TONIGHT'S GAME: Arkansas

Tech (2-0 on the season) returns to action on Saturday, Sept. 15 to open up the Gulf South Conference portion of its schedule when it travels to Carrollton, Ga., to face **West Georgia** (1-1 / 0-0 GSC) at **Grisham Stadium** (6,500/natural grass). Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. CDT. Saturday's game marks the first of eight consecutive weeks of GSC games for the Wonder Boys.

Tech enters Saturday's GSC opener riding a six-game winning streak after earning a 21-6 win last Saturday in its 2007 home opener over Texas College. The six-game winning streak, which began with Tech winning its final four games of the 2006 season, is the longest such streak since winning nine straight games during the 2004 season. Meanwhile, West Georgia enters its home opener on Saturday sporting a 1-1 record after falling at 45-21 last Saturday at NCAA Division I-AA member, Georgia Southern.

TECH RETURNS TO BUERKLE FIELD IN 2007:

After playing all five home games during the 2006 season at Russellville High School's Cyclone Stadium thanks to renovations on Tech's home stadium - Buerkle Field - as part of the school's \$4-million 'Return to Glory' capital campaign, the Wonder Boys will return to the renovated Buerkle Field when it plays its first home game of the 2007 season on Sept. 8 against Texas College.

The 'Return to Glory' campaign raised money to support the construction of a residence hall as a wrap-around to the current football stadium, revitalization of the field, enhancements to the school's women's sports facilities and the addition of a permanent bandstand in the end zone for Tech's band. The new and improved Buerkle Field features a 226-bed residence hall, a new press box, controlled entrances to the stadium, new ticket booths, new concession stands,

revamped restroom facilities, an auxiliary bookstore for the sale of Tech spirit merchandise, a new and improved scoreboard and four new and improved field lights.

THE COACHES: The Wonder Boys are coached by **Steve Mullins** (Ark.-Monticello, '80). Mullins is 68-41 in his 11th season as head coach and is 56-32 all-time in GSC games. Tech's assistant coaches for 2007 are: **Benyard Jones** (defensive coordinator/linebackers), **Scott Preston** (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks & running backs), **Les Boyum** (offensive line), **Erik Kruppe** (defensive line), **Ryan Wallace** (receivers), **Greg Williams** (defensive backs), **Brett Hobbs** (GA/linebackers), **Andrew Jackson** (SA/secondary), **Garren Rockwell** (GA/defensive line), **Kyle Shipp** (GA/offensive line) and **Antonio Whitfield** (GA/receivers). The Wolves are coached by **Mike Ledford** (Tennessee Tech, '75). Ledford is 17-37 in his sixth season at West Georgia and as a collegiate head coach. West Georgia's assistant coaches for 2007 are: **Spencer Riley** (offensive coordinator/offensive line); **Dave Wheeler** (defensive coordinator); **Josh Clendenin** (defensive line/special teams); **Garrett Hagin** (receivers); **Josh Collins** (GA/tight ends); **Wayne Dabbs** (GA/running backs) and **Aaron Dobbins** (GA/secondary).

TECH ENTERS SATURDAY'S GSC OPENER HAVING WON SIX STRAIGHT GAMES: Tech enters Saturday's GSC opener in the midst of a six-game winning streak as they ended last season winning its final four games, holding its four opponents to a combined 73 points (18.3 points/game) and scoring 124 points (31 points/game). The six-game winning streak is the longest for Tech since winning nine straight games during the 2004 season and the longest such streak for a GSC team entering the third week of the season.

opener against West Georgia marks the 10th all-time meeting in the series that dates back to 1998, with Tech leading the series, 7-2. Since UWG won two of the first three games in the series, Tech has reeled off six straight wins in the series, including collecting last year's 28-21 overtime victory in Russellville. Mullins is 7-2 all-time against the Wolves. Tech leads the all-time series 4-1 in Russellville and leads 3-1 in Carrollton.

TECH IN ROAD GSC GAMES: The Wonder Boys are 28-25-1 all-time in GSC road games, including being 24-20 in GSC road contests during Mullins' tenure. Tech has won 11 of its last 17 league road contests, including being 2-2 on the road the past two seasons. In addition, Tech is 7-5 all-time in league openers since joining the league in 1995, while Mullins is 7-3 in GSC openers and has won four straight league openers.

LAST GAME vs. WEST GEORGIA: In its last game against West Georgia on Sept. 16, 2006, Tech used an 11-point fourth quarter to force overtime and then sealed the win with linebacker **Jamal Johnson's** (New Orleans, La.) sack of Wolves quarterback Brett Yenser and senior defensive tackle Milan McDaniel's (Morrliton, Ark.) subsequent fumble recovery in overtime to collect a 28-21 win at Cyclone Stadium in Russellville. After scoring 10 points in the first quarter, Tech watched the Wolves score 14 unanswered points in the middle quarters, before the Wonder Boys began its comeback. Trailing 21-10, sophomore kicker **Travis Cockerham** (Bryant, Ark.) nailed a 24-yard field to drop UWG's lead to 21-13 with 10:09 left in the game and then Tech tied the game with 3:21 left on a 30-yard pass from Barthel to Woods. In overtime, Tech scored first thanks to a 21-yard pass by Barthel to Woods. For the game, Tech's offense collected 376 yards, including passing for 246 yards, but had three interceptions and also lost two of four fumbles in the game. Leading the way offensively

for the Wonder Boys was junior receiver **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.), as he rushed 17 times for 86 yards and Barthel, who was 16-for-29 passing for 175 yards and had three touchdowns to go with the three interceptions. Mark Caldwell caught eight passes for 73 yards, while Woods caught three passes for 55 yards and had two touchdowns. Meanwhile, UWG gained 373 yards, including rushing 47 times for 231c yards. Sophomore tailback **James Kennebrew** led the Wolves attack with 169 yards rushing on 28 carries and scored twice, while **Adam Patrick** gained 68 yards on 12 carries and scored on a 21-yard run and junior quarterback **Brett Yenser** was 10-for-19 passing for 142 yards in the Wolves loss.

ABOUT THE WEST GEORGIA WOLVES: West Georgia enters its first home game of the 2007 season sporting a 1-1 record after falling 45-21 last Saturday at NCAA Division I-AA powerhouse, Georgia Southern. The Wolves opened the season with a 23-11 win on Sept. 1 at Clark-Atlanta. The Wolves, who are averaging 22.0 points per game and 320 yards per game on offense on the season, are led offensively by senior quarterback **Keats Baldwin**, who started in 2005 before sitting out last season with an injury. On the season, Baldwin is completed 56 percent (35-for-630 of his passes for 444 yards and has tossed three touchdowns. Baldwin's top two targets through the air have been junior **Jimmy Howard** and senior

Patrick Higgins. Howard has caught nine passes for 168 yards (18.7 yds/reception) and has scored two touchdowns, while Higgins has caught nine passes for 146 yards (16.2 yds/reception) on the season. Another key member of the UWG offense is **James Kennebrew**, who was named a Preseason All-GSC selection and a Preseason All-American by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*, has carried the ball 35 times for 110 yards this season and has one touchdown. On defense, the Wolves returned only two starters from last season's team and during the offseason added **Dave Wheeler** as its defensive coordinator. Wheeler was formally the defensive coordinator at Tech for three seasons (2004-06). Among the key players on defense are sophomore linebacker **Rakolya Morrison** (10 tackles), senior safety **Gary Hodges** (nine tackles) and sophomore **Michael Reardon** (eight tackles, 2.0 tackles for loss). One of UWG's bright spots through two games has been the play of junior punter/kicker **Jared Guberman**, who named the league's and also the National Special Team's Player of the Week on Sept. 3, is averaging 43.6 yards per punt on the season, including having a 74-yarder against Clark-Atlanta and is also a perfect 3-for-3 in field goals and is 5-for-5 on extra points.

ON THIS DATE: Tech has played just seven previous football games on Sept. 15 and Saturday's contest with West Georgia is the first

Tech is 4-3 all-time on Sept. 15, but has lost two of its last three games played on this date. Saturday's contest at West Georgia marks the first road game on Sept. 15 since facing Northeastern State in Fort Smith in 1973.

TECH RECORDS 500TH ALL-TIME WIN: In its win last season on Oct. 27, 2006, at Southern Arkansas, the Wonder Boys made history as they became just the 11th NCAA Division II program to win 500 football games all-time. Since beginning football in 1911, Tech has compiled a 501-316-41 all-time record and is the 11th all-time winningest D-II football program. In addition, Tech is just the second football program in the state of Arkansas to record at least 500 all-time wins, as the Arkansas Razorbacks have won 637 games in 113 seasons of competition.

TECH IN THE NATIONAL POLLS: Tech enters this week's contest unranked in all three of the major Division II national polls. The Wonder Boys, who received fivevotes in the AFCA D-II Coaches Preseason poll, received no votes in this week's second poll. In addition, Tech was unranked once again this week in the D2Football.com Preseason poll and finished last season ranked 20th in *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* Top 40 Poll.

TECH IS 11TH ON D-II ALL-TIME WINNINGEST TEAMS LIST: Since beginning football 93 years ago, Tech stands in 11th place on the list of all-time winningest NCAA Division II football programs. Tech has recorded 502 wins all-time entering Saturday's home opener and the Wonder Boys are one of 12 schools to win at least 495 all-time games. Tech enters Saturday's GSC opener with a 503-317-41 all-time record, winning nearly 61 percent of their 861 games.

Pittsburg [KS] State headlines the list of all-time winningest programs with 616 wins, while Tuskegee [AL] is second all-time with 588 wins. North Dakota is third with 582 wins, while Central Oklahoma is fourth with 576 and Hillsdale [MI] is fifth in wins all-time with 556. Texas A&M-Kingsville is sixth all-time with 548 wins, Carson-Newman is seventh with 523 wins and Truman

TECH RANKS 21ST IN PRE-SEASON LINDY'S MAGAZINE DIVISION II POLL: *Lindy's* Annual Preseason Football Magazine has high hopes for the Wonder Boys this season as the publication ranked Tech 21st in the its preseason Division II poll. Tech was one of five GSC squads ranked in the D-II poll. Delta State headlines the contingent of GSC teams ranked as the Statesmen are ranked seventh, while Valdosta State is ranked eighth, North Alabama checks in at No. 16 and Henderson State is ranked 23rd in the poll. Two-time defending NCAA D-II national champions Grand Valley State sits atop the D-II poll, while NW Missouri State is ranked second and Chadron State is No. 3. North Dakota and Bloomsburg [PA] round out the Top 5 at No. 4 and No. 5 respectively. The Wonder Boys face all four of the GSC ranked teams in the *Lindy's* poll on four successive weeks and they open the season tonight at No. 2 ranked Northwest Missouri State. In addition to ranking the Top 25 D-II teams, *Lindy's* also compiled a list of key D-II games this season and Tech's game on Oct. 6 at Delta State is one of those 25 key D-II games. Other key GSC games listed are

Henderson State at Delta State on Sept. 15, Delta State at Valdosta State on Oct. 11 and North Alabama at Valdosta State on Oct. 27.

RECAP OF TEXAS COLLEGE

GAME: Arkansas Tech returned home to a renovated Buerkle Field for the first time since November, 2005, and posted a 21-6 victory over Texas College this past Saturday.

Saturday's game, which was Tech's first home of the 2007 season, was delayed 37 minutes due to lightning with 10:04 remaining in the first quarter and Tech holding a 7-0 lead. It was the second time this season that Tech had a game delayed due to lightning as its Aug. 23 game at No. 2 ranked Northwest Missouri State was called with 2:30 left in the first quarter.

"Our offense play poorly tonight, they obviously were affected by the wet balls," Tech Head Football Coach **Steve Mullins** said. "But some of the credit goes to Texas College."

Due to a steady rain that fell throughout most of the first half that made the field a sloppy mess, both teams struggled hanging on to the football as they combined to record 14 fumbles, including losing five of those fumbles. On the night, Tech had eight fumbles and lost three of them and has now had 10 fumbles on the season, while Texas College had six fumbles.

"We need to take better care of the football, there are no excuses for

fumbling as many times as we did," the 11th-year Tech coach said.

The Wonder Boys got on the scoreboard first on a 1-yard run by sophomore running back **Tim Childress** (Batesville, Ark.) to complete a 12-play, 41-yard drive with 10:09 left in the first quarter. Following Childress' run, the game was delayed for lightning. Childress led the Tech offense with a game-high 137 yards on 29 carries.

Once play resumed, Tech drove 41 yards in seven plays and pushed in front 14-0 on a 1-yard run by senior running back **Marcus Godfrey** (Junction City, Ark.) with 5:24 left in the first quarter.

The Steers (1-2 on the season) got on the scoreboard just a little over five minutes into the second quarter as it scored a touchdown on a fumble recovery by Derrick Russell after Israel Sumblor fumbled the ball in the end zone following an 11-yard run. The extra point by Nolan Williams was missed.

In the third quarter, Tech pushed in front 21-6 as junior corner-back **Tito Jose** (San Diego, Calif.) returned a fumble 44 yards

STEVE MULLINS - HEAD COACH / ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

University of Arkansas-Monticello, 1980 (B.S. Science)

Steve Mullins is now his 11th season at the helm of the Wonder Boys. He enters Saturday's game with an overall record of 68-41 (.624) and a Gulf South Conference record of 56-32 (.636).

Since joining the sidelines as Tech's head coach in 1997, Mullins has brought the Wonder Boys into the upper echelon of the toughest NCAA Division II football conference in the country. He has led Tech to one Gulf South Championship (1999) and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory (2004).

Mullins enters the 2007 season as the second winningest active coach in terms of wins in the GSC and is the third winningest coach in Arkansas Tech's 93-year history of football.

Last season, Mullins led Tech to a 7-3 overall record and a 5-3 mark in the GSC. The seven wins was Mullins' sixth season of winning at least seven games with the Wonder Boys.

In 2004, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to the school's fourth-ever 10-win season and first since 1971 and led the squad to the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the second time in five seasons. In addition, Tech won its first ever playoff game at the Division II level and set the school record for total offense (4,949 yards).

For the season, Tech finished the season with a 10-2 record and an 8-1 mark in the Gulf South Conference, which led Mullins to be named the GSC and AFCA Division II Region Coach of the Year.

In his first two seasons at Tech, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to records of 4-7 in 1997 and 5-5 in 1998 before breaking through in 1999 with a 9-3 record and the school's first GSC Championship, which earned Mullins the league's Coach of the Year honor. The 1999 team featured three All-Americans and seven All-GSC selections.

Following the 1999 season, Mullins led Tech to records of 7-3 in 2000, including a 24-10 win over eventual national champion Delta State and 8-2 in 2001.

Since coming to Tech, Mullins' impact can't just be measured in mere wins and losses. In the past nine years, 38 Wonder Boys have been selected to the GSC All-Academic Team and 115 football players have qualified for the GSC Academic Honor Roll. In addition, 14 Wonder Boys have been named CoSIDA Academic All-District VI and four Tech players have received CoSIDA Academic All-American honors.

Along with that, five different Tech football players have been named to the GSC 'Top 10' Student-Athlete list and two Wonder Boys have received the GSC's Commissioner's Cup as the top male student-athlete in the league.

After six successful years at the helm of the football program, Mullins added the title of athletic director to his duties on April 16, 2003. In that capacity, he oversees the day-to-day operations of the athletic department and the school's 10 sport program.

Mullins began his Tech career in 1997 after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I-AA Northwestern State in Natchitoches, La.

Prior to Northwestern State, Mullins, the Camden, Ark., native, served for two seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State, two seasons as an assistant at Southwestern Oklahoma State and four years as an assistant coach at Lamar University.

The former University of Arkansas-Monticello defensive tackle began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Central Arkansas in 1981. As a player at UAM, Mullins was a three-time All-Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference selection, a three-time All-NAIA District 17 selection, a two-time NAIA All-American, an Associated Press Small College All-American as a senior in 1979 and is a member of the UAM Athletic Hall of Fame.

Mullins, who graduated from Camden [Ark.] High School in 1976, is married to the former Elizabeth (Liz) Morgan of Groves, Texas. The couple have three children, Katie (19), a sophomore at Tech, Hunter (16) and Mason (12).



for a touchdown with 11:55 left in the quarter.

Jose's score proved to be the final points of the game as the team's slogged it out as they combined for 209 yards and eight fumbles, including three lost fumbles.

With its offense struggling in the second half, Tech's defense began to exert itself as junior linebacker **Cedric Cursh** (Foreman, Ark.) sacked Steers quarterback X'Zavier Bloodsaw at Tech's 10-yard line just a little over 12 minutes left in the game. Following Cursh's sack, senior defensive tackle **Hollis Hoskins** (Batesville, Miss.) blocked a 32-yard field goal attempt by Nolan Williams and then freshman free safety **Terrance Boykin** (Wynne, Ark.), who was making his first career start in just his second collegiate game, collected a fumble with a little less than 10 minutes remaining in the game to stall another Steers drive.

"Our defense played well tonight," Mullins said. "In addition to the defense, I thought our kicking game had a good night considering the weather."

Junior punters **Nick McCaskill** (Camden, Ark.) and **Michael Podobnik** (Frankfort, Ill.) combined to punt six times for 248 yards and average 41.6 yards per kick. McCaskill had two punts for 70 yards (35.0 average), while Podobnik punted four times for 178 yards (44.5 average) and had 56-yard punt in the third quarter.

Tech's offense, which was out-gained, 270-230 on the night, gained 141 yards on the ground, but

junior quarterback **Cole Barthel** (Decatur, Ala.), the reigning Gulf South Conference Offensive Player of the Week, was just 10-for-16 through the air for 79 yards. Meanwhile, the Steers were led offensively by Bloodsaw, who was 18-for-27 throwing the ball for 142 yards, while Sumbler gained 68 yards on 13 carries in the loss.

NCAA ANNOUNCES DECISION IN NORTHWEST MISSOURI STATE GAME: On Tuesday, Sept. 4, the NCAA announced that the result of its Aug. 23 game at Northwest Missouri State, which was limited to less than a quarter due to severe lightning and storms, was decided on a conference call on Friday, August 31 between the NCAA and the institutions. It was agreed on this call, which was coordinated by the NCAA, that the game was terminated and, therefore, neither school will be credited with a win or a loss. Play was terminated with two minutes and 30 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

NCAA statistics policies for football require at least three quarters of competition for inclusion, which was part of the rationale in making the decision. Input from both institutions and conferences, as well as the NCAA Football Rules Committee and NCAA Division II Football Committee were considered during the conference call.

ance. Following its 31-14 loss to the Bearcats that season, Tech won nine of its next 10 regular season games, including going 8-1 in GSC play to become the first Arkansas school to win a GSC football title. During league play, Tech collected home wins over both North Alabama (24-21) and Valdosta State (21-14), but suffered its only league loss at Delta State (17-10). The Wonder Boys ended the season by falling 40-28 at Carson-Newman in the first round of the D-II Playoffs.

WONDER BOYS IN SEPTEMBER: Saturday's game marks the Wonder Boys' 201st game all-time in the month of September. Tech is 105-89-6 all-time in games during the month, including winning 11 of its last 13 games in the month, with both of the losses coming last season. Mullins is 28-12 all-time in the month of September as Tech's head coach.

PRESEASON GSC POLL TABS TECH SIXTH: Tech was tabbed to finish sixth in the pre-season Gulf South Conference Coaches Poll, which was released on July 31. Tech received 55 points in the poll that was voted on by the league's head coaches and the coaches couldn't vote for their own teams. In the poll, Tech received three votes for fourth, two votes each for fifth and sixth place and three votes for seventh. Defending GSC champion North Alabama was tabbed as the preseason favorite for the second consecutive season as the Lions garnered 95 points and six of a possible 11 first-place votes. Valdosta State was picked second as they received 89 points and three first-place votes, while Delta State was tabbed third as the Statesmen received 84 points and a first place vote. Henderson State was picked fourth as they earned 75 points and the final first place vote, while Harding was tabbed to finish one spot in front of Tech as the Bisons earned 56 points. Behind Tech in the poll was West Alabama (54 points), Southern Arkansas (33 points), West Georgia (30 points), Ouachita Baptist (19 points) and Arkansas-Monticello (15 points).

VANHOOK NAMED PRESEASON ALL-GSC SELECTION: After earning First-Team All-GSC honors last season after rushing for 507 yards and scoring six touchdowns, senior tailback **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.) enters his sen-

ior campaign as Tech's lone preseason All-GSC selection. Vanhook, who is 818 yards shy of becoming the fourth Wonder Boy to surpass the 3,000-yard career rushing plateau, was one of two running backs named to the preseason offensive team and one of 15 returning First-Team All-GSC selections from last season. In addition to naming Vanhook a member of the Preseason All-GSC Team, junior offensive tackle **Jeremy Ashcraft** (Marshall, Texas), a transfer from East Texas Baptist University, was named to the league's Top Newcomers List. Ashcraft transferred to Tech before the beginning of the 2007 spring semester.

MULLINS SIXTH ON GSC CAREER COACHING WINS LIST: Mullins, who is in entering his 11th season at Tech, stands sixth all-time on the GSC career coaching victories list with 68. Former Mississippi College coach **John M. Williams** (1972-90) headlines the list with 124 wins, while former North Alabama head coach (1988-97) and current West Alabama coach **Bobby Wallace** is second on the list with 90 wins and former North Alabama coach **Wayne Grubb** (1977-87) is third with 82 all-time victories. Former Valdosta State coach **Chris Hatcher** is fourth with 74 wins, Jacksonville State's **Bill Burgess** (1985-92) is fifth on the list with 69 wins and Mullins

is sixth. Former Delta State and Troy State coach **Rick Rhoades** (1985-87 and 2002-06) is seventh on the list with 62 wins, while Jacksonville State coach **Jim Fuller** (1977-83) is eighth with 54 wins and current Ouachita Baptist coach **Todd Knight** is ninth with 53 wins.

QUINCY SKINNER NAMED TECH'S 28TH ALL-AMERICAN IN 2006:

In his only season at Tech, cornerback **Quincy Skinner** (Coral Springs, Fla.) made quite an impression as the Florida Atlantic transfer became the school's 28th different Wonder Boy to earn All-American status and the 12th Wonder Boy to earn All-American recognition under Mullins. Skinner, who was a Second-Team All-GSC selection, finished last season ranked fifth nationally in Division II in interceptions (0.8 per game) and recorded 63 tackles, including a team-best 43 solo stops and had 2.5 tackles for loss, five pass break-ups, one fumble recovery, one forced fumble and defended 1.3 passes per game, which was 20th in the final D-II national statistics. Skinner became the third Wonder Boy to earn AFCA D-II Coaches' First-Team All-American honors and was the fifth-ever Tech player to be named an AP Little All-American as he was a third-team selection and also earned Third-Team *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-Southeast Region honors.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN: Tech had one player named a 2006 Preseason All-American by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* - senior defensive tackle **Andrew Murphy**.

As a junior in 2006, Murphy, who was named a Third-Team *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-Southeast Region selection,

ranked sixth in the final NCAA D-II national football statistics in forced fumbles (0.4 per game) and recorded 38 total tackles, including 18 solo stops, 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 quarterback sacks. In addition, he forced four fumbles, had three fumble recoveries and an interception, which was returned 42 yards for a touchdown against Valdosta State, which led to Murphy being named the GSC's Defensive Player of the Week.

Murphy, a native of Booneville, Miss., and a transfer from NE Mississippi Community College, was one of 20 GSC players named to the

Preseason *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-American team.

This season's All-American team featured 154 players and was comprised of 86 seniors, 50 juniors and 18 sophomores from all four geographic regions of NCAA Division II.

TECH THIRD WINNINGEST GSC TEAM SINCE 1999:

Since 1999, Tech is the third winningest team in the GSC with 59 overall wins in 88 games and is also third in GSC wins with 48 over that same span. Valdosta State is the winningest team in the league since 2000 with 82 overall wins in 101 games and has recorded 59 GSC victories, while Delta State is second with 65 overall wins in 93 games and is second in GSC wins with 50.

In addition to being the third winningest team overall in the GSC since 1999, Tech is also tied with NCAA Division I Arkansas as the winningest football program at any level in the state of Arkansas over that same span with 59 wins. Central Arkansas is third with 56 wins, while SAU is fourth with 48 wins and Harding is fifth with 46 wins. Arkansas-Pine Bluff is sixth with 40 wins, NCAA Division I-A Arkansas State is seventh with 33 victories and UAM is eighth with 31 wins. Henderson State is ninth with 24 wins and Ouachita Baptist is 10th with 26 wins.

CURSH MAKES RETURN TO FIELD:

Tech's defense will be bolstered this year by the return of the 2004 GSC Defensive Player of the Year, junior linebacker **Cedric Cursh** (Foreman, Ark.). Cursh, who sat out the past two seasons to deal with some off-the-field legal issues, will be a welcomed addition to a defense that returns just six starters from a year ago. As a sophomore in 2004, Cursh, who was also

named an AP Little All-American, recorded 95 total tackles, including 21 tackles for loss, nine quarterback sacks, five forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and one interception as he helped lead the Wonder Boys to a 10-2 record and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory. In the NCAA Playoff victory against Catawba, Cursh finished with 10 tackles, including five solo stops and had two tackles for losses of nine yards, one sack, one forced fumble and recovered two fumbles enroute to earning National Defensive Player of the Week honors from *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*. His forced fumble and subsequent fumble recovery at Tech's 47-yard line with 38 seconds remaining in the game sealed Tech's 24-20 win over Catawba. Cursh enters Saturday's West Georgia game with 10 career sacks, which is 14th on the school's career list and has recorded 193 career tackles, including 105 solo stops and has had 30 tackles for losses of 144 yards.

SCORING STREAKS: Tech enters Saturday's GSC opener having scored in 34 straight games since being shutout 30-0 by Valdosta State in the next to last game of the 2003 season. In fact, since Mullins took over the program in 1997, Tech has failed to score in a game only

twice and has scored in 123 of its last 125 games.

Meanwhile, Tech's opponents have scored in 47 consecutive games, including 12 of its last 22 opponents scoring 30-plus points, since the Wonder Boys held West Alabama scoreless on Nov. 2, 2002. In the last eight years, Tech has held only one opponent scoreless and has held 10 opponents under 10 points, including one opponent so far this season.

HALFTIME LEAD EQUALS WINS: Since Mullins took over the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, the Wonder Boys have been known as a second-half team as they are 52-2 when leading at halftime, including being 2-0 this season. In addition, the Wonder Boys are 57-2 when leading heading into the fourth quarter and are 4-1 in overtime during Mullins' tenure.

TECH COACHES NAME MVP'S FROM TEXAS COLLEGE GAME: The Tech coaching staff named its MVP's from the Texas College game this past Sunday. The Offensive MVP honor went to sophomore running back **Tim Childress** (Batesville, Ark.). Childress graded out at 87 percent against the Steers, according to Tech Head Football Coach **Steve Mullins**. Childress, who scored Tech's first touchdown of the game on a 1-yard run just five minutes into the contest, carried the ball 29 times for a

career-high 137 yards and caught two passes for 29 yards. In addition, he gained 89 yards after contact and recorded three knockdown blocks.

On defense, the coaches named senior defensive tackle **Andrew Murphy** as its MVP. Murphy, who was named a Preseason All-American by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*, graded out at 85 percent after recording two total tackles, two tackles for loss and caused one



fumble against the Steers.

The Special Team MVP honor went to junior punter **Nick McCaskill**. McCaskill pinned both of his second-half punts inside the 10-yard line, according to Mullins.

BARTHEL TAKES HOME GSC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS: On Monday, Sept. 3, **Cole Barthel** was named the GSC's Offensive Player of the Week after completing 25-of-33 passes (75.8 percent) for 238 yards, two touchdowns and an interception and also led Tech's ground attack with 37 yards on five carries (7.4 avg.) in the Wonder Boys season-opening 20-13 win last Thursday at Northeastern State. In the game against NSU, Barthel's first scoring pass, a 43-yarder to sophomore receiver **Rolaundo Wright** with 9:24 left in

the second quarter to give Tech a 6-3 lead and then helped Tech to a game-winning score by tossing a 48-yard strike to junior receiver **Justin Ray** with 13:09 left in the game. The Offensive Player of the Week honor was the second for Barthel in his Tech career as he was honored by the league last season for his school-record tying five touchdown passing effort against Ouachita Baptist on Oct. 13.

GSC HONORS PODOBNIK AS ITS SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK: On Monday, Sept. 10, redshirt junior **Michael Podobnik** was named the GSC's Special Teams Player of the Week after booting four punts for 178 yards and a 44.5 yard average in last Saturday's 21-6 win over Texas College. Against the Steers, Podobnik had a 56-yard punt and had one touchback in the game. He becomes the second consecutive Wonder Boy honored by the league this season after **Cole Barthel** took home the league's offensive honor the previous week. On the season, Podobnik has punted 10 times for 481 yards and is averaging 48.1 yards per punt, including recording a 75-yard punt against Northeastern State. He has had four touchbacks and has downed one punt inside the 20-yard line.

WONDER BOYS WELCOME NEW COORDINATORS THIS SEASON: For the first time since 2004, Tech enters a season with both a new offensive and defensive coordinator. During the offseason, Mullins promoted **Benyard Jones** to defensive coordinator and brought in 18-year coaching veteran **Scott Preston** as the offensive coordinator. Jones, who is in his second tour of duty at Tech after spending five seasons from 1999-2004 at Tech as an assistant and then returning last season as the defensive line coach after spending the 2005 season as the defensive coordinator at Butler University, an NCAA Division I-AA member. Meanwhile, Preston brings a wealth of experience to Tech as he spent four seasons (2000-03) as the

DID YOU KNOW FACT. . .

Cole Barthel and Tech assistant baseball coach **Wes McCrotty** share a common similarity. That similarity is that both of them were drafted in the 2001 Major League Baseball Draft, as Barthel was a second-round selection (71st pick overall) by the Atlanta Braves out of Decatur (Ala.) High School, while McCrotty, a graduate of Russellville High School, was drafted in the 23rd round (692nd overall) by the Florida Marlins after a stellar pitching career with the Arkansas Razorbacks.

offensive coordinator, quarterback, running back and receivers coach at Illinois State University. In addition to Illinois State, Preston also had stints at Murray State University, Ventura [CA] College, Georgia Military College, San Francisco State and began his collegiate coaching career working with Hal Mumme at Valdosta State University.

BARTHEL LOOKS TO DIRECT OFFENSE UNDER CENTER:

One season after sharing quarterback duties with junior **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.), junior **Cole Barthel** (Decatur, Ala.) enters 2007 as the Wonder Boys starting signal caller, as the Tech coaches moved Ray to a receiver spot to take advantage of his athleticism and is big-play ability. As a sophomore last season, Barthel, who transferred to Tech from the University of Arkansas, saw action in nine games and was 121-for-196 through the air for 1,290 yards and threw 17 touchdowns and had nine interceptions. He finished the season with a 136.46 efficiency rating, which was 37th among all Division II quarterbacks and fifth in the league and he completed nearly 62 percent of his passes and averaged 143.3 yards per game, which was seventh in the GSC. With Ray's move to receiver, Barthel will be backed up by junior **Carter Hallock** (Walnut Creek, Calif.), a transfer from Palomar Community College, redshirt freshman **Ben Johnson** (Hamburg, Ark.) and Ray, who will at times lineup under center in certain offensive formations.

TECH STRONG AT PROTECTING THE BALL IN 2006:

Tech closed out the 2006 season ranked 28th in NCAA D-II Football in turnover margin as the Wonder Boys had a +0.6 margin for its 10 games. On the season, Tech's offense committed 22 turnovers as they had 11 interceptions and lost 11 fumbles, while its defense forced 14 fumbles and picked off 14 passes on the season. Tech was tied for the second in the GSC in turnover margin with Delta State. North Alabama led the league with a +0.7 margin as they committed 16 turnovers and forced 24 turnovers.

35 POINTS IS THE MAGIC NUMBER:

Since taking the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, Coach Mullins' Tech teams are 25-2 all-time in games in which they score 35 or more points in a single game. In fact, Tech is 32-10 when it scores between 21-34 points during the Mullins era, including being 1-0 this season. Tech has won 23 straight games when scoring at least 35 or more points and hasn't lost since falling 53-36 to UCA in

1997 when scoring 35 or more points.

NOEL RACKING UP THE TACKLES: Senior line-backer **Zach Noel** (Paragould, Ark.) continues to climb up the school's career tackle charts. Noel enters Saturday's GSC opener having recorded 167 total tackles, including 83 solo stops. In addition, he has had 7.0 tackles for 22 yards in losses and has picked off two passes, including one for a touchdown. In last Saturday's win over Texas College, Noel had five total tackles, including three solo stops and a 1.5 tackle for loss.

BARTHEL IS AN ACE IN TWO SPORTS:

Sophomore **Cole Barthel**, who is in his second season at Tech after transferring from the University of Arkansas, was a second round draft pick (71st pick overall) in the 2001 Major League Draft by the Atlanta Braves out of high school. Barthel decided to forgo college originally (he signed a National Letter of Intent with the Razorbacks as a quarterback) and played four seasons in the Atlanta Braves organization as a third baseman, including playing two seasons in Rome, Ga., an A-level minor league affiliate of the Braves. In his four-year minor league career, Barthel hit .251 with five home runs and 36 RBIs. Last

season as a freshman with the Razorbacks, Barthel went through spring drills and played in two games before leaving Fayetteville at the end of the first semester and enrolling at Tech. As a high school player, Barthel was selected as the North Alabama Player of the Year and was one of three finalists for the top back of the year and a finalist for the Class 6A Player of the Year as a senior after throwing for 2,074 yards and 21 touchdowns on 269 passing attempts and also rushing for 700 yards. In addition, he was a three-time All-Area selection and was ranked 69th nationally among high school quarterbacks by Rivals100.com.

CHILDRESS IS BECOMING TECH'S WORKHORSE ON THE GROUND: Sophomore running back **Tim Childress** is becoming Tech's workhorse on the ground in his second season of competing for the Wonder Boys. Through two games this season, the Batesville, Ark., native has carried the ball 44 times for 164 yards and is averaging 3.7 yards per carry and 82 yards per game overall, which ranks him fifth in the latest GSC statistics. In addition, he has scored one touchdown, a 1-yard run in last Saturday's win over Texas College and has caught six passes for 53 yards (8.8 yds/reception). As a redshirt freshman last season, Childress carried the ball 25 times for 80 yards in 10 games for the Wonder Boys.

STIGER LOOKING FOR MORE IN 2007: Junior receiver and return specialist **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) is looking for more success on special teams this coming season. Stiger averaged 20.8 yards on 30 kickoff returns last season, despite missing the final two games of the season due to an injury. The 20.8 average was second in the GSC and helped Stiger earn Second-Team All-GSC honors in 2006. In addition to his kick returning, Stiger also averaged a team-best 118.6 all-purpose yards, which was fourth in the GSC and 38th nationally in NCAA Division II. On the season, he caught 32 passes for 319 yards (10.0 yards/reception) and scored five touchdowns. Stiger enters Saturday's home opener having gained 2,253 total yards, including catching 45 passes for 420 yards, rushing for 340 yards on 92 carries and has returned 58 kickoffs for 1,209 yards (20.8 yards/return) and has scored 15 career touchdowns.

NCAA RULES CHANGES FOR 2007 SEASON: In 2006, the NCAA changed the way it started the clock as it decided to start the game clock when the ball is kicked off, as opposed to previously starting the clock when the ball was touched legally in the field of play. This season, the NCAA has decided to abandon last year's new rule and return to the old clock rule that states, that on a kickoff, the game clock starts when the ball is touched legally in the field of play or crosses the goal line after the receiving team touches it in its end zone. In addition, on a change of possession, the clock will start on the snap of the ball. Other clock rules this season include that during televised games

only, charged team timeouts will be one minute rather than 1:30. Another rule change this season is that teams will kickoff from its 30-yard line. Previously, the ball was kicked off from the 35. For fouls by the kicking team on kickoffs and punts (other than kick-catch interference), the receiving team has the option to tuck on the penalty where it will subsequently have the ball. The receiving team still may choose to have the down replayed after enforcement of the penalty at the previous spot. A third rule change this season is that no defensive player in an attempt to block, bat or catch a kick may be picked up, elevated, propelled or pushed by a teammate. This is an addition to an existing rule, with "elevated, propelled or pushed" added a new language.

TECH UNVEILS NEW HELMETS, COLOR SCHEME THIS SEASON:

During the offseason, Tech changed the color schemes for the school. Tech has switched from its traditional Green and Old Gold color to a Green (PMS 343) and Gold (PMS 116) scheme. The gold color is similar to the Green Bay Packers yellow that is worn on its helmets. With the change in colors, the Wonder Boys had to change its helmets this season from gold to yellow. In addition, they have added new uniforms

HISTORY MADE IN 2004: Tech Football made history in 2004 as the Wonder Boys won its first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff game with its 24-20 victory at Buerkle Field over Catawba. In addition, Tech was the first-ever team from the state of Arkansas to host an NCAA Division II playoff game and they also was the first team from Arkansas to ever win an NCAA Division II playoff contest. The Wonder Boys, who finished with a 10-2 overall record in 2004, ended the season with its 42-24 loss at Albany State in the second round of the NCAA Playoffs. Prior to Tech's postseason win over Catawba, the Wonder Boys last postseason win came in 1971 against Northern State in the semifinals of the

TECH FINISHES 2006 RANKED 26TH IN HOME ATTENDANCE: Despite playing all five of its home games last season at Russellville's Cyclone Stadium, Tech finished the year ranked 26th amongst 143 NCAA Division II teams in home attendance as the Wonder Boys averaged 5,467 for its five games at Cyclone Stadium. On the season, Tech had 27,336 fans attend their home contests. Fort Valley State led all of D-II in attendance with an average of 13,682 per game, while Tuskegee was second with an average of 11,195. UNA was the first GSC team ranked as they finished fourth with an average of 10,091 per game, while Delta State was 21st with an average of 6,030 per game and West Alabama was 22nd as they averaged 5,783 per game last season.

FORMER WONDER BOY JASON CAMPBELL SOARS IN FIRST SEASON OF ARENA FOOTBALL: Jason Campbell knows how to make a good first impression.

During his first season as a quarterback at Tech in 2004, Campbell threw for a school-record 2,922 yards and led the Wonder Boys to the second round of the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

Now, nearly three years later, Campbell has made a similar splash in the world of Arena Football while starting at quarterback for the 2007 Everett [Wash.] Hawks in his first season as a professional.

Campbell established new Everett franchise records for touchdown passes in a season (84) and passing yards in a season (3,663). In addition, he completed more than 60 percent of his passes during 2007 and ranked among the top 10 quarterbacks in AF2 (a developmental league under the Arena Football League umbrella) in passing efficiency.

And Campbell accomplished all of this despite the fact that he did not start until the fifth game of the season.

"It was rough at first because in Arena Football you have to get rid of the ball so fast," said Campbell. "I was in the shotgun most of the time at Arkansas Tech."

After seeing time as a back-up quarterback in Everett's first four games, he got his first start in week five. Campbell took advantage of the opportunity, throwing for 218 yards and five touchdowns to help the Hawks to their first win of the season.

Campbell went on to lead Everett to five more victories, including a three-game winning streak during the final month of the season. The Hawks finished their sea-

son on July 28 with a record of 6-10.

Victories were the norm when Campbell was at Tech. During his two years as the Wonder Boys' starting quarterback (2004-05), Tech accumulated an overall record of 17-5, including a 14-4 mark in GSC games. He completed his two-year Tech career with 5,100 yards of total offense (2nd-most in school history) and 5,079 passing yards (2nd-most in school history).

WHAT IS A WONDERBOY, YOU ASK?? Here is the story and history of the Wonder Boys. In 1919, Arkansas Tech's football team upset the highly-favored Jonesboro Aggies (now known as Arkansas State University) 14-0 behind a pair of 70-yard punt returns for touchdowns and two point-afters by a 17-year old quarterback by the name of **John Tucker**. The Jonesboro team had staked a claim to the mythical state football championship prior to the game.

Henry Loesch, the sports editor of the *Arkansas Gazette* in Little Rock, covered the game and coined the name "Wonder Boys" in complimenting the Tech team, then known as the Aggies, in his postgame story.

Tech's men's athletic teams have been known as the Wonder Boys ever since, and Tucker was thereafter labeled as "The Original Wonder Boy." Tucker went on to complete his education at the University of Alabama, but returned to Arkansas Tech and served in several capacities, including head football coach, athletics director and chemistry professor from 1925-72.

GREEN AND GOLD LUNCHEONS: The first of three Green and Gold Club Luncheons for 2007 was held on Monday, Aug. 20 at Western Sizzlin in Russellville and featured season previews by Mullins, Cross Country Coach **Tom Aspel** and Volleyball Coach **Kristy Bayer**. The next luncheon is scheduled for Oct. 22 and will serve as a preview of Tech 2007-08 men's and women's basketball seasons with Golden Suns first-year head coach **Dave Wilbers** and Wonder Boys second-year head coach **Mark Downey**.
