### TONIGHT'S GAME: Arkansas

**Tech** (3-1/1-1 GSC) returns to action Saturday when it plays at 3rd-ranked **North Alabama** in Gulf South Conference action at Braly Municipal Stadium (13,000/natural grass) in Florence, Ala. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m.

Tech, who is playing its second consecutive Top 5 nationally ranked team, enters the game looking to rebound from its first loss of the season last Saturday at 5th-ranked Valdosta State, 51-14. Meanwhile, North Alabama enters the game sporting a 3-0 overall record and a 2-0 mark in the GSC after collecting a 40-10 victory last Saturday at Southern Arkansas.

### NCAA/CSTV BROADBAND

**VIDEO STREAMING:** The Tech-UNA football game will be broadcast via broadband video streaming as part of an NCAA Division II partnership with CSTV. The Wonder Boys and the Lions are the third of four GSC football games scheduled for broadband broadcast this season. The game will be available through [NCAAsports.com/DII](http://NCAAsports.com/DII) and also [CSTV.com](http://CSTV.com). The NCAA and CSTV have partnered together to bring 40 Division II football games, four each week, via video streaming. Other games for broadband telecast this week include Carson-Newman at Newberry (3 p.m.), Winona State at Concordia-St. Paul (6 p.m.) and Angelo State at Midwestern State (7 p.m.).

### THE COACHES:

The Wonder Boys are coached by **Steve Mullins** (Ark.-Monticello, '80). Mullins is 62-39 in his 10th season as head coach and is 52-30 all-time in GSC games. Tech's assistant coaches for 2006 are: **Gregg Ricono** (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks and running backs); **Dave Wheeler** (defensive coordinator/linebackers); **Les Boyum** (offensive line); **Benyard Jones** (defensive line); **Ryan Wallace** (receivers); **Greg Williams** (defensive backs); **Brett Hobbs** (GA/linebackers); **Andrew**

**THE AIR:** Every Tech football game can be heard once again this season on the flagship station of Tech Athletics, **KWKK** (100.9 FM) in Russellville. Former Tech Assistant SID **Sam Strasner** provides the play-by-play with **Kelly Davis**, Tech's Director of Corporate and Foundation Giving/Athletic Development alongside for the color commentary. The radio broadcasts begin 30 minutes prior the opening kickoff with the **Steve Mullins** Pregame Show.

The show, hosted by **Johnny Story**, features Tech coaches discussing their teams, a review of previous games, upcoming opponents and other news. The next show is scheduled for Sept. 25 and will feature Mullins and Tech Volleyball Coach **Kristy Kale**.

The Lions are coached by **Mark Hudspeth** (Delta State, '92). Hudspeth is 36-16 in his fifth season at North Alabama and as a collegiate head coach. UNA's assistant coaches for 2006 are: **Kenny Edenfield** (offensive coordinator/receivers); **Karl Morgan** (defensive coordinator/defensive line); **Alan Arrington** (offensive line/recruiting coordinator); **Stedman Campbell** (cornerbacks); **Sean Cannon** (linebackers); **Mike King** (kickers) and **Chris Willis** (safeties).

**LAST GAME vs. NORTH ALABAMA:** In the last meeting between the two schools, Tech suffered a 55-9 loss at the hands of the Lions on Oct. 18, 2003 at Buerkle Field. The 46-point margin of victory by UNA was the largest against Tech since the Wonder Boys fell 55-7 in 1997 at McNeese State. In the game, Tech was held 197 yards of total offense, including 79 yards rushing and throwing two interceptions. Meanwhile, the Lions gained 549 yards of total offense, including rushing for 303 yards and passing for 246 yards on a 16-of-20 effort. Tech's lone touchdown in the game came on a 40-yard touchdown pass from **Mike Edgeworth** to **Willie Scott** in the second quarter, which trimmed UNA's lead to 9-7. Following Scott's touchdown, UNA scored 46 unanswered points, before Tech closed out the scoring on a safety with 4:29 remaining in the game. Edgeworth finished the game 10-for-19 through the air for 102 yards, while Scott caught four passes for 70 yards in the loss. UNA was led offensively by **DeMarcus Blount**, who rushed for 139 yards and scored four touchdowns, while quarterback **Will Hall** was 15-for-19 through the air for 243 yards.

**THE NORTH ALABAMA SERIES:** Saturday's GSC game against North Alabama marks the 10th all-time meeting in the series that dates back to 1970, with North Alabama leading the series, 6-3. UNA has won two straight in the series since the Wonder Boys earned a 24-21 win in 1999. UNA leads the series 4-1 in Russellville and the series is tied at 2-2 in Florence. Tech's last win in Florence came in 1996 when the Wonder Boys earned a 38-35 win over the Lions, snapping UNA's 28-game home winning streak. Mullins is 1-4 all-time against the Lions.

**ABOUT THE LIONS:** North Alabama enters the Tech game with the league's No. 3 defense and No. 4 offense. In addition, the Lions are second in the GSC in scoring (34.3 points per game) and are third in scoring defense (11.3 points per game). UNA is averaging 377.3 yards per game on offense (209.7 yards per game passing / 167.7 yards per game rushing) and has scored 13 times in 16 red zone tries on the season,

including scoring 10 touchdowns. Leading the way offensively for UNA is junior quarterback **A.J. Milwee**, who is averaging 133.7 all-purpose yards per game and is 27-for-53 through the air for 351 yards (117.0 yds/game) and has tossed five touchdowns and thrown four interceptions. Milwee's backup, sophomore **Dusty**

**Goodwin** is 22-for-32 in the air for 243 yards with three touchdowns and no interceptions. Senior receiver **Jason Messing** is the top air target for the Lions as he is averaging 77.7 yards receiving per game and has caught 12 pass for 233 yards (19.4 yards/catch) and has scored four touchdowns, while senior receiver **Anthony Merritt** has caught 11 passes for 124 yards (11.3 yards/catch). In addition to his pass catching, Merritt, a Preseason All-American and a Harlon Hill Award semifinalist last season, is averaging 18.7 yards per kickoff return and 12.2 yards per punt return and has eight career kick returns for touchdowns and is averaging 114.7 all-purpose yards a game. Junior running back **Eric Parker** is averaging 59.7 yards per game and 6.0 yards per carry on the season. Meanwhile, on defense, senior linebacker **Donald Tharpe** leads the way with 26 total tackles, including 4.5 tackles for loss, 3.5 sacks and three pass break-ups. Senior linebacker **Brian McNair** has recorded 20 tackles and 5.0 tackles for loss, while senior defensive tackle **Kentrel Tanner** has recorded 10 tackles, including 3.5 tackles for loss, 2.5 sacks and a forced fumble and senior defensive end **Ryan Brick** has had 2.5 tackles for loss and two sacks. As a team, UNA has recorded 27 tackles for loss, 12 quarterback sacks and have picked off five passes. Another weapon for the Lions is junior kicker **Yuta Fukuda**, who is 3-for-5 on field goals and is 8-for-10 on point-after attempts and is averaging 59.3 yards per kickoff this season.

**ON THIS DATE:** Arkansas Tech has played just nine previous football games on Sept. 30 and Saturday's contest with North Alabama is the second consecutive year Tech is playing on this date as they defeated West Georgia, 14-9, last season. Tech is 7-2 all-time on Sept. 30 and Mullins is 2-0 in games played on Sept. 30. Saturday's game marks the 92nd anniversary of Tech football as the Wonder Boys first-ever intercollegiate football game was played on Sept. 30, 1911. Tech won its initial game, 6-5, over Russellville High School.

**NEW HOME VENUE IN 2006:** Tech will play all five of its home games this season at Cyclone Stadium, which is located on the Russellville High School campus. The change is only for this season as Tech's home stadium - **Buerkle Field** - is undergoing renovation as part of Tech's \$4-million 'Return to Glory' capital campaign. The campaign raised money to support the construction of a residence hall as a wrap-around to the current football stadium, revitalization of the field, enhancements to the school's women's sports facilities and the addition of a permanent bandstand in the end zone for Tech's band.

When the Buerkle Field project is completed in time for the 2007-08 school year, the new and improved Buerkle Field will feature a 226-bed residence hall, a new press box, controlled entrances to the stadium, new ticket booths, new concession stands, revamped and additional restroom facilities, an auxiliary bookstore for the sale of Tech spirit merchandise and a new and improved scoreboard.

**TECH IN ROAD GSC GAMES:** Since joining the GSC in 1995, Tech is 25-24-1 all-time on the road in GSC games and has won nine of its last 14 on the road since going winless in road league games in 2002. Last season, Tech was 2-2 on the road in league play, losing 34-17 at Delta State and falling 27-10 at Harding in final road game of the 2005 season. Since taking over the program in 1997, Mullins is 28-

26 away from home, including being 22-18 in road GSC contests.

**WONDER BOYS IN SEPTEMBER:** Saturday's game marks the Wonder Boys' 199th game all-time in in the month of September. Tech is 104-88-6 all-time in games during the month, including winning 10 of its last 11 games in the month. Mullins is 27-11 all-time in the month of September as a head coach.

**TECH IN THE NATIONAL POLLS:** Tech, who was ranked 18th last week, fell out of the AFCA Division II Coaches' Poll this week after its loss to Valdosta State. The Wonder Boys, though, did receive 49 votes this week to be first among teams receiving votes. In addition to receiving votes in the AFCA Poll, Tech fell up 15 spots this week to 37th in the *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* Top 40 Poll and fell out of the D2Football.com poll after being 25th last week. For the second consecutive season, Mullins is one of the 28 coaches that votes in the AFCA Poll.

**GSC PRESEASON POLL TABS TECH TIED FOR FOURTH:** Tech was tabbed to finish in a tie for fourth place with Southern Arkansas in the preseason Gulf South Conference Coaches Poll, which was released on Aug. 1. Tech and Southern Arkansas each received 65 points in the poll that was voted on by the league's head coaches and the coaches couldn't vote for their own teams. In the poll, Tech

received one vote for third, five votes for fourth and two votes each for fifth and sixth place. North Alabama was tabbed as the preseason favorite as they garnered 95 points and six of a possible 11 first-place votes. Valdosta State was picked second as they received 92 points and four first-place votes, while Delta State was tabbed third as it received 82 points and the lone remaining first place vote. Behind Tech and SAU was West Georgia, who was tabbed sixth as they received 64 points. Harding was next in seventh place after receiving 45 points, while Henderson State (34 points), Ouachita Baptist (26 points), West Alabama (20 points) and Arkansas-Monticello (17 points) round out the poll.

**RECAP OF VALDOSTA STATE GAME:** The Wonder Boys began began a two-week road swing against top-five nationally ranked teams last Saturday as the Wonder Boys fell 51-14 to 5th-ranked Valdosta State in GSC action at Bazemore-Hyder Stadium in Valdosta, Ga.

The 51 points allowed were the most surrendered by the Wonder Boys since allowing 53 points in a 53-36 loss to Central Arkansas in 1997.

Tech, who entered the game ranked 18th in this week's AFCA Coaches' Poll, struggled in punt coverage throughout the game, especially in the first half when the Blazers returned four punts for 108 yards, which set up two of VSU's six scores and then used a block of a sophomore **Nick McCaskill's** (Camden, Ark.) punt to add another touchdown. In the first half, VSU scored on six of its nine possessions and finished the afternoon with seven punt returns for 202 yards.

"Our punt cover team put us into a hole at the beginning that we couldn't recover from," Mullins said. "Our poor coverage helped VSU scored the first 16 points of the game and helped them gain the momentum."

VSU entered the game having not played a game since collecting a 31-3 win over Fort Valley State on Sept. 9, so the Blazers had two weeks to prepare for the Wonder Boys. Meanwhile, Tech entered the game one week after posting a

**STEVE MULLINS - HEAD COACH / ATHLETIC DIRECTOR**

University of Arkansas-Monticello, 1980 (B.S. Science)

Steve Mullins is in his 10th season at the helm of the Wonder Boys in 2006. He enters the tonight's game with North Alabama sporting an overall record of 62-39 (.614) and a Gulf South Conference record of 52-30 (.634).

Since joining the sidelines as Tech's head coach in 1997, Mullins has brought the Wonder Boys into the upper echelon of the toughest NCAA Division II football conference in the country. He has led Tech to one Gulf South Championship (1999) and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory (2004).

Mullins enters the 2006 season as the third winningest active coach in terms of wins in the GSC and is the third winningest coach in Arkansas Tech's 93-year history of football.

Last season, Mullins led Tech to a 7-3 overall record and a 6-3 mark in the GSC. The seven wins was Mullins' fifth season of winning at least seven games with the Wonder Boys.

In 2004, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to the school's fourth-ever 10-win season and first since 1971 and led the squad to the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the second time in five seasons. In addition, Tech won its first ever playoff game at the Division II level and set the school record for total offense (4,949 yards).

For the season, Tech finished the season with a 10-2 record and an 8-1 mark in the Gulf South Conference, which led Mullins to be named the GSC and AFCA Division II Region Coach of the Year.

In his first two seasons at Tech, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to records of 4-7 in 1997 and 5-5 in 1998 before breaking through in 1999 with a 9-3 record and the school's first GSC Football Championship, which earned Mullins the league's Coach of the Year honor. The 1999 team featured three All-Americans and seven All-GSC selections.

Following the 1999 season, Mullins led Tech to records of 7-3 in 2000, including a 24-10 win over eventual national champion Delta State and 8-2 in 2001.

Since coming to Tech, Mullins' impact can't just be measured in mere wins and losses. In the past nine years, 35 Wonder Boys have been selected to the GSC All-Academic Team and 110 football players have qualified for the GSC Academic Honor Roll. In addition, 13 Wonder Boys have been named CoSIDA Academic All-District VI

American honors.

Along with that, five different Tech football players have been named to the GSC 'Top 10' Student-Athlete list and two Wonder Boys have received the GSC's Commissioner's Cup as the top male student-athlete in the league.

After six successful years at the helm of the football program, Mullins added the title of athletic director to his duties on April 16, 2003. In that capacity, he oversees the day-to-day operations of the athletic department and the school's 10 sport program.

Mullins began his Tech career in 1997 after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I-AA Northwestern State in Natchitoches, La.

Prior to Northwestern State, Mullins, the Camden, Ark., native, served for two seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State, two seasons as an assistant at Southwestern Oklahoma State and four years as an assistant coach at Lamar University.

The former University of Arkansas-Monticello defensive tackle began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Central Arkansas in 1981. As a player at UAM, Mullins was a three-time All-Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference selection, a three-time All-NAIA District 17 selection, a two-time NAIA All-American, an Associated Press Small College All-American as a senior in 1979 and is a member of the UAM Athletic Hall of Fame.

Mullins, who graduated from Camden [Ark.] High School in 1976, is married to the former Elizabeth (Liz) Morgan of Groves, Texas. The couple have three children, Katie (18), a freshman at Tech, Hunter (15) and Mason (11).

come-from-behind 28-21 overtime win at home last Saturday over West Georgia.

"We had our backs against the wall entering the game, as Valdosta State had two weeks to prepare for us and they were playing at home," the 10th-year Tech coach said.

The punt returns gave VSU a short field to work with in the first quarter as their first score, a 26-yard pass from Willie

Copeland to Rashawn Robinson, was set up by a 32-yard punt return by Sherard Reynolds. The Blazers second score, a 22-yard field goal by Zachary Williams, came four plays after a 42-yard punt return by Reynolds. VSU's third score came as a result of Eric Williams' block of McCaskill's punt, which was recovered by Shawn Harris and returned 10 yards for a touchdown to give VSU a 16-0 lead and then VSU completed the quarter by adding a 58-yard touchdown pass from Copeland to Cedric Jones, which came two plays after Tech was stopped on a failed fourth down conversion.

Reynolds finished the day with five punt returns for 168 yards in the win.

In the second quarter, VSU added another touchdown on a 2-yard pass from Copeland to Travis Taylor just a little less than 13 minutes remaining in the half and then on its next possession, Michael Terry added a touchdown on a two-yard plunge to give VSU a 37-0 halftime lead.

The Wonder Boys played even with the Blazers in the second half as both teams each scored two touchdowns, but VSU's damage was already done.

Trailing 37-0 midway through the third quarter, the Wonder Boys defense prevented a shutout when junior **Andrew Murphy** (Booneville, Miss.) picked off a Copeland pass and returned it 42 yards for a touchdown. The 42-yard interception return was Tech's first since junior free safety **Zach Noel** (Paragould, Ark.) returned an interception of a Harding pass for a touchdown last season. In the fourth quarter, the Wonder Boys offense recorded a score after beginning a drive on a fumble recovery by

Murphy on VSU's 40-yard line. Five plays later, sophomore quarterback **Cole Barthel** connected with sophomore W-Back **Tracey Stiger** on a 29-yard pass. Stiger caught six passes for 65 yards and returned six kickoffs for 128 yards in the loss.

VSU's two scores in the second half came on a 5-yard pass from Copeland to Derek Tharpe and Deon Williams completed the game's scoring with a 3-yard run with 6:39 left in the game.

Barthel finished the game 11-for-28 through the air for 113 yards and two interceptions, while fellow sophomore **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.) was 4-for-11 through the air for 20 yards and carried the ball a team-high nine times for 33 yards. Junior tailback **Shawn O'Connor** (San Antonio, Texas) led the Wonder Boys ground attack with 41 yards on eight carries.

In addition to its 202 yards on punt returns, the Blazers gained 494 yards in total offense, including passing for 300 yards (31-for-41) and rushing 35 times for 194 yards. Meanwhile, Tech's offense was held to 215 total yards, including throwing for 133 yards and rushing for 121 yards on 33 carries.

Copeland finished the day 29-for-38 through the air for 285 yards with four touchdowns and two interceptions, while Jones caught seven passes for 105 yards and Jeffrey Felton had two catches for 63 yards. In all, 12 VSU receivers caught at last one pass for the game.

"We just need to regroup and prepare for our next challenge, North Alabama," Mullins added.

**SCORING STREAKS:** Tech enters Saturday's fifth game of the season having scored in 27 straight games since being shutout 30-0 by Valdosta State in the next to last game of the 2003 season. In fact, since Mullins took over the program in 1997, Tech has failed to score in a game only twice and has scored in 115 of its last 117 games.

Meanwhile, Tech's opponents have scored in

39 consecutive games, including nine of its last 14 opponents scoring 30-plus points, since the Wonder Boys held West Alabama scoreless on Nov. 2, 2002. In the last eight years, Tech has held only one opponent scoreless and has held seven opponents under 10 points.

**WONDER BOYS UNVEILING NEW SCHEMES IN 2006:** During the spring, Tech unveiled a new offensive and defensive scheme for the 2006 season. Tech switched from a multiple offensive set to a wide-open, five-receiver spread offense attack that will take advantage of the athleticism of Tech's two quarterbacks **Justin Ray** and **Cole Barthel**.

Tech's new offense veils in comparison to what fans witnessed last season as Tech has moved to a one-back set, replacing the fullback with just a halfback and revamping its receivers with two inside receivers labeled H and W and two outside receivers labeled W and X. In addition, Tech has moved senior **Josh Rogers** (Russellville, Ark.) and junior **Justin McCutcheon** (Harrison, Ark.) from tight end to an H-Back position and **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) from running back to a W-Back position.

While its offense underwent a transformation, Tech's defense also switched its scheme as Mullins and his defensive coaches switched from its usual 4-2-5 to a more traditional 3-4 scheme, with three down lineman and four linebackers. The switch was necessary for Tech's defenders to be able to counter the spread attacks that are popping up around the GSC. The new defense features three down linemen and four linebackers. One change this season is that the strong safety position has been renamed a Bandit.

**PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN:** Tech had one player named a 2006 Preseason All-American by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* - sophomore return specialist **Tracey Stiger**.

As a redshirt freshman in 2005, Stiger finished eighth in NCAA Division II in punt returns with an

average of 15.4 yards per return and averaged 19.8 yards per kickoff return. In addition, he was second on the team in rushing with 341 yards (4.2 yards per carry) and caught five passes for 53 yards (10.6 yards per catch) and scored a total of seven touchdowns, including six rushing touchdowns. He averaged 113.1 all-purpose yards per game and was second on the team in scoring with 42 points.

Stiger was one of the 18 GSC players named to the Preseason *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-American team.

So far this season, Stiger leads Tech with 206 receiving yards and is averaging 143.2 all-purpose yards per game, which is third in the league and is tied for the team lead with three touchdowns. In addition, he is averaging 22.2 yards per kickoff return.

**MULLINS SIXTH ON GSC CAREER COACHING WINS LIST:**

Mullins, who is in his 10th season at Tech this season, stands sixth all-time on the GSC career coaching victories list with 62. Former Mississippi College coach **John M. Williams** (1972-90) headlines the list with 124 wins, while former North Alabama head coach (1988-7) and current West Alabama coach **Bobby Wallace** is second on the list with 85 wins and former UNA coach **Wayne Grubb** (1977-87) is third with 82 all-time victories. Current Valdosta State head coach **Chris Hatcher** is fourth with 71 wins, Jacksonville State's **Bill**

Current Delta State coach **Rick Rhoades** is seventh on the list with 57 wins, while former Jacksonville State coach **Jim Fuller** (1977-83) is eighth with 54 wins and current Ouachita Baptist coach **Todd Knight** is ninth with 51 wins.

**TECH IS TIED FOR 10TH ON D-II ALL-TIME WINNINGEST TEAMS LIST:**

Since beginning football 92 years ago, Tech stands alone in 10th place on the list of all-time winningest NCAA Division II football programs. Tech has recorded 497 wins all-time entering Saturday's North Alabama game and the Wonder Boys are one of 12 schools to win at least 485 all-time games. Tech enters Saturday's game with a 497-315-41 all-time record, winning nearly 61 percent of their 852 games.

Pittsburg [KS] State headlines the list of all-time winningest programs with 606 wins, while Tuskegee [AL] is second all-time with 579 wins. North Dakota is third with 573 wins, while Central Oklahoma is fourth with 570 and

Hillsdale [MI] is fifth in wins all-time with 551. Texas A&M-Kingsville is sixth all-time with 547 wins, Carson-Newman is seventh with 517 wins and Truman [Mo.] State is eighth with 509 all-time wins. Northern State is ninth with 507 all-time victories, while West Chester is tied with Tech with 497 wins and Virginia Union is 12th with 487 wins.

**TECH SECOND WINNINGEST TEAM SINCE 1999:**

Since 1999, Tech is the third winningest team in the GSC with 53 overall wins in 80 games and is second in GSC wins with 44 over that same span. Valdosta State is the winningest team in the league since 2000 with 75 overall wins in 91 games and has recorded 54 GSC victories, while Delta State is second with 55 overall wins in 81 games and is tied with Tech for second in GSC wins with 44.

In addition to being the third winningest team overall in the GSC since 1999, Tech is also the winningest football program at any level in the state of Arkansas over that same span with 53 wins, while Central Arkansas, Tech's former GSC rival and NCAA Division I-A Arkansas are tied for second place with 51 wins. SAU is fourth with 46 wins, while Harding is fifth with 41 wins. Arkansas-Pine Bluff is sixth with 32 wins, while UAM is seventh with 31 wins and NCAA Division I-A Arkansas State is eighth with 28 victories. Ouachita Baptist is ninth with 23 wins and Henderson State rounds out the list at 10th with 21 wins since 1999.

**MURPHY HONORED BY THE GSC:** Junior defensive tackle **Andrew Murphy** became the third Tech player in four weeks to be honored as a GSC Player of the Week on Monday, Sept. 25. Murphy was named the league's Defensive Player of the Week for his performance in Tech's loss last Saturday at Valdosta State. Against the Blazers, Murphy had a hand in three of VSU's four turnovers as he forced a fumble, recovered a fumble and returned an interception 42 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter for the Wonder Boys' first score of the game. For the game, he had four tackles, including three solo stops and a pass break-up.

**35 POINTS IS THE MAGIC NUMBER:** Since taking the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, Coach Mullins' Tech teams are 24-2 all-time in games in which they score 35 or more points in a single game. In fact, Tech is 29-10 when it scores between 21-34 points during the Mullins era, including being 3-0 this season. Tech has won 22 straight games when scoring at least 35 or more points and hasn't lost since falling 53-36 to Central Arkansas in 1997 when scoring 35 or more points.

**DID YOU KNOW FACT. . .**

**Cole Barthel** and Tech assistant baseball coach **Wes McCrotty** share a common similarity. That similarity is that both of them were drafted in the 2001 Major League Baseball Draft, as Barthel was a second-round selection (71st pick overall) by the Atlanta Braves out of Decatur (Ala.) High School, while McCrotty, a graduate of Russellville High School, was drafted in the 23rd round (692nd overall) by the Florida Marlins after a stellar pitching career for the Arkansas Razorbacks.

**BARTHEL IS AN ACE IN TWO SPORTS:**

Sophomore quarterback **Cole Barthel** (Decatur, Ala.), who is in his first season at Tech after transferring last winter from the University of Arkansas, was a second round draft pick (71st pick overall) in the 2001 Major League Draft by the Atlanta Braves out of high school. Barthel decided to forgo college originally (he signed a National Letter of Intent with the Razorbacks as a quarterback) and played four seasons in the Atlanta Braves organization as a third baseman, including playing two seasons in Rome, Ga., an A-level minor league affiliate of the Braves. In his four-year minor league career, Barthel hit .251 with five home runs and 36 RBIs. Last season as a freshman with the Razorbacks, Barthel went through spring drills and played in two games before leaving Fayetteville at the end of the first semester and enrolling at Tech. As a high school player, Barthel was selected as the North Alabama Player of the Year and was one of three finalists for the top back of the year and a finalist for the Class 6A Player of the Year as a senior after throwing for 2,074 yards and 21 touchdowns on 269 passing attempts and also rushing for 700 yards. In addition, he was a three-time All-Area selection and was ranked 69th nationally among high school quarterbacks by Rivals100.com.

**ROGERS IS TOUCHDOWN MACHINE:**

Senior H-back **Josh Rogers** (Russellville, Ark.) is looking to continue climbing the school's career touchdown chart in his final season as a Wonder Boy. Rogers, who was an All-America tight end as a sophomore and a Second-Team All-GSC selection last season, has hauled in 12 touchdown passes in his career, which is sixth on the school's career chart. The school's career touchdown mark of 21 is held by **Greg Washington** (1999-01).

two short of the school's single-season record of 11 set by **Steven Daniels** in 1996. Rogers enters the North Alabama game having caught 61 career passes for 850 yards and is 150 yards shy of becoming the 17th Wonder Boy to join the 1,000-Yard Receiving Club.

**CALDWELL MOVING UP RECEIVING CHARTS:**

Senior receiver **Mark Caldwell** (Crossett, Ark.) is poised to climb up the school's career receiving yards chart as he enters Saturday's North Alabama game having caught 93 career passes for 1,249 yards. The 93 pass receptions is 8th on the school's career chart and the 1,249 yards receiving is ninth on the school's career chart and he is the 16th member of the 1,000-Yard Receiving Club. As a junior in 2005, Caldwell led Tech with 42 receptions for 639 yards and caught a team-best six touchdown passes. The 42 receptions was 12th on the school's single-season pass reception list. On the season, Caldwell has caught 15 passes for 150 yards (10.0 yards/catch) and is averaging 50 yards receiving per game.

**TWO-HEADED MONSTER AT QUARTERBACK:**

Tech enters this season looking to replace departed quarterback **Jason Campbell**, who started the past two seasons and left Tech as the school's No. 2 leader all-time in total offense and passing yards. Looking to replace Campbell under center this season are **Cole Barthel** and **Justin Ray**. Both Ray and Barthel are listed as co-No. 1s on the depth chart and have been engaged in a battle to determine the starter since fall practice began since both of them missed nearly all of spring practice due to injuries. Ray played in seven games last season and passed for 137 yards and rushed for 131 yards on 18 carries. On the season, Barthel is 52-for-96 through the air for 568 yards with eight touchdowns and five interceptions and has carried the ball 14

times for 17 yards, while Ray is 13-for-29 passing for 132 yards with one interception and a touchdown. In addition, Ray has carried the ball a team-best 42 times for 257 yards (6.1 yards/carry) and has a rushing touchdown.

**VANHOOK PROGRESSING UP TECH'S CAREER RUSHING CHARTS:** Through four games this season, **R.J. Vanhook** has rushed 36 times for 195 yards and is averaging 5.4 yards per carry and 48.8 yards per game. In addition, he has scored two touchdowns. The 195 yards increases Vanhook's career rushing yard total to 1,870 (4.9 yards/carry) and the two touchdowns gives him 17 career rushing touchdowns and 19 total touchdowns as he has had two pass receptions for scores. The 1,870 yards puts Vanhook 11th on Tech's career rushing chart and the 19 career touchdowns puts him in a tie with former Wonder Boy **Phil Fisher** (1970-71) for 15th in career scoring with 114 points. Vanhook is 130 yards shy of becoming the 11th player in Tech history to rush for 2,000 career yards.

**SIX FRESHMEN EXPECTED TO SEE ACTION THIS SEASON:** The Wonder Boys are expected to suit up six freshmen this season and four of those six freshmen are listed on the two-deep chart, including **Matt**

**Kitchens** (Russellville, Ark.), who is the projected starting deep snapper and is sitting second team at one of the linebacker spots. The other freshmen on the two-deep chart are **Leonard King** (Little Rock, Ark.) at Bandit and **Torrence Wright** (Sulphur Springs, Texas) at left guard. Three other freshmen expected to suit up this season are quarterback **Ben Johnson** (Wilmot, Ark.), wide receiver **Major Baker** (Amite, La.) and wide receiver **Chris Vaughn** (Benton, Ark.).

**HOSKINSON SET TO START AT HIS THIRD OFFENSIVE LINE POSITION THIS SEASON:** Senior **Blake Hoskinson** (Osceola, Ark.) is set to start at center on Saturday against UNA and when he does, it will be the third different spot he has started at on the offensive line this season. He began the year as a starter at left tackle, after switching during fall drills from right guard, where he started at all of 2005. Last week against Valdosta State, he started at right tackle. He enters Saturday's game having made 14 consecutive starts on the offensive line.

**HISTORY MADE IN 2004:** Tech Football made history in 2004 as the Wonder Boys won its first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff game with its 24-20 victory at Buerkle Field over Catawba. In addition, Tech was the first-ever team from the state of Arkansas to host an NCAA Division II playoff game and they also was the first team from Arkansas to ever win an NCAA Division II playoff contest. The Wonder Boys, who finished with a 10-2 overall record in 2004, ended the season with its 42-24 loss at Albany State in the second round of the NCAA Playoffs. Prior to Tech's postseason win over

**TECH FINISHES RANKED 22ND IN HOME ATTENDANCE:**

The Wonder Boys finished last season ranked 22nd amongst 149 NCAA Division II teams in home attendance as Tech averaged 6,226 fans for its five home games. Tech was one of four GSC teams ranked in the Top 25 in home attendance. West Texas A&M led all of D-II in attendance with an average of 13,089 per game, while Tuskegee was second with an average of 11,307. UNA was the first GSC team ranked at No. 9 as they averaged 8,066 fans per game, while UCA was 15th with an average of 7,326 per game. Tech was next at No. 22 and Delta State rounded out the Top 25 at No. 25 with an average of 5,925 fans a game.

**WHAT IS A WONDERBOY, YOU ASK??** Here is the story and history of the Wonder Boys. In 1919, Arkansas Tech's football team upset the highly-favored Jonesboro Aggies (now known as Arkansas State University) 14-0 behind a pair of 70-yard punt returns for touchdowns and two point-afters by a 17-year old quarterback by the name of **John Tucker**. The Jonesboro team had staked a claim to the mythical state football championship prior to the game.

**Henry Loesch**, the sports editor of the *Arkansas Gazette* in Little Rock, covered the game and coined the name "Wonder Boys" in complimenting the Tech team, then known as the Aggies, in his postgame story. Tech men's athletic teams have known as the

Wonder Boys ever since, and Tucker was thereafter labeled as "The Original Wonder Boy." Tucker went on to complete his education at the University of Alabama, but returned to Arkansas Tech and served in several capacities, including head football coach, athletics director and chemistry professor from 1925-72.

**GSC RETURNS TO TELEVISION ONCE AGAIN IN 2006:**

For the second consecutive year, the GSC returns to live television once again this season. This season's "GSC-TV Live" schedule features nine, Thursday night contests, all of which will kick off at 7 p.m. CST. Last season, seven of the nine games that were broadcast were on Thursday, while two of them were broadcast on Saturday.

CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast) continues as the primary carrier for the "GSC-TV Live" games, bringing more than 5 million potential households, while Cox Sports (which is on channel 119 in Russellville) adds its 1.7 million customers to the mix for the second straight season. In addition, the GSC will also make the broadcasts available to other cable systems and open-air channels in non-conflicting areas, but the games will not be available on DirectTV or DishNetwork.

Returning to the booth once again this season will be the broadcasting tandem of Bob Valvano and Don Russell on the play-by-play, Jesse Branch doing the color commentary and Jim Cavele roaming the sidelines.

"We got off to a great start last year and the talent on the set had a lot to do with it," GSC Commissioner Nate Salant said. "Bob Valvano is a nationally recognized ESPN broadcaster with a late-night show in nearly 200 markets--all of which heard about the games every week. Russell has worked everything from Division I-A to the Olympics. Branch coached at Arkansas, Southwest Missouri and Henderson State and is a legend, and Cavele did so well for us that we wound up working some national D-II games for ESPN."

selected for broadcast, the Wonder Boys will make its one and only appearance on live television in Magnolia, Ark., against Southern Arkansas. All of the teams in the league are scheduled to be shown at least once as part of the nine-week package, but Valdosta State was scheduled for three television games, while Delta State, Henderson State, Southern Arkansas and West Alabama will have two of their league games broadcast this season.

Salant said that forming this year's television schedule was a lot harder than last season's debut, but we were able to achieve the goals of getting every team on at least once, focusing on games between teams from different states and understanding where the Nielsen ratings were best impacted.

"Believe it or not, getting the right mix of games and keeping promises to air specific ones was very difficult," Salant said. "Nine and eleven are only divisible into 99, and that's about how many different stabs we took at getting the right mix. In the end, it all worked out, and I think we've come up with an entertaining schedule that features intriguing games."

The "GSC-TV Live" package begins on Sept. 14 as Harding plays at North Alabama. The next broadcast is scheduled for Sept. 21 when Henderson State travels to play at West Alabama. On Sept. 28, Valdosta State will play at OBU.
