TODAY'S GAME: Arkansas

Tech (3-1 overall / 1-1 GSC) returns to action Saturday when it concludes a two-game homestand against third-ranked **North Alabama** (3-0 / 2-0 GSC) in Gulf South Conference action at **Buerkle Field** (6,500/natural grass). Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. CDT.

Tech, who is playing its second of three consecutive Top 8 nationally ranked teams, enters the game looking to rebound from its first loss of the season last Saturday at home to fourth-ranked Valdosta State, 28-27. Meanwhile, North Alabama enters Saturday's game sporting a 3-0 overall record and 2-0 mark in the GSC after earning a 27-6 win at home last Saturday over Southern Arkansas.

TECH RETURNS TO BUERKLE

FIELD IN 2007: After playing all five home games during the 2006 season at Russellville High School's Cyclone Stadium thanks to renovations on Tech's home stadium - Buerkle Field - as part of the school's \$4-million 'Return to Glory' capital campaign, the Wonder Boys returned to the renovated Buerkle Field when it played its first home game of the 2007 season on Sept. 8 against Texas College.

The 'Return to Glory' campaign raised money to support the construction of a residence hall as a wrap-around to the current football stadium, revitalization of the field, enhancements to the school's women's sports facilities and the addition of a permanent bandstand in the end zone for Tech's band. The new and improved Buerkle Field features a 226-bed residence hall, a new press box, controlled entrances to the stadium, new ticket booths, new concession stands, revamped restroom facilities, an auxiliary bookstore for the sale of Tech spirit merchandise, a new and improved scoreboard and four new and improved field lights.

UNA's assistant coaches for 2007 are: **Kenny Edenfield** (offensive coordinator/receivers); **Karl Morgan** (defensive coordinator/defensive line); **Alan Arrington** (offensive line/recruiting coordinator); **Stedman Campbell** (cornerbacks); **Sean Cannon** (linebackers); **Mike King** (kickers) and **Chris Willis** (safeties).

Saturday to Valdosta State. Last season, Tech was 3-1 at home in league play and is 22-9 at home in GSC play since the beginning of the 2000 season.

LAST GAME vs. NORTH

ALABAMA: In its last game against North Alabama on Sept. 30, 2006, Tech gained 417 yards of total

offense, but was limited to only two touchdowns, both of which were 50-plus yard passes from junior quarterback **Cole Barthel** (Decatur, Ala.) to **Mark Caldwell** as they fell 38-14 to the Lions. Trailing 10-0 in the second quarter, Barthel brought the Wonder Boys within 10-7 on his 50-yard touchdown strike to Caldwell with 2:40 remaining in the first half and then Tech pulled within 24-14 just three minutes into the fourth quarter on a 60-yard touchdown strike to Caldwell. Following Caldwell's score, the Lions began to take control of the game as they scored the game's final 14 points to earn the victory. Tech's offense was paced by Barthel, who was 22-for-31 through the air for 259 yards and tossed two interceptions to go along with his two touchdowns, while junior **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.) was 6-for-11 passing for 71 yards to help the Wonder Boys pass for 330 yards in the game. Caldwell caught six passes for 168 yards, while senior receiver **Chris Gunter** (Beebe, Ark.) caught five passes for 43 yards in the loss. Meanwhile, UNA's offense gained 467 yards, including rushing for 206 yards on 39 carries. Junior quarterback **A.J. Milwee** led the Lions as he was 20-for-30 through the air for 229 yards and rushed for a game-high 81 yards on 20 carries and scored two touchdowns, while sophomore running back **Tim Hicks** rushed for 59 yards and also scored two touchdowns. **Anthony Merritt** and junior **Jason Messing** combined to catch eight passes for 124 yards and one score.

THE NORTH ALABAMA SERIES: Saturday's GSC game against North Alabama marks the 11th all-time meeting in the series that dates back to 1970, with North Alabama leading the series, 7-3. UNA has won three straight games in the series since the Wonder Boys earned a 24-21 win in 1999 in Russellville. UNA leads the series 4-1 in Russellville and also leads the series 3-2 in Florence. Tech's last win over the Lions came in 1999 in Russellville enroute to Tech winning its only Gulf South Conference championship. Mullins is 1-5 all-time against the Lions.

TECH IN HOME GSC GAMES: Since joining the GSC in 1995, Tech is 30-14 all-time at home in GSC games and has won 11 of its last 14 at home in league play, with the only losses coming in the 2005 finale to Central Arkansas, in 2006 to Delta State and last

ing a No. 3 national ranking in the latest AFCA Division II Top 25 Coaches' Poll. The Lions, who are coached by 7th-year head coach **Mark Hudspeth**, enter Saturday's game as the league's No. 2 scoring team (42.7 points per game), No. 3 passing team (263.0 pass yards per game), No. 3 in total offense (441.0 yards per game) and No. 4 in scoring defense (16.3 points per game). The Lions, who return 13 starters and 44 lettermen from last season's GSC Championship squad that finished with an 11-1 overall record, are led offensively by the play of junior quarterback **A.J. Milwee**. Milwee is averaging 254.7 yards per game passing, which is second in the league and is completing 62 percent (61-for-99) of his passes and has thrown six touchdowns and two interceptions. In addition to his passing, he has rushed for 49 yards and is averaging 271 yards in total offense, which is third in the latest GSC statistics. Senior **Joemal Campbell** is Milwee's top target through the air as he has caught 18 passes for 268 yards (14.9 yds./reception) and is averaging 89.3 yards receiving per game, which is fourth in the league statistics and 95.7 all-purpose yards a game, while junior **Jason Messing** has caught 12 passes for 145 yards (12.1 yds./reception) and has scored two touchdowns. Sophomore running back **Tim Hicks** has been the Lions workhorse on the ground as he has carried the ball 39 times for 220 yards and has scored five touchdowns, while freshman

Brandenn Pickett has carried the ball 14 times for 145 yards and is averaging 10.4 yards per carry. Another weapon for the Lions is junior running back **David McCants**, who is averaging a GSC-best 27.1 yards on kick returns. Meanwhile, on defense, the Lions are allowing its opponents 337.3 yards per game and have forced 16 turnovers in three games, including collecting a GSC-best eight interceptions. On the season, UNA's defense has collected 29 tackles for 112 yards in losses, 11 quarterback sacks and has forced six fumbles. Leading the way for the defense is senior strong safety **Craig Fox**, who has recorded 19 total tackles, including seven solo stops and has 2.0 tackles for loss, one interception and returned a fumble for a 99 yard touchdown in the Lions win last Saturday over Southern Arkansas. Junior linebacker **Leroy Collins** has had 17 total tackles and a tackle for loss, while junior linebacker **Neil Mitchell** has collected 16 total tackles, 2.5 tackles for loss and one sack. Sophomore cornerback **Quin Suggs** has recorded a team-best 4.0 tackles for loss and junior free safety **Bobby Brooks** has picked off a league-best three interceptions.

ON THIS DATE: Tech has played just seven previous football games on Sept. 29 and Saturday's contest with North Alabama is the first game on Sept. 29 since Tech played in Russellville against Harding in 1990. The other six times

TECH RECORDS 500TH ALL-TIME WIN: In its win last season on Oct. 27, 2006, at Southern Arkansas, the Wonder Boys made history as they became just the 11th NCAA Division II program to win 500 football games all-time. Since beginning football in 1911, Tech has compiled a 504-316-41 all-time record and is the 11th all-time winningest D-II football program. In addition, Tech is just the second football program in the state of Arkansas to record at least 500 all-time wins, as the Arkansas Razorbacks have won 638 games in 114 seasons of competition.

TECH IN THE NATIONAL POLLS: Tech enters this week's contest unranked in two of the three major Division II national polls. The Wonder Boys, who received five votes in the AFCA D-II Coaches Preseason poll, received no votes in this week's fifth poll. In addition, Tech was unranked once again this week in the D2Football.com Top 25 poll, but is ranked 24th this week in *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* Top 40 Poll.

TECH IS 11TH ON D-II ALL-TIME WINNINGEST TEAMS LIST: Since beginning football 93 years ago, Tech stands in 11th place on the list of all-time winningest NCAA Division II football programs. Tech has recorded 504 wins all-time entering Saturday's UNA game and the Wonder Boys are one of 12 schools to win at least 495 all-time games. Tech enters Saturday's contest with a 504-318-41 all-time record, winning nearly 61 percent of their 863 games.

Pittsburg [KS] State headlines the list of all-time winningest programs with 617 wins, while Tuskegee [AL] is second all-time with 590 wins. North Dakota is third with 584 wins, while Central Oklahoma is fourth with 576 and Hillsdale [MI] is fifth in wins all-time with 557. Texas A&M-Kingsville is sixth all-time with 549 wins, Carson-Newman is seventh with 525 wins and Truman [Mo.] State is eighth with 516 all-time wins. Northern State is ninth with 511 all-time victories, while West Chester is 10th with 507

TECH RANKS 21ST IN PRE-SEASON LINDY'S MAGAZINE DIVISION II POLL:

Lindy's Annual Preseason Football Magazine has high hopes for the Wonder Boys this season as the publication ranked Tech 21st in the its preseason Division II poll. Tech was one of five GSC squads ranked in the D-II poll. Delta State headlines the contingent of GSC teams ranked as the Statesmen are ranked seventh, while Valdosta State is ranked eighth, North Alabama checks in at No. 16 and Henderson State is ranked 23rd in the poll. Two-time defending NCAA D-II national champions Grand Valley State sits atop the D-II poll, while NW Missouri State is ranked second and Chadron State is No. 3. North Dakota and Bloomsburg [PA] round out the Top 5 at No. 4 and No. 5 respectively. The Wonder Boys face all four of the GSC ranked teams in the Lindy's poll on four successive weeks and they open the season tonight at No. 2 ranked Northwest Missouri State. In addition to ranking the Top 25 D-II teams, Lindy's also compiled a list of key D-II games this season and Tech's game on Oct. 6 at Delta State is one of those 25 key D-II games. Other key GSC games listed are Henderson State at Delta State on Sept. 15, Delta State at Valdosta

State on Oct. 11 and North Alabama at Valdosta State on Oct. 27.

RECAP OF VALDOSTA STATE GAME:

Arkansas Tech saw its seven-game winning streak come to an end last Saturday as the Wonder Boys fell 28-27 in Gulf South Conference action to fourth-ranked Valdosta State in front of a regional television audience at Buerkle Field.

Tech, who fell to 3-1 overall and 1-1 in the GSC, couldn't hold onto a 13-point lead entering the fourth quarter as the Blazers scored two touchdowns in a span of seven minutes to post the come-from-behind victory.

"We battled today, but we just didn't finish," Tech Head Coach **Steve Mullins** said. "We were able to move the ball on them and score points, something its previous two opponents weren't able to accomplish, but we came up short on the scoreboard."

VSU entered the game having allowed just three points in its first two games, but Tech's offense put four touchdowns on the scoreboard, including two rushing scores from junior quarterback **Cole Barthel**, the reigning GSC, D2Football.com and *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* Offensive Player of the Week. For the game, Barthel finished 24-for-41 through the air for 235 yards and also carried the ball 11 times for 40 yards.

Tech opened the game's scoring on a 1-yard run by Barthel just three minutes into the game. The Wonder Boys took the opening kickoff and drove 71 yards in eight plays for the game's first score.

Following a 3-and-out by the Blazers on its first possession, Tech moved in front 14-0 on a 19-yard pass from Barthel to senior receiver **Chris Gunter** (Beebe, Ark.) with nine minutes remaining in the first quarter. Gunter caught four passes for game for 48 yards.

In the second quarter, VSU (3-0 overall, 1-0 GSC) threatened to put points on the scoreboard, but Zac Williams missed on a 35-yard field goal with 1:55 remaining in the half. The Wonder Boys also had a chance to go into halftime with a 17-0 lead, but sophomore kicker **Travis Cockerham** (Bryant, Ark.) missed on a 35-yard field goal as time expired. Cockerham's kick came two plays after VSU's Sherard Reynolds fumbled a punt at Blazers 27-yard line.

"Not one person is responsible for the loss, you win as a team and you lose as a team," said Mullins, the

STEVE MULLINS - HEAD COACH / ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

University of Arkansas-Monticello, 1980 (B.S. Science)

University of Central Arkansas, 1982 (M.Ed. Physical Education)

Steve Mullins is now his 11th season at the helm of the Wonder Boys. He enters Saturday's game with an overall record of 69-42 (.622) and a Gulf South Conference record of 57-33 (.633).

Since joining the sidelines as Tech's head coach in 1997, Mullins has brought the Wonder Boys into the upper echelon of the toughest NCAA Division II football conference in the country. He has led Tech to one Gulf South Championship (1999) and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory (2004).

Mullins enters the 2007 season as the second winningest active coach in terms of wins in the GSC and is the third winningest coach in Arkansas Tech's 93-year history of football.

Last season, Mullins led Tech to a 7-3 overall record and a 5-3 mark in the GSC. The seven wins was Mullins' sixth season of winning at least seven games with the Wonder Boys.

In 2004, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to the school's fourth-ever 10-win season and first since 1971 and led the squad to the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the second time in five seasons. In addition, Tech won its first ever playoff game at the Division II level and set the school record for total offense (4,949 yards).

For the season, Tech finished the season with a 10-2 record and an 8-1 mark in the Gulf South Conference, which led Mullins to be named the GSC and AFCA Division II Region Coach of the Year.

In his first two seasons at Tech, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to records of 4-7 in 1997 and 5-5 in 1998 before breaking through in 1999 with a 9-3 record and the school's first GSC Championship, which earned Mullins the league's Coach of the Year honor. The 1999 team featured three All-Americans and seven All-GSC selections.

Following the 1999 season, Mullins led Tech to records of 7-3 in 2000, including a 24-10 win over eventual national champion Delta State and 8-2 in 2001.

Since coming to Tech, Mullins' impact can't just be measured in mere wins and losses. In the past nine years, 38 Wonder Boys have been selected to the GSC All-Academic Team and 115 football players have qualified for the GSC Academic Honor Roll. In addition, 14 Wonder Boys have been named CoSIDA Academic All-District VI and four Tech players have received CoSIDA Academic All-American honors.

Along with that, five different Tech football players have been named to the GSC 'Top 10' Student-Athlete list and two Wonder Boys have received the GSC's Commissioner's Cup as the top male student-athlete in the league.

After six successful years at the helm of the football program, Mullins added the title of athletic director to his duties on April 16, 2003. In that capacity, he oversees the day-to-day operations of the athletic department and the school's 10 sport program.

Mullins began his Tech career in 1997 after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I-AA Northwestern State in Natchitoches, La.

Prior to Northwestern State, Mullins, the Camden, Ark., native, served for two seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State, two seasons as an assistant at Southwestern Oklahoma State and four years as an assistant coach at Lamar University.

The former University of Arkansas-Monticello defensive tackle began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Central Arkansas in 1981. As a player at UAM, Mullins was a three-time All-Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference selection, a three-time All-NAIA District 17 selection, a two-time NAIA All-American, an Associated Press Small College All-American as a senior in 1979 and is a member of the UAM Athletic Hall of Fame.

Mullins, who graduated from Camden [Ark.] High School in 1976, is married to the former Elizabeth (Liz) Morgan of Groves, Texas. The couple have three children, Katie (19), a sophomore at Tech, Hunter (16) and Mason (12).

In the third quarter, VSU's offense finally found the end zone as Willie Copleland completed a 4-play, 60-yard drive with a 9-yard run just a little over one minute into the second half, which was set up by a 43-yard run by Michael Terry, who led the Blazers rushing attack with 137 yards on 17 carries. VSU tied the game on its next possession as Copeland scored on a 1-yard run with 7:59 remaining in the quarter. Copeland finished the day 30-for-44 through the air for 252 yards and gained 50 yards on the ground.

Following Copeland's second score, Tech came right back and marched down the field and retook the lead on a 35-yard run by senior running back **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.), but Cockerham's extra-point was blocked. The touchdown was his 25th of his Tech career and with his 56 rushing yards in the game, he moved into seventh-place on the school's all-time rushing list with 2,253 yards. The Wonder Boys lead grew to 27-14 on its next possession as Barthel added his second rushing touchdown on a 2-yard run with 2:36 left in the quarter.

In the fourth quarter, the Blazers pulled within 27-21 on a 16-yard run by Terry, which completed a 4-play, 34-yard drive that was set up by a Barthel interception. After holding Tech on its next possession, the Blazers drove 78 yards in 10 plays and scored on a 4-yard run by Ronnye Nelson with 4:44 remaining in the game to push in front 28-27

and seal the victory. The Blazers game-winning drive was set up by four receptions from Cedric Jones, who finished the game grabbing 14 passes for 135 yards.

For the game, Tech was outgained, 501 to 367, as the Blazers offense gained 325 of its yards in the sec-

ond half.

Junior receiver **Tracey Stiger** caught eight of Barthel's 24 passes for 89 yards and also returned four kicks for a total of 53 yards in the loss, while redshirt junior punter Michael Podobnik punted five times for an average of 50.2 yards, including booting a 62-yarder in the fourth quarter.

NCAA ANNOUNCES DECISION IN NORTHWEST MISSOURI STATE GAME: On Sept. 4, the NCAA announced that the result of its Aug. 23 game at Northwest Missouri State, which was limited to less than a quarter due to severe lightning and storms, was decided on a conference call on Friday, August 31 between the NCAA and the institutions. It was agreed on this call, which was coordinated by the NCAA, that the game was terminated and, therefore, neither school will be credited with a win or a loss. Play was terminated with two minutes and 30 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

NCAA statistics policies for football require at least three quarters of competition for inclusion, which was part of the rationale in making the decision. Input from both institutions and conferences, as well as the NCAA Football Rules Committee and NCAA Division II Football Committee were considered during the conference call.

OPENING THE SEASON AGAINST NORTHWEST MISSOURI NOT ALL BAD: Opening a

season against Northwest Missouri State is not all bad as the last time Tech faced the Bearcats, in the 1999 opener, the Wonder Boys went on to finish the season with a 9-3 record and won their only GSC Football title and also earned the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff appearance. Following its 31-14 loss to the Bearcats that season, Tech won nine of its next 10 regular season games, including going 8-1 in GSC play to become the first Arkansas school to win a GSC football title. During league play, Tech collected home

wins over both North Alabama (24-21) and Valdosta State (21-14), but suffered its only league loss at Delta State (17-10). The Wonder Boys ended the season by falling 40-28 at Carson-Newman in the first round of the D-II Playoffs.

WONDER BOYS IN SEPTEMBER: Saturday's game marks the Wonder Boys' 203rd game all-time in the month of September. Tech is 106-90-6 all-time in games during the month, including winning 12 of its last 15 games in the month. Mullins is 29-13 all-time in the month of September as Tech's head coach.

PRESEASON GSC POLL TABS TECH SIXTH: Tech was tabbed to finish sixth in the preseason Gulf South Conference Coaches Poll, which was released on July 31. Tech received 55 points in the poll that was voted on by the league's head coaches and the coaches couldn't vote for their own teams. In the poll, Tech received three votes for fourth, two votes each for fifth and sixth place and three votes for seventh. Defending GSC champion North Alabama was tabbed as the preseason favorite for the second consecutive season as the Lions garnered 95 points and six of a possible 11 first-place votes. Valdosta State was picked second as they received 89 points and three first-place votes, while Delta State was tabbed third as the Statesmen received 84 points and a first place vote. Henderson State was picked fourth as they earned 75 points and the final first place vote, while Harding was tabbed to finish one spot in front of Tech as the Bisons earned 56 points. Behind Tech in the poll was West Alabama (54 points), Southern Arkansas (33 points), West Georgia (30 points), Ouachita Baptist (19 points) and Arkansas-Monticello (15 points).

MULLINS TIED FOR FIFTH ON GSC CAREER COACHING WINS LIST: Mullins, who is in his 11th season at Tech, stands tied for fifth with former Jacksonville State coach **Bill Burgess** (1985-92) all-time on the GSC career coaching victories list with 69. Former Mississippi College coach **John M. Williams** (1972-90) headlines the list with 124 wins, while former North Alabama head coach (1988-97) and current West Alabama coach **Bobby Wallace** is second on the list with 90 wins and former North Alabama coach **Wayne Grubb** (1977-87) is third with 82 all-time victories. Former Valdosta State coach **Chris Hatcher** is fourth with 76 wins, while former Delta State and Troy State coach **Rick Rhoades** (1985-87 and 2002-06) stands seventh on the list with 62 wins, while current Ouachita Baptist coach **Todd Knight** is eighth with 55 wins and former Jacksonville State coach **Jim Fuller** (1977-83) is ninth with 54 wins.

TECH THIRD WINNINGEST GSC TEAM SINCE 1999: Since 1999, Tech is the third winningest team in the GSC with 60 overall wins in 90 games and is also third in GSC wins with 49 over that same span. Valdosta State is the winningest team in the league since 2000 with 83 overall wins in 102 games and has recorded 60 GSC

victories, while Delta State is second with 67 overall wins in 95 games and is second in GSC wins with 52.

In addition to being the third winningest team overall in the GSC since 1999, Tech is also the winningest football program at any level in the state of Arkansas over that same span with 60 wins. NCAA Division I Arkansas is second on the list with 59 wins, while NCAA Division I-A FCS Central Arkansas is third with 57 wins and SAU is fourth with 49 wins. Harding is fifth with 46 wins and is followed by Arkansas-Pine Bluff in sixth place with 40 wins, NCAA Division I-A FCS Arkansas State is seventh with 34 victories and UAM is eighth with 32 wins. Henderson State is ninth with 28 wins and Ouachita Baptist is 10th with 27 wins.

touchdowns, senior running back **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.) enters his senior campaign as Tech's lone preseason All-GSC selection. Vanhook, who is 818 yards shy of becoming the fourth Wonder Boy to surpass the 3,000-yard career rushing plateau, was one of two running backs named to the preseason offensive team and one of 15 returning First-Team All-GSC selections from last season. In addition to naming Vanhook a member of the Preseason All-GSC Team, junior offensive tackle **Jeremy Ashcraft** (Marshall, Texas), a transfer from East Texas Baptist University, was named to the league's Top Newcomers List. Ashcraft transferred to Tech before the beginning of the 2007 spring semester.

VANHOOK CONTINUES CLIMB UP SCHOOL'S CAREER RUSHING CHART: R.J. Vanhook

(Prescott, Ark.) is in his final season at Tech and is now just 747 yards shy of becoming just the fourth Wonder Boy to surpass the 3,000-yard rushing plateau. In his career, he has gained 2,153 yards (5.0 yards/carry) and has scored 25 total touchdowns, including 23 career rushing touchdowns. With is 25 touchdowns, Vanhook stands 12th on the school's career scoring chart with 152 points. In Tech's 55-35 win last season at Ouachita Baptist, Vanhook gained 50 yards on the ground and became just the 11th player in Tech history to gain at least 2,000 rushing yards. Last season, he gained 507 yards (5.1 yards/carry) on the ground and scored six touchdowns. Vanhook's best season as a Wonder Boy came in as a redshirt freshman in 2004 when he gained 1,089 yards (5.7 yards/carry) and scored 11 rushing touchdowns in helping Tech compile a 10-2 record. Vanhook has played in Tech's last two games and has gained 71 yards on the season on 10 carries and is averaging 7.1 yards per game and has scored two touchdowns, including running 35 yards for a score against Valdosta State.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN: Tech had one player named a 2006 Preseason All-American by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* - senior defensive tackle **Andrew Murphy**.

As a junior in 2006, Murphy, who was named a Third-Team *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-Southeast Region selection, ranked sixth in the final NCAA D-II



national football statistics in forced fumbles (0.4 per game) and recorded 38 total tackles, including 18 solo stops, 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 quarterback sacks. In addition, he forced four fumbles, had three fumble recoveries and an interception, which was returned 42 yards for a touchdown against Valdosta State, which led to Murphy being named the GSC's Defensive Player of the Week.

Murphy, a native of Booneville, Miss., and a transfer from NE Mississippi Community College, was one of 20 GSC players named to the Preseason *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-American team.

This season's All-American team featured 154 players and was comprised of 86 seniors, 50 juniors and 18 sophomores from all four geographic regions of NCAA Division II.

QUINCY SKINNER NAMED TECH'S 28TH ALL-AMERICAN IN 2006:

In his only season at Tech, cornerback **Quincy Skinner** (Coral Springs, Fla.) made quite an impression as the Florida Atlantic transfer became the school's 28th different Wonder Boy to earn All-American status and the 12th Wonder Boy to earn All-American recognition under Mullins. Skinner, who was a Second-Team All-GSC selection, finished last season ranked fifth nationally in Division II in interceptions (0.8 per game) and recorded 63 tackles, including a team-best 43 solo stops and had 2.5 tackles for loss, five pass break-ups, one fumble

recovery, one forced fumble and defended 1.3 passes per game, which was 20th in the final D-II national statistics. Skinner became the third Wonder Boy to earn AFCA D-II Coaches' First-Team All-American honors and was the fifth-ever Tech player to be named an AP Little All-American as he was a third-team selection and also earned Third-Team *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-Southeast Region honors.

CURSH MAKES RETURN TO FIELD:

Tech's defense has already been bolstered this year by the return of the 2004 GSC Defensive Player of the Year, junior linebacker **Cedric Cursh** (Foreman, Ark.). Cursh, who sat out the past two seasons to deal with some off-the-field legal issues, is a welcomed addition to a defense that returned just six starters from a year ago. As a sophomore in 2004, Cursh, who was also named an AP Little All-American, recorded 95 total tackles, including 21 tackles for loss, nine quarterback sacks, five forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and one interception as he helped lead the Wonder Boys to a 10-2 record and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory. In the NCAA Playoff victory against Catawba, Cursh finished with 10 tackles, including five solo stops and had two tackles for losses of nine yards, one sack, one forced fumble and recovered two fumbles enroute to earning National Defensive Player of the Week honors from *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*. His forced fumble and

subsequent fumble recovery at Tech's 47-yard line with 38 seconds remaining in the game sealed Tech's 24-20 win over Catawba. Cursh enters Saturday's North Alabama game with 14 career sacks, which puts him tied for seventh on the school's career list and has recorded 205 career tackles, including 112 solo stops and has had 31 career tackles for losses of 149 yards. On the season, Cursh leads the Wonder Boys with 26 total tackles, including collecting 17 solo stops and leads



the GSC with three sacks and has forced two fumbles, broken up two passes and has had two tackles for loss.

TECH COACHES NAME MVP'S FROM VALDOSTA STATE

GAME: The Tech coaching staff named its MVP's from the Valdosta State game this past Sunday.

The Offensive MVP honor went to junior receiver **Tracey Stiger**. It is the second consecutive week that Stiger has been honored as an MVP by the coaches as he was named the Special Teams MVP following the West Georgia game. In last Saturday's win over VSU, Stiger graded out at 82 percent according to Tech Head Football Coach **Steve Mullins**. Against the Blazers, Stiger caught eight passes for 89 yards, including gaining 65 yards after the catch. One of

Stiger's eight catches, a 33-yarder in the first quarter, set up Tech's first touchdown of the game.

On defense, the coaches awarded senior linebacker **Zach Noel** (Paragould, Ark.) as its MVP. Mullins said that Noel graded out at 91 percent against the Blazers after recording 10 total tackles, including six unassisted stop and also had a tackle for a loss.

The Special Team MVP honor went to redshirt junior punter **Michael Podobnik** (Frankfort, Ill.). It is the second time this season that Podobnik has been selected as MVP on special teams as he was honored following the Northeastern State game. Against Valdosta State, Podobnik punted five times for 251 yards and averaged 50.2 yards per punt, including recording a 62-yard boot in the fourth quarter and had two touchbacks.

SCORING STREAKS: Tech enters Saturday's GSC home game having scored in 35 straight games since being shutout 30-0 by Valdosta State in the next to last game of the 2003 season. In fact, since Mullins took over the program in 1997, Tech has failed to score in a game only twice and has scored in 124 of its last 126 games.

Meanwhile, Tech's opponents have scored in 48 consecutive games, including 12 of its last 23 opponents scoring 30-plus points, since the Wonder Boys held West Alabama scoreless on Nov. 2, 2002. In the last eight years, Tech has held only one opponent scoreless and has held 10 opponents under 10 points, including one opponent so far this season.

HALFTIME LEAD EQUALS

WINS: Since Mullins took over the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, the Wonder Boys have been known as a second-half team as they are 53-3 when leading at halftime, including being 2-1 this season after losing last Saturday to Valdosta State after leading 14-0. In addition, the Wonder Boys are 58-3 when leading heading into the fourth quarter and are 4-1 in over-time during Mullins' tenure.

DID YOU KNOW FACT. . .

Cole Barthel and Tech assistant baseball coach **Wes McCrotty** share a common similarity. That similarity is that both of them were drafted in the 2001 Major League Baseball Draft, as Barthel was a second-round selection (71st pick overall) by the Atlanta Braves out of Decatur (Ala.) High School, while McCrotty, a graduate of Russellville High School, was drafted in the 23rd round (692nd overall) by the Florida Marlins after a stellar pitching career with the Arkansas Razorbacks.

BARTHEL EARNS SECOND GSC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONOR:

On Monday, Sept. 17, Cole Barthel was named the GSC's Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season and third time in his Tech career as he was also honored this season on Sept. 3 following the Northeastern State game and was also honored following the Ouachita Baptist game on Oct. 23, 2006. Barthel's earns this week's honor after his record-setting performance in Tech's GSC opener against West Georgia last Saturday. Against UWG, Barthel accounted for seven touchdowns, including throwing for a Tech single-game school record six touchdowns in Tech's 52-34 win over the Wolves in Carrollton, Ga. With the six touchdown passes, Barthel became the 12th player in GSC history and also became the first Tech quarterback in the school's 93 year history to accomplish that feat. For the game, Barthel was 29-for-42 through the air for 310 yards and also carried the ball two times for 48 yards, including scoring on a 39-yard run in the third quarter to give Tech a 38-27 lead. He threw touchdown passes to five different receivers in the game as junior **Tracey Stiger** caught two touchdown passes from Barthel.

BARTHEL HONORED AS NATIONAL OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

In addition to earning GSC Offensive Player of the Week honors last week, Barthel was also honored as the co-National Offensive Player of the Week by D2Football.com and also was named the D-II National Offensive Player of the Week by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* following his record-setting performance against West Georgia. Barthel shared the offensive honor on D2Football.com with North Dakota running back **Ryan Chappell** and shared offensive honors with Chappell and Assumption running back **Herbert Woodard** in *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*. It was first National Player of the Week for Barthel since *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* honored him on Oct. 23, 2006, after the Ouachita Baptist game.

GSC HONORS PODOBNIK AS ITS SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

On Monday, Sept. 10, redshirt junior **Michael Podobnik** was named the GSC's Special Teams Player of the Week after booting four punts for 178 yards and a 44.5 yard average in last Saturday's 21-6 win over Texas College. Against the Steers, Podobnik had a 56-yard punt and had one touchback in the game. He becomes the second consecutive Wonder Boy honored by the league this sea-

son after **Cole Barthel** took home the league's offensive honor the previous week.

WONDER BOYS WELCOME NEW COORDINATORS THIS SEASON:

For the first time since 2004, Tech enters a season with both a new offensive and defensive coordinator. During the offseason, Mullins promoted **Benyard Jones** to defensive coordinator and brought in 18-year coaching veteran **Scott Preston** as the offensive coordinator. Jones, who is in his second tour of duty at Tech after spending five seasons from 1999-2004 at Tech as an assistant and then returning last season as the defensive line coach after spending the 2005 season as the defensive coordinator at Butler University, an NCAA Division I-AA member. Meanwhile, Preston brings a wealth of experience to Tech as he spent four seasons (2000-03) as the offensive coordinator, quarterback, running back and receivers coach at Illinois State University. In addition to Illinois State, Preston also had stints at Murray State University, Ventura [CA] College, Georgia Military College, San Francisco State and began his collegiate coaching career working with Hal Mumme at Valdosta State University.

NCAA D-II Football in turnover margin as the Wonder Boys had a +0.6 margin for its 10 games. On the season, Tech's offense committed 22 turnovers as they had 11 interceptions and lost 11 fumbles, while its defense forced 14 fumbles and picked off 14 passes on the season. Tech was tied for the second in the GSC in turnover margin with Delta State. North Alabama led the league with a +0.7 margin as they committed 14 turnovers and forced 24 turnovers. So far this season, Tech has struggled taking care of the ball as they have 15 total turnovers, including 13 fumbles (losing seven of the them), while their opponents have had 12 fumbles (lost three of them) and have thrown four interceptions.

WONDER BOYS STRONG IN THE RED ZONE:

Through the first four games this season, Tech is 13-for-14 in putting points on the scoreboard inside the red zone. On the season, the Wonder Boys have scored 13 touchdowns when they get inside the red zone (within 20 yards of the end zone), including scoring three times four trips into the red zone in last Saturday's game against Valdosta State. Last season, Tech was 28-for-35 (80 percent) in scoring chances inside the red zone as they scored 24 touchdowns and had four field goals.

35 POINTS IS THE MAGIC NUMBER: Since taking the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, Coach Mullins' Tech teams are 25-2 all-time in games in which they score 35 or more points in a single game. In fact, Tech is 32-11 when it scores between 21-34 points during the Mullins era, including being 1-1 this season. Tech has won 23 straight games when scoring at least 35 or more points and hasn't lost since falling 53-36 to UCA in 1997 when scoring 35 or more points.

NOEL RACKING UP THE TACKLES: Senior linebacker **Zach Noel** (Paragould, Ark.) continues to climb up the school's career tackle charts. Noel enters Saturday's game with North Alabama having recorded 179 total tackles, including 88 solo stops. In addition, he has had 8.0 tackles for 25 yards in losses and has picked off two passes, including one for a touchdown against Harding in 2005. In last Saturday's game against Valdosta State, Noel had eight total tackles, including four solo stops and a tackle for loss.

BARTHEL IS AN ACE IN TWO SPORTS: Sophomore **Cole Barthel**, who is in his second season at Tech after transferring from the University of Arkansas, was a second round draft pick (71st pick overall) in the 2001 Major League Draft by the Atlanta Braves out of high school. Barthel decided to forgo college originally (he signed a National Letter of Intent with the Razorbacks as a quarterback) and played four seasons in the Atlanta Braves organization as a third baseman, including playing two seasons in Rome, Ga., an A-level minor league affiliate of the Braves. In his four-year minor league career, Barthel hit .251 with five home runs and 36 RBIs. Last season as a freshman with the Razorbacks, Barthel went through spring drills and played in two games before

He served as both a student assistant (1997-2001) and graduate assistant (2002-04) in the Tech sports information department under former Tech SID and CoSIDA Hall of Famer, **Larry Smith**.

Strasner currently serves as Director of Publications and Creative Services for University Relations at Arkansas Tech. He and his wife, Heather, live in Russellville.

Meanwhile, **Davis** serves as Tech's Director of Corporate and Athletic Relations in Tech's Development Office. In addition, he was a three-time All-Area selection and was ranked 69th nationally among high school quarterbacks by Rivals100.com.

CHILDRESS IS BECOMING TECH'S WORKHORSE ON THE GROUND:

Sophomore running back **Tim Childress** is becoming Tech's workhorse on the ground in his second season of competing for the Wonder Boys. Through four games this season, the Batesville, Ark., native has carried the ball 68 times for a team-leading 227 yards and is averaging 3.3 yards per carry and 56.8 yards per game overall, which ranks seventh in the latest GSC statistics. In addition, he has scored one touchdown, a 1-yard run in Tech's 21-6 win over Texas College and has caught 10 passes for 80 yards (8.0 yds/reception). As a redshirt freshman last season, Childress carried the ball 25 times for 80 yards in 10 games for the Wonder Boys.

STIGER LOOKING FOR MORE IN 2007: Junior receiver and return specialist **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) is looking for more success on special teams this coming season. Stiger averaged 20.8 yards on 30 kickoff returns last season, despite missing the final two games of the season due to an injury. The 20.8

average was second in the GSC and helped Stiger earn Second-Team All-GSC honors. In addition to his kick returning, Stiger also averaged a team-best 118.6 all-purpose yards, which was fourth in the GSC and 38th nationally in NCAA Division II. On the season, he caught

32 passes for 319 yards (10.0 yards/reception) and scored five touchdowns. Stiger enters Saturday's UNA game having gained 2,616 all-purpose yards, including catching 61 passes for 573 yards, rushing for 340 yards on 93 carries and has returned 64 kickoffs for 1,349 yards (21.1 yards/return) and has scored 14 career touchdowns. 50 yards, including a 75-yard punt in Tech's season-opener against Northeastern State.

NCAA RULES CHANGES FOR 2007 SEASON: In 2006, the NCAA changed the way it started the clock as it decided to start the game clock when the ball is kicked off, as opposed to previously starting the clock when the ball was touched legally in the field of play. This season, the NCAA has decided to abandon last year's new rule and return to the old clock rule that states, that on a kickoff, the game clock starts when the ball is touched legally in the field of play or crosses the goal line after the receiving team touches it in its end zone. In addition, on a change of possession, the clock will start on the snap of the ball. Other clock rules this season include that during televised

games only, charged team timeouts will be one minute rather than 1:30. Another rule change this season is that teams will kickoff from its 30-yard line. Previously, the ball was kicked off from the 35. For fouls by the kicking team on kickoffs and punts (other than kick-catch interference), the receiving team has the option to tack on the penalty where it will subsequently have the ball. The receiving team still may choose to have the down replayed after enforcement of the penalty at the previous spot. A third rule change this season is that no defensive player in an attempt to block, bat or catch a kick may be picked up, elevated, propelled or pushed by a teammate. This is an addition to an existing rule, with "elevated, propelled or pushed" added a new language.

HISTORY MADE IN 2004: Tech Football made history in 2004 as the Wonder Boys won its first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff game with its 24-20 victory at Buerkle Field over Catawba. In addition, Tech was the first-ever team from the state of Arkansas to host an NCAA Division II playoff game and they also was the first team from Arkansas to ever win an NCAA Division II playoff contest. The Wonder Boys, who finished with a 10-2 overall record in 2004, ended the season with its 42-24 loss at Albany State in the second round of the NCAA Playoffs. Prior to Tech's postseason win over



Catawba, the Wonder Boys last postseason win came in 1971 against Northern State in the semifinals of the NAIA National Playoffs.

TECH UNVEILS NEW HELMETS, COLOR SCHEME THIS SEASON: During the offseason, Tech changed the color schemes for the school. Tech has switched from its traditional Green and Old Gold color to a Green (PMS 343) and Gold (PMS 116) scheme. The gold color is similar to the Green Bay Packers yellow that is worn on its helmets. With the change in colors, the Wonder Boys had to change its helmets this season from gold to yellow. In addition, they have added new uniforms for both home and away games this season.

TECH FINISHES 2006 RANKED 26TH IN ATTENDANCE: Despite playing all five of its home games last season at Russellville's Cyclone Stadium, Tech finished the year ranked 26th amongst 143 NCAA

Division II teams in home attendance as the Wonder Boys averaged 5,467 for its five games at Cyclone Stadium. On the season, Tech had 27,336 fans attend their home contests. Fort Valley State led all of D-II in attendance with an average of 13,682 per game, while Tuskegee was second with an average of 11,195. UNA was the first GSC team ranked as they finished fourth with an average of 10,091 per game, while Delta State was 21st with an average of 6,030 per game and West Alabama was 22nd as they averaged 5,783 per game last season.

GSC RETURNS TO TELEVISION AGAIN IN 2007:

For the third consecutive year, the GSC returns to live television this season.

This season's "GSC-TV Live" schedule features eight Thursday night contests, all of which will kick off at 7 p.m. CST and Tech's game with VSU, which will be aired on Saturday, Aug. 22 and will kickoff at 3 p.m. CST.

CSS will continue as the primary carrier for the "GSC-TV Live" games once again this season, bringing more than 5 million potential households, while Cox Sports (which is on channel 119 in Russellville) adds its 1.7 million customers to the mix for the second straight season. In addition, the GSC will also make the broadcasts available to other cable systems and open-air channels in non-conflicting areas, but the games will not be available on DirectTV or DishNetwork.

This year's "GSC-TV Live" package begins on Sept. 13 as defending GSC champion North Alabama plays at Harding. The next broadcast is scheduled for Sept. 20 when West Alabama plays at Henderson State and is followed by Tech's home league opener against VSU on Sept. 22. Southern Arkansas' game at Delta State rounds out the first month of the schedule on Sept. 27.

In October, West Georgia's game at Henderson State on Oct. 4 opens up the coverage, followed by Delta State's game on Oct. 11 at Valdosta State. Following the VSU-DSU game, North Alabama's home game with Delta State will be aired on Oct. 18 and Arkansas-Monticello's game at West Alabama on Oct. 25 closes out the month.

The final two live television broadcasts are slated for Nov. 1 when Henderson State plays at Ouachita Baptist in its annual "Battle of the Ravine" match-up and the schedule concludes on Nov. 8 with West Georgia's game at Valdosta State.

TECH SCHEDULED FOR ONE GSC-LIVE TV GAME:

week's Valdosta State in Russellville. All of this year's "GSC-TV Live" broadcasts can be seen locally in the Russellville area on SuddenLink Digital Cable Channel 119 and also on SuddenLink Channel 2.

FORMER WONDER BOY JASON CAMPBELL SOARS IN FIRST SEASON OF ARENA FOOTBALL:

Jason Campbell knows how to make a good first impression.

During his first season as a quarterback at Tech in 2004, Campbell threw for a school-record 2,922 yards and led the Wonder Boys to the second round of the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

Now, nearly three years later, Campbell has made a similar splash in the world of Arena Football while starting at quarterback for the 2007 Everett [Wash.] Hawks in his first season as a professional.

Campbell established new Everett franchise records for touchdown passes in a season (84) and passing yards in a season (3,663). In addition, he completed more than 60 percent of his passes during 2007 and ranked among the top 10 quarterbacks in AF2 (a developmental league under the Arena Football League umbrella) in passing efficiency.

And Campbell accomplished all of this despite the fact that he did not start until the fifth game of the season.

"It was rough at first because in Arena Football you have to get rid of the ball so fast," said Campbell. "I was in the shotgun most of the time at Arkansas Tech."

After seeing time as a back-up quarterback in Everett's first four games, he got his first start in week five. Campbell took advantage of the opportunity, throwing for 218 yards and five touchdowns to help the Hawks to their first win of the season.

Campbell went on to lead Everett to five more victories, including a three-game winning streak during the final month of the season. The Hawks finished their season on July 28 with a record of 6-10.

Victories were the norm when Campbell was at

Tech. During his two years as the Wonder Boys' starting quarterback (2004-05), Tech accumulated an overall record of 17-5, including a 14-4 mark in GSC games. He completed his two-year Tech career with 5,100 yards of total offense (2nd-most in school history) and 5,079 passing yards (2nd-most in school history).

WHAT IS A WONDERBOY, YOU ASK?? Here is the story and history of the Wonder Boys. In 1919, Arkansas Tech's football team upset the highly-favored Jonesboro Aggies (now known as Arkansas State University) 14-0 behind a pair of 70-yard punt returns for touchdowns and two point-afters by a 17-year old quarterback by the name of **John Tucker**. The Jonesboro team had staked a claim to the mythical state football championship prior to the game.

Henry Loesch, the sports editor of the *Arkansas Gazette* in Little Rock, covered the game and coined the name "Wonder Boys" in complimenting the Tech team, then known as the Aggies, in his postgame story.

Tech's men's athletic teams have been known as the Wonder Boys ever since, and Tucker was thereafter labeled as "The Original Wonder Boy." Tucker went on to complete his education at the University of Alabama, but returned to Arkansas Tech and served in several capacities, including head football coach, athletics director and chemistry professor from 1925-72.

GREEN AND GOLD LUNCHEONS: The first of three Green and Gold Club Luncheons for 2007 was held on Monday, Aug. 20 at Western Sizzlin in Russellville and featured season previews by Mullins, Cross Country Coach **Tom Aspel** and Volleyball Coach **Kristy Bayer**. The next luncheon is scheduled for Oct. 22 and will serve as a preview of Tech 2007-08 men's and women's basketball seasons with Golden Suns first-year head coach **Dave Wilbers** and Wonder Boys second-year head coach **Mark Downey**.

UP NEXT FOR TECH: Tech will return to road to begin a two-game road swing on Saturday, Oct. 6, when they travel to Cleveland, Miss., to face seventh-ranked Delta State. Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. at Travis E. Parker Field. The Statesmen collected a 31-13 win over the Wonder Boys in Russellville last season.
