### TODAY'S GAME: Arkansas

**Tech** (3-0 overall / 1-0 GSC) returns to action Saturday, Sept. 22 when it begins a two-game homestand against fourth-ranked **Valdosta State** (2-0 / 0-0 GSC) in Gulf South Conference action at **Buerkle Field** (6,500/natural grass). Kickoff is set for 3:05 p.m. CDT and will mark Tech's first and only live television game of the season.

Tech enters Saturday's GSC opener riding a seven-game winning streak after opening GSC play with a 52-34 win last Saturday at West Georgia. The seven-game winning streak, which began with Tech winning its final four games of the 2006 season, is the longest such streak since winning nine straight games during the 2004 season. Meanwhile, Valdosta State enters its first GSC game of the season sporting a 2-0 record, but the Blazers haven't played a game since earning a 69-0 win over Fort Valley State on Sept. 8.

### "GSC-TV LIVE" GAME OF THE

**WEEK:** Today's game will be broadcast live on television by CSS (Comcast/Charter Sports Southeast) and Cox Sports. The game, which will be shown in the Russellville area on Suddenlink Cable Channel 2 and 119, is Tech's lone live television game this season. Calling the action in the booth is **Don Russell** (play-by-play) and **Jesse Branch** (color analyst) with **Jim Cavale** reporting from the sideline.

### TECH RETURNS TO BUERKLE

**FIELD IN 2007:** After playing all five home games during the 2006 season at Russellville High School's Cyclone Stadium thanks to renovations on Tech's home stadium - Buerkle Field - as part of the school's \$4-million 'Return to Glory' capital campaign, the Wonder Boys will return to the renovated Buerkle Field when it plays its first home game of the 2007 season on Sept. 8 against Texas College.

The new and improved Buerkle Field features a 226-bed residence hall, a new press box, controlled entrances to the stadium, new ticket booths, new concession stands, revamped restroom facilities, an auxiliary bookstore for the sale of Tech spirit merchandise, a new and improved scoreboard and four new and improved field lights.

**THE COACHES:** The Wonder Boys are coached by **Steve Mullins** (Ark.-Monticello, '80). Mullins is 69-41 in his 11th season as head coach and is 57-32 all-time in GSC games. Tech's assistant coaches for 2007 are: **Benyard Jones** (defensive coordinator/linebackers), **Scott Preston** (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks & running backs), **Les Boyum** (offensive line), **Erik Kruppe** (defensive line), **Ryan Wallace** (receivers), **Greg Williams** (defensive backs), **Brett Hobbs** (GA/linebackers), **Andrew Jackson** (SA/secondary), **Garren Rockwell** (GA/defensive line), **Kyle Shipp** (GA/offensive line) and **Antonio Whitfield** (GA/receivers). The Blazers are coached by **David Dean** (Georgia State, '86). Dean is 2-0 in his first year at VSU and also as a collegiate head coach. Valdosta State's assistant coaches for 2007 are: **David Elsenrath** (offensive line/recruiting coordinator); **Joe Cauthen** (defensive line); **James Colzie** (secondary/special teams); **Buster Faulkner** (quarterbacks); **Sean Calhoun** (GA/running backs); **Tony Haynes** (GA/receivers); **Brian Simmons** (GA/safeties) and **Will Weaver** (GA/specialists and linebackers).

of a seven-game winning streak as they ended last season winning its final four games. The seven-game winning streak is the longest for Tech since winning nine straight games during the 2004 season and the longest such streak for a GSC team entering the fourth week of the season.

**THE VALDOSTA STATE SERIES:** Saturday's GSC home game against Valdosta State marks the ninth all-time meeting in the series that dates back to 1995, with Valdosta State leading the series, 7-1. VSU has won three straight in the series, including last season's 51-14 win in Valdosta, Ga., since the Wonder Boys earned a 21-14 home win in 1999. VSU leads the series 5-0 in Valdosta and they lead the all-time series, 2-1 in Russellville.

**TECH IN HOME GSC GAMES:** Since joining the GSC in 1995, Tech is 30-13 all-time at home in GSC games and has won 11 of its last 13 at home in league play, with the only losses coming in the 2005 finale to Central Arkansas and last season to Delta State. Last season, Tech was 3-1 at home in league play and is 22-8 at home in GSC play since 2000.

**LAST GAME vs. VALDOSTA STATE:** In its last game against Valdosta State on Sept. 23, 2006, Tech struggled in punt coverage throughout the game, especially in the first half when the Blazers returned four punts for 108 yards, which set up two of VSU's six scores and then used a block of a junior **Nick McCaskill's** (Camden, Ark.) punt to add another touchdown. In the first half, VSU scored on six of its nine possessions and finished the afternoon with seven punt returns for 202 yards. Trailing 37-0, Tech did get on the scoreboard midway through the third quarter as senior defensive tackle **Andrew Murphy** (Booneville, Miss.) picked off a **Willie Copeland** pass and returned it 42 yards for a touchdown and then in the fourth quarter, the Wonder

Boys offense recorded a score after beginning a drive on a fumble recovery by Murphy on VSU's 40-yard line. Five plays later, junior quarterback **Cole Barthel** (Decatur, Ala.) connected with junior receiver **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) on a 29-yard pass. Stiger caught six passes for 65 yards and returned six kickoffs for 128 yards in the loss, while Barthel finished the game 11-for-28 through the air for 113 yards and two interceptions. Meanwhile, VSU's offense gained 494 yards in total offense, including passing for 300 yards (31-for-41) and rushing 35 times for 194 yards. Copeland finished the day 29-for-38 through the air for 285 yards with four touchdowns and two interceptions, while sophomore receiver **Cedric Jones** caught seven passes for 105 yards.

**ABOUT THE VALDOSTA STATE BRAVES:** Valdosta State enters its GSC opener with Tech sporting a 2-0 overall record and a No. 4 national ranking in the latest AFCA D-II Top 25 Coaches' Poll. The Blazers, who are coached by first-year head coach **David Dean**, enter the game having allowed just three points to its first two opponents and in its last game on Sept. 8, collected a 69-0 win at Fort Valley State. VSU opened the 2007 season with a 41-3 win at home on Sept. 1 over then-21st-ranked Albany State. The Blazers, who return 22 starters and 50 lettermen from last season's 8-2 squad that missed qualifying for the NCAA D-II Playoffs, are averaging a GSC-lead-

ing 55 points per game and are averaging 448 yards per game in total offense through two games and are allowing just 216 yards per game to its opponents. Leading the way for the Blazers offense is senior quarterback **Willie Copeland**. Copeland is 38-for-57 passing on the season with one interception and five touchdowns and is completing nearly 67 percent of his passes and is averaging 244 yards in total offense. In addition to Copeland, senior running back **Michael Terry** is averaging 58.5 rushing yards per game and has carried the ball 15 times for 117 yards and is averaging 7.8 yards per carry, while sophomore **Cedric Jones** and senior **Jeffrey Felton** are Copeland's leading pass receiving targets. Jones has caught 13 passes for 181 yards (13.9 yards/reception) and two touchdowns, while Felton has caught six passes for 86 yards (14.3 yards/reception) and scored one touchdown. On defense, the Blazers have been outstanding so far this season as they have recorded 16 tackles for loss, six quarterback sacks, five interceptions and have forced two fumbles and blocked two kicks. Leading the way for the Blazers defense is senior linebacker **Michael Cullen**, junior free safety **Sherard Reynolds**, freshman linebacker **Larry Dean**, senior linebacker **William Montford** and senior defensive end **Travis Harrison**. On the season, Cullen has recorded 15 total tackles, two tackles for six yards in loss

es, while Reynolds has been in on 14 total tackles, has an interception and has broken up a team-best five passes and Dean has collected 14 total tackles, one tackle for three yards in loss and has blocked a kick. Montford has recorded 13 total tackles, one quarterback sack and Harrison has collected 10 total tackles, three tackles for 10 yards in losses and 2.5 quarterback sacks for 12 yards. In addition, senior cornerback **Maurice Leggett** has picked two passes for 55 yards, including scoring a touchdown off an interception against Fort Valley State.

**ON THIS DATE:** Tech has played just eight previous football games on Sept. 22 and Saturday's contest with Valdosta State is the first game on Sept. 22 since Tech played in Alva, Okla., against Northwestern Oklahoma in 1990. The other eight times Tech has played on Sept. 22 was in 1941, 1950, 1955, 1956, 1962, 1973 and 1984. Tech is 5-3 all-time on Sept. 22 and has won three of its last four games played on this date. Saturday's contest with Valdosta State marks the sixth home game on Sept. 22 and first since facing East Central Oklahoma in 1984.

**TECH RECORDS 500TH ALL-TIME WIN:** In its win last season on Oct. 27, 2006, at Southern Arkansas, the Wonder Boys made history as they became just the 11th NCAA Division II program to win 500 football games all-time. Since beginning football in 1911, Tech has compiled a 504-316-41 all-time record and is the 11th all-time winningest D-II football program. In addition, Tech is just the second football program in the state of Arkansas to record at least 500 all-time wins, as the Arkansas Razorbacks have won 638 games in 114 seasons of competition.

**TECH IN THE NATIONAL POLLS:** Tech enters this week's contest unranked in all three of the major Division II national polls. The Wonder Boys, who received five votes in the AFCA D-II Coaches Preseason poll, received no votes in this week's third poll. In addition, Tech was unranked once again this week in the D2Football.com Top 25 poll and is ranked 26th for the second straight week in *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* Top 40 Poll.

Tech has recorded 504 wins all-time entering Saturday's GSC home opener and the Wonder Boys are one of 12 schools to win at least 495 all-time games. Tech enters Saturday's GSC home opener with a 504-317-41 all-time record, winning nearly 61 percent of their 861 games.

Pittsburg [KS] State headlines the list of all-time winningest programs with 617 wins, while Tuskegee [AL] is second all-time with 589 wins. North Dakota is third with 583 wins, while Central Oklahoma is fourth with 576 and Hillsdale [MI] is fifth in wins all-time with 557. Texas A&M-Kingsville is sixth all-time with 548 wins, Carson-Newman is seventh with 524 wins and Truman [Mo.] State is eighth with 516 all-time wins. Northern State is ninth with 510 all-time victories, while West Chester is 10th with 506 wins and Virginia Union is 12th with 496 wins.

**TECH RANKS 21ST IN PRE-SEASON LINDY'S MAGAZINE DIVISION II POLL:** *Lindy's* Annual Preseason Football Magazine has high hopes for the Wonder Boys this season as the publication ranked Tech 21st in the its preseason Division II poll. Tech was one of five GSC squads ranked in the D-II poll. Delta State headlines the contingent

of GSC teams ranked as the Statesmen are ranked seventh, while Valdosta State is ranked eighth, North Alabama checks in at No. 16 and Henderson State is ranked 23rd in the poll. Two-time defending NCAA D-II national champions Grand Valley State sits atop the D-II poll, while NW Missouri State is ranked second and Chadron State is No. 3. North Dakota and Bloomsburg [PA] round out the Top 5 at No. 4 and No. 5 respectively. The Wonder Boys face all four of the GSC ranked teams in the *Lindy's* poll on four successive weeks and they open the season tonight at No. 2 ranked Northwest Missouri State. In addition to ranking the Top 25 D-II teams, *Lindy's* also compiled a list of key D-II games this season and Tech's game on Oct. 6 at Delta State is one of those 25 key D-II games. Other key GSC games listed are Henderson State at Delta State on Sept. 15, Delta State at Valdosta State on Oct. 11 and North Alabama at Valdosta State on Oct. 27.

**RECAP OF WEST GEORGIA GAME:** Arkansas Tech opened up Gulf South Conference play last Saturday, Sept. 15 at Grisham Stadium in Carrollton, Ga., by posting a 52-34 victory over West Georgia.

ing to last season, used a record-setting performance by junior quarterback **Cole Barthel** to win its fifth consecutive league opener and improve to 8-5 all-time in GSC openers. On the night, Barthel accounted for seven touchdowns, including passing for a school-record six touchdowns and running 39 yards late in the third quarter for another score.

It was the first time in Tech's 93-year history of intercollegiate football that a quarterback has thrown six touchdown passes in a game. In addition, it was the 12th time in GSC history that a quarterback has tossed six touchdowns in a game. Last season, Barthel tossed five touchdown passes in Tech's 55-35 win over Ouachita Baptist on Oct. 21, which was the school's previous record.

Barthel's record setting touchdown pass was a 10-yarder to junior receiver **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) with 7:54 remaining in the game. On the night, Barthel threw touchdown passes to five different receivers and was 29-for-42 through the air for 310 yards.

**STEVE MULLINS - HEAD COACH / ATHLETIC DIRECTOR**

Steve Mullins is now his 11th season at the helm of the Wonder Boys. He enters Saturday's game with an overall record of 69-41 (.627) and a Gulf South Conference record of 57-32 (.640).

Since joining the sidelines as Tech's head coach in 1997, Mullins has brought the Wonder Boys into the upper echelon of the toughest NCAA Division II football conference in the country. He has led Tech to one Gulf South Championship (1999) and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory (2004).

Mullins enters the 2007 season as the second winningest active coach in terms of wins in the GSC and is the third winningest coach in Arkansas Tech's 93-year history of football.

Last season, Mullins led Tech to a 7-3 overall record and a 5-3 mark in the GSC. The seven wins was Mullins' sixth season of winning at least seven games with the Wonder Boys.

In 2004, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to the school's fourth-ever 10-win season and first since 1971 and led the squad to the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the second time in five seasons. In addition, Tech won its first ever playoff game at the Division II level and set the school record for total offense (4,949 yards).

For the season, Tech finished the season with a 10-2 record and an 8-1 mark in the Gulf South Conference, which led Mullins to be named the GSC and AFCA Division II Region Coach of the Year.

In his first two seasons at Tech, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to records of 4-7 in 1997 and 5-5 in 1998 before breaking through in 1999 with a 9-3 record and the school's first GSC Championship, which earned Mullins the league's Coach of the Year honor. The 1999 team featured three All-Americans and seven All-GSC selections.

Following the 1999 season, Mullins led Tech to records of 7-3 in 2000, including a 24-10 win over eventual national champion Delta State and 8-2 in 2001.

Since coming to Tech, Mullins' impact can't just be measured in mere wins and losses. In the past nine years, 38 Wonder Boys have been selected to the GSC All-Academic Team and 115 football players have qualified for the GSC Academic Honor Roll. In addition, 14 Wonder Boys have been named CoSIDA Academic All-District VI and four Tech players have received CoSIDA Academic All-American honors.

Along with that, five different Tech football players have been named to the GSC 'Top 10' Student-Athlete list and two Wonder Boys have received the GSC's Commissioner's Cup as the top male student-athlete in the league.

After six successful years at the helm of the football program, Mullins added the title of athletic director to his duties on April 16, 2003. In that capacity, he oversees the day-to-day operations of the athletic department and the school's 10 sport program.

Mullins began his Tech career in 1997 after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I-AA Northwestern State in Natchitoches, La.

Prior to Northwestern State, Mullins, the Camden, Ark., native, served for two seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State, two seasons as an assistant at Southwestern Oklahoma State and four years as an assistant coach at Lamar University.

The former University of Arkansas-Monticello defensive tackle began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Central Arkansas in 1981. As a player at UAM, Mullins was a three-time All-Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference selection, a three-time All-NAIA District 17 selection, a two-time NAIA All-American, an Associated Press Small College All-American as a senior in 1979 and is a member of the UAM Athletic Hall of Fame.

Mullins, who graduated from Camden [Ark.] High School in 1976, is married to the former Elizabeth (Liz) Morgan of Groves, Texas. The couple have three children, Katie (19), a sophomore at Tech, Hunter (16) and Mason (12).



"I was pleased with Cole's performance tonight," Tech Head Football Coach **Steve Mullins** said. "I was more impressed by his 39-yard touchdown run than any of this touchdown passes."

Barthel had tied the school's single-game touchdown pass record of five with a 7-yard score to senior receiver **Justin McCutcheon** (Harrison, Ark.) just 37 seconds into the fourth quarter.

The Wonder Boys finished the game gaining 441 yards of total offense, its highest total on the season. In addition to passing for 310 yards, Tech rushed 29 times for 131 yards, with Barthel leading the way with 48 yards on two carries. Meanwhile, UWG gained 381 yards for the game, but were penalized 10 times for 115 yards.

"I was pleased our performance tonight, but we have to improve our consistency in our kicking game and our tackling if we expect to compete with Valdosta State," Mullins said.

For the game, Tech missed two extra-point attempts, had a punt blocked and allowed 192 yards in kick returns, including 178 yards on nine kickoff returns.

Tech opened the game's scoring with a 14-yard pass from Barthel to senior receiver **Chris Gunter** (Beebe, Ark.) just two minutes into the game, but the point-after by sophomore kicker **Travis Cockerham** (Bryant, Ark.) was missed. Following a 32-yard field goal by UWG kicker Jared Guberman, which dropped Tech's lead to 6-3, Barthel connected with junior receiver **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.)

with 4:01 remaining in the first quarter to push the Wonder Boys in front 12-3.

Gunter led all Tech receivers with six catches for 96 yards, while Stiger caught a team-leading seven passes for 51 yards in the win.

UWG (1-2 overall, 0-1 GSC) pulled within 12-10 just four seconds into the second quarter on a 12-yard pass from Keats Baldwin to Steve Billue. The Wolves took its first lead, 17-12, five minutes later as James Kennebrew scored on a 1-yard plunge. The Wonder Boys closed the first half by scoring on two straight possessions, a 2-yard run by senior running back **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.) and with 4:36 remaining and a 10-yard pass from Barthel to Stiger with 20 seconds left.

UWG opened the scoring in the second half on a 10-yard pass completion from Baldwin to Joey Harris just a little over three minutes into the third quarter. Following UWG's score, Tech used a 19-yard pass from Barthel to sophomore receiver **Rolaundo Wright** (Sulphur Springs, Texas) with 10:05 left in the third quarter. The Wolves pulled within 31-27 with 4:14 left in the third quarter on a 27-yard field goal by Jared Guberman four plays after Tech redshirt freshman running back **Scharvundrick Franklin** (Dumas, Ark.) fumbled the ball on the 8-yard line.

Following Guberman's field goal, Tech drove 65 yards in six plays and moved in front 38-27 on Barthel's 39-yard run. Barthel's run was Tech's longest rushing play of the season and the longest run of his Tech career.

Tech sealed the win in the opening minute of the fourth quarter as Barthel connected with McCutcheon for a 7-yard touchdown. McCutcheon's score came four plays after Tech's defense stopped UWG on fourth down at their

own 32-yard line.

"Our defense stiffened up when it had too," said the 11th-year Tech coach, who moved into a tie for fifth place on the all-time GSC coaching wins list with 69 thanks to Saturday's victory. Mullins has compiled a 69-41 all-time record in his career at Tech and is the school's third all-time winningest behind **John Tucker** (77 victories) and **E.O. Brown** (79 victories).

UWG closed out the game's scoring with 19 seconds left in the game on a 2-yard pass from Justin

Baldwin paced the Wolves offense as he was 22-for-36 through the air for 219 yards. Kennebrew gained 58 yards on 17 carries and Jimmy Howard caught five passes for 74 yards and returned three kickoffs for 81 yards.

**NCAA ANNOUNCES DECISION IN NORTHWEST MISSOURI STATE GAME:**

On Tuesday, Sept. 4, the NCAA announced that the result of its Aug. 23 game at Northwest Missouri State, which was limited to less than a quarter due to severe lightning and storms, was decided on a conference call on Friday, August 31 between the NCAA and the institutions. It was agreed on this call, which was coordinated by the NCAA, that the game was terminated and, therefore, neither school will be credited with a win or a loss. Play was terminated with two minutes and 30 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

NCAA statistics policies for football require at least three quarters of competition for inclusion, which was part of the rationale in making the decision. Input from both institutions and conferences, as well as the NCAA Football Rules Committee and NCAA Division II Football Committee were considered during the conference call.

**OPENING THE SEASON AGAINST NORTHWEST MISSOURI NOT ALL BAD:**

Opening a season against Northwest Missouri State is not all bad as the last time Tech faced the Bearcats, in the 1999 opener, the Wonder Boys went on to finish the season with a 9-3 record and won their only GSC Football title and also earned the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff appearance. Following its 31-14 loss to the Bearcats that season, Tech won nine of its next 10 regular season

games, including going 8-1 in GSC play to become the first Arkansas school to win a GSC football title. During league play, Tech collected home wins over both North Alabama (24-21) and Valdosta State (21-14), but suffered its only league loss at Delta State (17-10). The Wonder Boys ended the season by falling 40-28 at Carson-Newman in the first round of the D-II Playoffs.

**WONDER BOYS IN SEPTEMBER:**

Saturday's game marks the Wonder Boys' 202nd game all-time in in the month of September. Tech is 106-89-6 all-time in games during the month, including winning 12 of its last 14 games in the month, with both of the losses coming last season. Mullins is 29-12 all-time in the month of September as Tech's head coach.

**PRESEASON GSC POLL TABS TECH SIXTH:**

Tech was tabbed to finish sixth in the pre-season Gulf South Conference Coaches Poll, which was released on July 31. Tech received 55 points in the poll that was voted on by the league's head coaches and the coaches couldn't vote for their own teams. In the poll, Tech received three votes for fourth, two votes each for fifth and sixth place and three votes for seventh. Defending GSC champion North Alabama was tabbed as the preseason favorite for the second consecutive sea-

son as the Lions garnered 95 points and six of a possible 11 first-place votes. Valdosta State was picked second as they received 89 points and three first-place votes, while Delta State was tabbed third as the Statesmen received 84 points and a first place vote. Henderson State was picked fourth as they earned 75 points and the final first place vote, while Harding was tabbed to finish one spot in front of Tech as the Bisons earned 56 points. Behind Tech in the poll was West Alabama (54 points), Southern Arkansas (33 points), West Georgia (30 points), Ouachita Baptist (19 points) and Arkansas-Monticello (15 points).

**MULLINS TIED FOR FIFTH ON GSC CAREER COACHING WINS LIST:** Mullins, who is in his 11th season at Tech, stands tied for fifth with former Jacksonville State coach **Bill Burgess** (1985-92) all-time on the GSC career coaching victories list with 69. Former Mississippi College coach **John M. Williams** (1972-90) headlines the list with 124 wins, while former North Alabama head coach (1988-97) and current West Alabama coach **Bobby Wallace** is second on the list with 90 wins and former North Alabama coach **Wayne Grubb** (1977-87) is third with 82 all-time victories. Former Valdosta State coach **Chris Hatcher** is fourth with 76 wins, while former Delta State and Troy State coach **Rick Rhoades** (1985-87 and 2002-06) stands seventh on the list with 62 wins, while current Ouachita Baptist coach **Todd Knight** is eighth with 55 wins and former Jacksonville State coach **Jim Fuller** (1977-83) is ninth with 54 wins.

**TECH THIRD WINNINGEST GSC TEAM SINCE 1999:** Since 1999, Tech is the third winningest team in the GSC with 60 overall wins in 89 games and is also third in GSC wins with 49 over that same span. Valdosta State is the winningest team in the league since 2000 with 82 overall wins in 101 games and has recorded 59 GSC victories, while Delta State is second with 66 overall wins in 94 games and is second in GSC wins with 51.

In addition to being the third winningest team overall in the GSC since 1999, Tech is also the winningest football program at any level in the state of Arkansas over that same span with 60 wins. NCAA Division I Arkansas is second on the list with 59 wins, while Central Arkansas is third with 57 wins and SAU is fourth with 49 wins. Harding is fifth with 46 wins and is followed by Arkansas-Pine Bluff in sixth place with 40 wins, NCAA Division I-A Arkansas State is seventh with 34 victories and UAM is eighth with 31 wins. Henderson State and Ouachita Baptist are tied for ninth with 27 wins.

**VANHOOK NAMED PRESEASON ALL-GSC SELECTION:** After earning First-Team All-GSC honors last season after rushing for 507 yards and scoring six touchdowns, senior tailback **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.) enters his senior campaign as Tech's lone preseason All-GSC selection. Vanhook, who is 818 yards shy of becoming the fourth Wonder Boy to surpass the 3,000-yard career rushing plateau, was one of two running backs named to the preseason offensive team and one of 15 returning First-Team All-GSC selections from last season. In addition to naming Vanhook a member of the Preseason All-GSC Team, junior offensive tackle **Jeremy Ashcraft** (Marshall, Texas), a transfer from East Texas Baptist University, was named to the league's Top Newcomers List. Ashcraft transferred to Tech before the beginning of the 2007 spring semester.

**VANHOOK CLIMBING UP SCHOOL'S CAREER RUSHING CHART:** Senior running back **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.) enters his final season at Tech just 803 yards shy of becoming just the fourth Wonder Boy to

surpass the 3,000-yard rushing plateau. In his career, he has gained 2,197 yards (4.9 yards/carry) and has scored 24 total touchdowns, including 22 career rushing touchdowns. With is 24 touchdowns, Vanhook stands 13th on the school's career scoring chart with 146 points. In Tech's 55-35 win last season at Ouachita Baptist, Vanhook gained 50 yards on the ground and became just the 11th player in Tech history to gain at least 2,000 rushing yards. Last season, he gained 507 yards (5.1 yards/carry) on the ground and scored six touchdowns. Vanhook's best season as a Wonder Boy came in as a redshirt freshman in 2004 when he gained 1,089 yards (5.7 yards/carry) and scored 11 rushing touchdowns in helping Tech compile a 10-2 record.

**PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN:** Tech had one player named a 2006 Preseason All-American by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* - senior defensive tackle **Andrew Murphy**.

As a junior in 2006, Murphy, who was named a Third-Team *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-

Southeast Region selection, ranked sixth in the final NCAA D-II national football statistics in forced fumbles (0.4 per game) and recorded 38 total tackles, including 18 solo stops, 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 quarterback sacks. In addition, he forced four fumbles, had three fumble recoveries and an interception, which was returned 42 yards for a touchdown against Valdosta State, which led to Murphy being named the GSC's Defensive Player of the Week.

Murphy, a native of Booneville, Miss., and a transfer from NE Mississippi Community College, was one of 20 GSC players named to the Preseason *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-American team.

This season's All-American team featured 154 players and was comprised of 86 seniors, 50 juniors and 18 sophomores from all four geographic regions of NCAA Division II.

**QUINCY SKINNER NAMED TECH'S 28TH ALL-AMERICAN IN 2006:**

In his only season at Tech, cornerback **Quincy Skinner** (Coral Springs, Fla.) made quite an impression as the Florida Atlantic transfer became the school's 28th different Wonder Boy to earn All-American status and the 12th Wonder Boy to earn All-American recognition under Mullins. Skinner, who was a Second-Team All-GSC selection, finished last season ranked fifth nationally in Division II in interceptions (0.8 per game) and recorded 63 tackles, including a team-best

43 solo stops and had 2.5 tackles for loss, five pass break-ups, one fumble recovery, one forced fumble and defended 1.3 passes per game, which was 20th in the final D-II national statistics. Skinner became the third Wonder Boy to earn AFCA D-II Coaches' First-Team All-American honors and was the fifth-ever Tech player to be named an AP Little All-American as he was a third-team selection and also earned Third-Team *Don Hansen*



Football Gazette All-Southeast Region honors.

**CURSH MAKES RETURN TO FIELD:** Tech's defense has already been bolstered this year by the return of the 2004 GSC Defensive Player of the Year, junior linebacker **Cedric Cursh** (Foreman, Ark.). Cursh, who sat out the past two seasons to deal with some off-the-field legal issues, is a welcomed addition to a defense that returned just six starters from a year ago. As a sophomore in 2004, Cursh, who was also named an AP Little All-American, recorded 95 total tackles, including 21 tackles for loss, nine quarterback sacks, five forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and one interception as he helped lead the Wonder Boys to a 10-2 record and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victo-

ry. In the NCAA Playoff victory against Catawba, Cursh finished with 10 tackles, including five solo stops and had two tackles for losses of nine yards, one sack, one forced fumble and recovered two fumbles enroute to earning National Defensive Player of the Week honors from *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*. His forced fumble and subsequent fumble recovery at Tech's 47-yard line with 38 seconds remaining in the game sealed Tech's 24-20 win over Catawba. Cursh enters Saturday's Valdosta State game with 10 career sacks, which is 14th on the school's career list and has recorded 197 career tackles, including 107 solo stops and has had 30 tackles for losses of 144 yards.

**TECH COACHES NAME MVP'S FROM WEST GEORGIA GAME:** The Tech coaching staff named its MVP's from the West Georgia game this past Sunday.

The Offensive MVP honor went to junior quarterback **Cole Barthel**. It was the second time this season the coaches named Barthel as the Offensive MVP as he was selected following the Northeastern State game. In last Saturday's win over UWG, Barthel graded out at 77 percent, according to Tech Head Coach **Steve Mullins**. Against the Wolves, Barthel accounted for seven touchdowns, including passing for a single-game school record of six touchdowns in Tech's 18-point victory. In the game, Barthel was 29-for-42 through the air for 310 yards with six touchdowns, to five different receivers and had no interceptions and also carried the ball two times for 48 yards, including scoring on a 39-yard run late in the third quarter to give the Wonder Boys a 38-27 lead. With his six touchdown passes, Barthel becomes the 12th player in GSC history and the first Tech player in its 93-year history of intercollegiate football to accomplish that feat.

On defense, the coaches awarded junior defensive back **Delvin Ellis** (Memphis, Tenn.) as its MVP. Mullins said that Ellis graded out at 87 percent against the Wolves after recording nine total tackles, one

High School, while McCrotty, a graduate of Russellville High School, was drafted in the 23rd round (692nd overall) by the Florida Marlins after a stellar pitching career with the Arkansas Razorbacks.

tackle for loss and a pass break-up in Tech's victory.

The Special Team MVP honor went to junior receiver/return specialist **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.). In the win over the Wolves, Stiger returned a total of six kicks for 130 yards, including returning the game's opening kickoff 42 yards to set up Tech's first scoring drive. For the game, Stiger returned three punts for 57 yards, including a 35-yard return late in the first quarter to set up Tech's second touchdown drive and returned three kickoffs for 73 yards.

**SCORING STREAKS:** Tech enters Saturday's GSC opener having scored in 34 straight games since being shutout 30-0 by Valdosta State in the next to last game of the 2003 season. In fact, since Mullins took over the program in 1997, Tech has failed to score in a game only twice and has scored in 123 of its last 125 games.

Meanwhile, Tech's opponents have scored in 47 consecutive games, including 12 of its last 22 opponents scoring 30-plus points, since the Wonder Boys held West Alabama scoreless on Nov. 2, 2002. In the last eight years, Tech has held only one opponent scoreless and has held 10 opponents under 10 points, including one opponent so far this season.

**HALFTIME LEAD EQUALS WINS:** Since Mullins took over the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, the Wonder Boys have been known as a second-half team as they are 53-2 when leading at halftime, including being 2-0 this season. In addition, the Wonder Boys are 58-2 when leading heading into the fourth quarter and are 4-1 in overtime during Mullins' tenure.

**BARTHEL EARNS SECOND GSC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR:** On Monday, Sept. 17, Cole Barthel was named the GSC's Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season and third time in his Tech career as he was also honored this season on Sept. 3 following the Northeastern State game and was also honored following the Ouachita Baptist game on Oct. 23, 2006. Barthel's earns this week's honor after his record-setting performance in Tech's GSC opener against West Georgia last Saturday. Against UWG, Barthel accounted for seven touchdowns, including throwing for a Tech single-game school record six touchdowns in Tech's 52-34 win over the Wolves in Carrollton, Ga. With the six touchdown passes, Barthel became the 12th player in GSC history and also became the first Tech quarterback in the school's 93

year history to accomplish that feat. For the game, Barthel was 29-for-42 through the air for 310 yards and also carried the ball two times for 48 yards, including scoring on a 39-yard run in the third quarter to give Tech a 38-27 lead. He threw touchdown passes to five different receivers in the game as junior **Tracey Stiger** caught two touchdown passes from Barthel.

**BARTHEL HONORED AS NATIONAL OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:** In addition to earning GSC Offensive Player of the Week honors this week, Barthel was also honored as the co-National Offensive Player of the Week by D2Football.com on Tuesday and as a D-II National Offensive Player of the Week by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* following his record-setting performance last Saturday at West Georgia. Barthel shared this week's offensive honor on D2Football.com with North Dakota running back **Ryan Chappell** and shared offensive honors with Chappell and Assumption running back **Herbert Woodard** in *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*. It was first National Player of the Week for Barthel since *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* honored him on Oct. 23, 2006, after the Ouachita Baptist game.

10, redshirt junior **Michael Podobnik** was named the GSC's Special Teams Player of the Week after booting four punts for 178 yards and a 44.5 yard average in last Saturday's 21-6 win over Texas College. Against the Steers, Podobnik had a 56-yard punt and had one touchback in the game. He becomes the second consecutive Wonder Boy honored by the league this season after **Cole Barthel** took home the league's offensive honor the previous week. On the season, Podobnik has punted 10 times for 481 yards and is averaging 48.1 yards per punt, including recording a 75-yard punt against Northeastern State. He has had four touchbacks and has downed one punt inside the 20-yard line.

**WONDER BOYS WELCOME NEW COORDINATORS THIS SEASON:** For the first time since 2004, Tech enters a season with both a new offensive and defensive coordinator. During the offseason, Mullins promoted **Benyard Jones** to defensive coordinator and brought in 18-year coaching veteran **Scott Preston** as the offensive coordinator. Jones, who is in his second tour of duty at Tech after spending five seasons from 1999-2004 at Tech as an assistant and then returning last season as the defensive line coach after spending the 2005 season as the defensive coordinator at Butler University, an NCAA Division I-AA member. Meanwhile, Preston brings a wealth of experience to Tech as he spent four seasons (2000-03) as the offensive coordinator, quarterback, running back and receivers coach at Illinois State University. In addition to Illinois State, Preston also had stints at Murray State University, Ventura [CA] College, Georgia Military College, San Francisco State and began his collegiate coaching career working with Hal Mumme at Valdosta State University.

**TECH STRONG AT PROTECTING THE BALL IN 2006:** Tech closed out the 2006 season ranked 28th in NCAA D-II Football in turnover margin as the Wonder Boys had a +0.6 margin for its 10 games. On the season, Tech's offense committed 22 turnovers as they had 11 interceptions and lost 11 fumbles, while its defense forced 14 fumbles and picked off 14 passes on the season. Tech was tied for the second in the GSC in turnover margin with Delta State. North Alabama led the league with a +0.7 margin as they committed 16 turnovers and forced 24 turnovers. So far this season, Tech has struggled taking care of the ball as they have 13 total turnovers, including 12 fumbles (losing six of the them), while their opponents have had nine fumbles (lost three of them) and have thrown three interceptions.

**WONDER BOYS STRONG IN THE RED ZONE:** Through three games this season, Tech is a perfect 10-for-10 in putting points on the scoreboard inside the red zone. On the season, the Wonder Boys have scored 10 touchdowns when they get inside the red zone (within 20 yards of the end zone), including scoring seven times in seven tries in last Saturday's win at West Georgia. Last season, Tech was 28-for-35 (80 percent) in scoring

chances inside the red zone as they scored 24 touchdowns and had four field goals.

**35 POINTS IS THE MAGIC NUMBER:** Since taking the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, Coach Mullins' Tech teams are 25-2 all-time in games in which they score 35 or more points in a single game. In fact, Tech is 32-10 when it scores between 21-34 points during the Mullins era, including being 1-0 this season. Tech has won 23 straight games when scoring at least 35 or more points and hasn't lost since falling 53-36 to UCA in 1997 when scoring 35 or more points.

**NOEL RACKING UP THE TACKLES:** Senior linebacker **Zach Noel** (Paragould, Ark.) continues to climb up the school's career tackle charts. Noel enters Saturday's home GSC opener having recorded 171 total tackles, including 84 solo stops. In addition, he has had 7.5 tackles for 23 yards in losses and has picked off two passes, including one for a touchdown. In last Saturday's win over West Georgia, Noel had four total tackles, including one solo stop and a one-half tackle for a 1-yard loss.

**BARTHEL IS AN ACE IN TWO SPORTS:** Sophomore **Cole Barthel**, who is in his second season at Tech after transferring from the University of Arkansas, was a second round draft pick (71st pick overall) in the 2001 Major League Draft by the Atlanta Braves out of high school. Barthel decided to forgo college originally (he signed a National Letter of Intent with the Razorbacks as a quarterback) and played four seasons in the Atlanta

Braves organization as a third baseman, including playing two seasons in Rome, Ga., an A-level minor league affiliate of the Braves. In his four-year minor league career, Barthel hit .251 with five home runs and 36 RBIs. Last season as a freshman with the Razorbacks, Barthel went through spring drills and played in two games before leaving Fayetteville at the end of the first semester and enrolling at Tech. As a high school player, Barthel was

selected as the North Alabama Player of the Year and was one of three finalists for the top back of the year and a finalist for the Class 6A Player of the Year as a senior after throwing for 2,074 yards and 21 touchdowns on 269 passing attempts and also rushing for 700 yards. In addition, he was a three-time All-Area selection and was ranked 69th nationally among high school quarterbacks by Rivals100.com.

**CHILDRESS IS BECOMING TECH'S WORKHORSE ON THE GROUND:** Sophomore running back **Tim Childress** is becoming Tech's workhorse on the ground in his second season of competing for the Wonder Boys. Through three games this season, the Batesville, Ark., native has carried the ball 56 times for 209 yards and is averaging 3.7 yards per carry and 69.7 yards per game overall, which ranks him fifth in the latest GSC statistics. In addition, he has scored one touchdown, a 1-yard run in last Saturday's win over Texas College and has caught six passes for 53 yards (8.8 yds/reception). As a redshirt freshman last season, Childress carried the ball 25 times for 80 yards in 10 games for the Wonder Boys.

**STIGER LOOKING FOR MORE IN 2007:** Junior receiver and return specialist **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) is looking for more success on special teams this coming season. Stiger averaged 20.8 yards on 30 kickoff returns last season, despite missing the final two games of the season due to an injury. The 20.8 average was second in the GSC and helped Stiger earn Second-Team All-GSC honors in 2006. In

addition to his kick returning, Stiger also averaged a team-best 118.6 all-purpose yards, which was fourth in the GSC and 38th nationally in NCAA Division II. On the season, he caught 32 passes for 319 yards (10.0 yards/reception) and scored five touchdowns. Stiger enters Saturday's home GSC opener having gained 2,476 total yards, including catching 53 passes for 486 yards, rushing for 340 yards on 92 carries and has returned 62 kickoffs for 1,309 yards (21.1 yards/return) and has scored 15 career touchdowns.

**NCAA RULES CHANGES FOR 2007 SEASON:** In 2006, the NCAA changed the way it started the clock as it decided to start the game clock when the ball is kicked off, as opposed to previously starting the clock when the ball was touched legally in the field of play. This season, the NCAA has decided to abandon last year's new rule and return to the old clock rule that states, that on a kickoff, the game clock starts when the ball is touched legally in the field of play or crosses the goal line after the receiving team touches it in its end zone. In addition, on a change of possession, the clock will start on the snap of the ball. Other clock rules this season include that during televised games only, charged team timeouts will be one minute rather than 1:30. Another rule change this season is that teams will kickoff from its 30-yard line. Previously, the ball was kicked off from the 35. For fouls by the kick-



ing team on kickoffs and punts (other than kick-catch interference), the receiving team has the option to tack on the penalty where it will subsequently have the ball. The receiving team still may choose to have the down replayed after enforcement of the penalty at the previous spot. A third rule change this season is that no defensive player in an attempt to block, bat or catch a kick may be picked up, elevated, propelled or pushed by a teammate. This is an addition to an existing rule, with "elevated, propelled or pushed" added a new language.

**HISTORY MADE IN 2004:** Tech Football made history in 2004 as the Wonder Boys won its first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff game with its 24-20 victory at Buerkle Field over Catawba. In addition, Tech was the first-ever team from the state of Arkansas to host an NCAA Division II playoff game and they also was the first team from Arkansas to ever win an NCAA Division II playoff contest. The Wonder Boys, who finished with

a 10-2 overall record in 2004, ended the season with its 42-24 loss at Albany State in the second round of the NCAA Playoffs. Prior to Tech's postseason win over Catawba, the Wonder Boys last postseason win came in 1971 against Northern State in the semifinals of the NAIA National Playoffs.

**TECH UNVEILS NEW HELMETS, COLOR SCHEME THIS SEASON:** During the offseason, Tech changed the color schemes for the school. Tech has switched from its traditional Green and Old Gold color to a Green (PMS 343) and Gold (PMS 116) scheme. The gold color is similar to the Green Bay Packers yellow that is worn on its helmets. With the change in colors, the Wonder Boys had to change its helmets this season from gold to yellow. In addition, they have added new uniforms for both home and away games this season.

**TECH FINISHES 2006 RANKED 26TH IN HOME ATTENDANCE:** Despite playing all five of its home games last season at Russellville's Cyclone Stadium, Tech finished the year ranked 26th amongst 143 NCAA Division II teams in home attendance as the Wonder Boys averaged 5,467 for its five games at Cyclone Stadium. On the season, Tech had 27,336 fans attend their home contests. Fort Valley State led all of D-II in attendance with an average of 13,682 per game, while Tuskegee was second with an average of 11,195. UNA was the first GSC team ranked as they finished fourth with an average of 10,091 per game, while Delta State was 21st with an average of 6,030 per game and West Alabama was 22nd as they averaged 5,783 per game last season.

**GSC RETURNS TO TELEVISION ONCE AGAIN IN 2007:** For the third consecutive year, the GSC returns to live television this season.

This season's "GSC-TV Live" schedule features eight Thursday night contests, all of which will kick off at 7 p.m. CST and Tech's game with VSU, which will be aired on Saturday, Aug. 22 and will kickoff at 3 p.m. CST.

CSS will continue as the primary carrier for the "GSC-TV Live" games once again this season, bringing more than 5 million potential households, while Cox Sports (which is on channel 119 in Russellville) adds its 1.7 million customers to the mix for the second straight season. In addition, the GSC will also make the broadcasts available to other cable systems and open-air channels in non-conflicting areas, but the games will not be available on DirectTV or DishNetwork.

This year's "GSC-TV Live" package begins on Sept. 13 as defending GSC champion North Alabama plays at

Harding. The next broadcast is scheduled for Sept. 20 when West Alabama plays at Henderson State and is followed by Tech's home league opener against VSU on Sept. 22. Southern Arkansas' game at Delta State rounds out the first month of the schedule on Sept. 27.

In October, West Georgia's game at Henderson State on Oct. 4 opens up the coverage, followed by Delta State's game on Oct. 11 at Valdosta State. Following the VSU-DSU game, North Alabama's home game with Delta State will be aired on Oct. 18 and Arkansas-Monticello's game at West Alabama on Oct. 25 closes out the month.

The final two live television broadcasts are slated for Nov. 1 when Henderson State plays at Ouachita Baptist in its annual "Battle of the Ravine" match-up and the schedule concludes on Nov. 8 with West Georgia's game at Valdosta State.

**TECH SCHEDULED FOR ONE GSC-LIVE TV GAME:** As part of the "GSC-TV Live" Game of the Week Television package, Tech will have one its games broadcast on live television this season.

The Tech game selected for live television broadcast on the "GSC-TV Live" Game of the Week is this week's Valdosta State in Russellville at 3:05 p.m. All of this year's broadcasts can be seen locally in the Russellville area on SuddenLink Digital Cable Channel 119 and also on SuddenLink Channel 2.

**FORMER WONDER BOY JASON CAMPBELL SOARS IN FIRST SEASON OF ARENA FOOTBALL:** Jason Campbell knows how to make a good first impression.

During his first season as a quarterback at Tech in 2004, Campbell threw for a school-record 2,922 yards and led the Wonder Boys to the second round of the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

Now, nearly three years later, Campbell has made a similar splash in the world of Arena Football while starting at quarterback for the 2007 Everett [Wash.] Hawks in his first season as a professional.

Campbell established new Everett franchise records for touchdown passes in a season (84) and passing yards in a season (3,663). In addition, he completed more than 60 percent of his passes during 2007 and ranked among the top 10 quarterbacks in AF2 (a developmental league under the Arena Football League umbrella) in passing efficiency.

And Campbell accomplished all of this despite the fact that he did not start until the fifth game of the season.

"It was rough at first because in Arena Football you have to get rid of the ball so fast," said Campbell. "I was in the shotgun most of the time at Arkansas Tech."

After seeing time as a back-up quarterback in Everett's first four games, he got his first start in week five. Campbell took advantage of the opportunity, throwing for 218 yards and five touchdowns to help the Hawks to their first win of the season.

Campbell went on to lead Everett to five more victories, including a three-game winning streak during the final month of the season. The Hawks finished their sea-

son on July 28 with a record of 6-10.

Victories were the norm when Campbell was at Tech. During his two years as the Wonder Boys' starting quarterback (2004-05), Tech accumulated an overall record of 17-5, including a 14-4 mark in GSC games. He completed his two-year Tech career with 5,100 yards of total offense (2nd-most in school history) and 5,079 passing yards (2nd-most in school history).

**WHAT IS A WONDERBOY, YOU ASK??** Here is the story and history of the Wonder Boys. In 1919, Arkansas Tech's football team upset the highly-favored Jonesboro Aggies (now known as Arkansas State University) 14-0 behind a pair of 70-yard punt returns for touchdowns and two point-afters by a 17-year old quarterback by the name of **John Tucker**. The Jonesboro team had staked a claim to the mythical state football championship prior to the game.

**Henry Loesch**, the sports editor of the *Arkansas Gazette* in Little Rock, covered the game and coined the name "Wonder Boys" in complimenting the Tech team, then known as the Aggies, in his postgame story.

Tech's men's athletic teams have been known as the Wonder Boys ever since, and Tucker was thereafter labeled as "The Original Wonder Boy." Tucker went on to complete his education at the University of Alabama, but returned to Arkansas Tech and served in several capacities, including head football coach, athletics director and chemistry professor from 1925-72.

**GREEN AND GOLD LUNCHEONS:** The first of three Green and Gold Club Luncheons for 2007 was held on Monday, Aug. 20 at Western Sizzlin in Russellville and featured season previews by Mullins, Cross Country Coach **Tom Aspel** and Volleyball Coach **Kristy Bayer**. The next luncheon is scheduled for Oct. 22 and will serve as a preview of Tech 2007-08 men's and women's basketball seasons with Golden Suns first-year head coach **Dave Wilbers** and Wonder Boys second-year head coach **Mark Downey**.

**UP NEXT FOR TECH:** Tech will remain home for another week at Buerkle Field as they welcome third-ranked North Alabamam, the defending GSC champions, on Saturday, Sept. 29. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. UNA collected a a 38-14 win in Florence, Ala., over the Wonder Boys last season.
