football championship prior to the game.

Henry Loesch, the sports editor of the *Arkansas Gazette* in Little Rock, covered the game and coined the name "Wonder Boys" in complimenting the Tech team, then known as the Aggies, in his postgame story.

Tech men's athletic teams have known as the Wonder Boys ever since, and Tucker was thereafter labeled as "The Original Wonder Boy." Tucker went on to complete his education at the University of Alabama, but returned to Arkansas Tech and served in several capacities, including head football coach, athletics director and chemistry professor from 1925-72.

GSC RETURNS TO TELEVISION ONCE AGAIN IN 2006: For the second consecutive year, the GSC returns to live television once again this season.

This season's "GSC-TV Live" schedule features nine,

Thursday night contests, all of which will kick off at 7 p.m. CST. Last season, seven of the nine games that were broadcast were on Thursday, while two of them were broadcast on Saturday.

CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast) continues as the primary carrier for the "GSC-TV Live" games, bringing more than 5 million potential households, while Cox Sports (which is on channel 119 in Russellville) adds its 1.7 million customers to the mix for the second straight season. In addition, the GSC will also make the broadcasts available to other cable systems and open-air channels in non-conflicting areas, but the games will not be available on DirectTV or DishNetwork.

Returning to the booth once again this season will be the broadcasting tandem of Bob Valvano and Don Russell on the play-by-play, Jesse Branch doing the color commentary and Jim Cavele roaming the sidelines.

"We got off to a great start last year and the talent on the set had a lot to do with it," GSC Commissioner Nate Salant said. "Bob Valvano is a nationally recognized ESPN broadcaster with a late-night show in nearly 200 markets-all of which heard about the games every week. Russell has worked everything from Division I-A to the Olympics. Branch coached at Arkansas, Southwest Missouri and Henderson State and is a legend, and Cavele did so well for us that we wound up working some national D-II games for ESPN."

Unlike last season, when Tech had two games selected for broadcast, the Wonder Boys will make its one and only appearance on live television in Magnolia, Ark., against Southern Arkansas. All of the teams in the league are scheduled to be shown at least once as part of the nine-week package, but Valdosta State was scheduled for three television games, while Delta State, Henderson State, Southern Arkansas and West Alabama will have two

of their league games broadcast this season.

Salant said that forming this year's television schedule was a lot harder than last season's debut, but we were able to achieve the goals of getting every team on at least once, focusing on games between teams from different states and understanding where the Nielsen ratings were best impacted.

"Believe it or not, getting the right mix of games and keeping promises to air specific ones was very difficult," Salant said. "Nine and eleven are only divisible into 99, and that's about how many different stabs we took at getting the right mix. In the end, it all worked out, and I think we've come up with an entertaining schedule that features intriguing games."

The "GSC-TV Live" package begins on Sept. 14 as Harding plays at North Alabama. The next broadcast is scheduled for Sept. 21 when Henderson State travels to play at West Alabama. On Sept. 28, Valdosta State will play at OBU.

In October, Henderson State's game at Arkansas-Monticello on Oct. 5 opens up the coverage, followed by Valdosta State's game at Delta State on Oct. 12. The HSU-UAM game will be shown as part of a doubleheader on CSS with an NCAA Division I contest. The game will be shown live on Cox Sports and the other affiliates and will be shown on a 60-minute tape delay on CSS. Following the VSU-DSU game, Southern Arkansas will make its first of two straight appearances when it plays at Harding on Oct. 19, before facing the Wonder Boys on Oct. 26 in Magnolia.

The final two live television broadcasts are slated for Nov. 2 when West Alabama plays at Delta State and the schedule will conclude on Nov. 9 with Valdosta State's game at West Georgia.

The NCAA Division II and CSTV entered into a three-year regular-season television and broadband partnership in July that will showcase select Division II football and men's and women's basketball games live, beginning with coverage in the 2006 fall and 2007 winter seasons.
