TONIGHT'S GAME: Arkansas

Tech (3-2 overall / 1-2 GSC) returns to action Saturday, Oct. 6, as it travels to Cleveland, Miss., to face eighth-ranked **Delta State** (4-0 / 3-0 GSC) in Gulf South Conference action at **Travis E. Parker Field** (8,125/natural grass). Kickoff is set for 6 p.m. CDT.

Tech, who is playing its final of three consecutive Top 8 nationally ranked teams, enters the game looking to snap its two-game losing skid after its 27-20 loss last Saturday at home over third-ranked North Alabama. Meanwhile, Delta State enters Saturday's contest having won its first four games of the season after earning a 28-3 win at home last Thursday, Sept. 27 over Southern Arkansas.

TECH RETURNS TO BUERKLE

FIELD IN 2007: After playing all five home games during the 2006 season at Russellville High School's Cyclone Stadium thanks to renovations on Tech's home stadium - Buerkle Field - as part of the school's \$4-million 'Return to Glory' capital campaign, the Wonder Boys returned to the renovated Buerkle Field when it played its first home game of the 2007 season on Sept. 8 against Texas College.

The 'Return to Glory' campaign raised money to support the construction of a residence hall as a wrap-around to the current football stadium, revitalization of the field, enhancements to the school's women's sports facilities and the addition of a permanent bandstand in the end zone for Tech's band. The new and improved Buerkle Field features a 226-bed residence hall, a new press box, controlled entrances to the stadium, new ticket booths, new concession stands, revamped restroom facilities, an auxiliary bookstore for the sale of Tech spirit merchandise, a new and improved scoreboard and four new and improved field lights.

Boys are coached by **Steve Mullins** (Ark.-Monticello, '80). Mullins is 69-43 in his 11th season as head coach and is 57-34 all-time in GSC games. Tech's assistant coaches for 2007 are: **Benyard Jones** (defensive coordinator/linebackers), **Scott Preston** (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks & running backs), **Les Boyum** (offensive line), **Erik Kruppe** (defensive line), **Ryan Wallace** (receivers), **Greg Williams** (defensive backs), **Brett Hobbs** (GA/linebackers), **Andrew Jackson** (SA/secondary), **Garren Rockwell** (GA/defensive line), **Kyle Shipp** (GA/offensive line) and **Antonio Whitfield** (GA/receivers). The Statesmen are coached by **Ron Roberts** (Tenn.-Martin, '88). Roberts is 4-0 in his first season at Delta State and as a collegiate head coach. DSU's assistant coaches for 2007 are: **Dave Aranda** (co-defensive coordinator); **Darrin Hicks** (offensive coordinator); **Ray Bridges** (secondary); **Randy Grierson** (defensive line/academic coordinator); **Chet Pobolish** (receivers); **Steve Smith** (offensive line); **Ryan Barker** (GA/running backs); **Ryan Biesemeyer** (GA/safeties); **Karl Scott** (GA/linebackers) and **Garren Stefan** (GA/receivers).

tenure. Tech has won 12 of its last 18 league road contests, including being 3-2 on the road the past two-plus seasons.

LAST GAME vs. DELTA STATE:

In its last game against Delta State on Oct. 7, 2007, at Cyclone Stadium in Russellville, Tech couldn't recover from the Statesmen scoring on three of its first five possessions in the first half and then sealing the win with two touchdowns in the third quarter for a 31-13 win. The Wonder Boys appeared to gain some momentum heading into halftime as junior receiver **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) found the end zone on a 1-yard pass from junior quarterback **Cole Barthel** (Decatur, Ala.) with 54 seconds remaining. Stiger's touchdown completed a 12-play, 82-yard drive for the Wonder Boys that featured two fourth-down conversions, including a 26-yard rush by junior **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.) on a fourth-and-two play. Ray finished with a game-high 63 yards rushing and was 3-for-7 through the air for 53 yards for the Wonder Boys. Barthel finished the game 11-for-20 through the air for 71 yards and carried the ball two times for 11 yards, while **Mark Caldwell** hauled in six passes for 57 yards. For the game, Tech gained 278 yards and won the turnover battle as it did not have a single miscue, while DSU's only lost turnover was an Eyster interception in the third quarter, which was plucked out of the air by **Quincy Skinner**. Meanwhile, Tech's defense allowed 446 yards, including **Scott Eyster** going 22-for-37 through the air for 350 yards and three touchdowns to set a new GSC passing yardage mark, while **Robert Davis** caught seven passes for 127 yards and **Jeremy Ricks** added five receptions for 71 yards for the Statesmen.

THE DELTA STATE SERIES: Saturday's game with Delta State marks the 15th meeting all-time in the series that dates back to 1956, with the Statesmen leading the series, 8-6. Tech, though, has won four of the last seven meetings in the series, but has lost the last two meetings, including falling 31-13 in Russellville last season. Mullins is 5-5 all-time against the Statesmen, including being 2-3 in Cleveland, Miss. The series is tied 4-4 in Russellville, while DSU leads the series in Cleveland, 4-2, including the last two meetings in Cleveland.

TECH IN ROAD GSC GAMES: The Wonder Boys are 29-25-1 all-time in GSC road games, including being 25-20 in GSC road contests during Mullins'

ABOUT THE DELTA STATE STATESMEN: Delta State enters its second straight GSC home contest sporting a 4-0 overall record and a 3-0 mark in the GSC and is carrying a No. 8 national ranking in the latest AFCA D-

II Top 25 Coaches' Poll. The Statesmen enter the game with the GSC's top-ranked defense (allowing 233.5 yards per game), first in rushing defense (53.5 yards per game), second ranked scoring defense (8.8 points per game) and the fifth ranked offense (389.8 yards per game). DSU, who returns 18 starters from last season's 12-3 squad that lost in the NCAA D-II National Semifinals to Grand Valley State, are led offensively by junior quarterbacks **Dedrick Wilson** and **Brett Hyatt**. Wilson is averaging 155.2 yards of total offense per game on the season as he is 35-for-80 passing for 382 yards (95.5 yards per game) with five interceptions and two touchdowns and has also carried the ball 56 times for 239 yards (4.3 yards/carry) and has scored four touchdowns. Hyatt, on the other hand, is 21-for-37 passing for 318 yards (56.8 completion pct.) and has tossed two touchdowns and one interception. When DSU does throw the ball (175.0 passing yards per game), the main receiving target is senior **Jeremy Ricks**, who has caught 22 passes for 232 yards (10.5 yards/reception) and has two touchdowns. In addition to Wilson's rushing, senior **Ken Cox** has carried the ball 19 times for 144 yards (7.6 yards/carry) and sophomore **Ben Stallings** has gained 108 yards on 26 carries. In its last two games, the DSU offense has gained a total of 921 yards (460.5 yards per game) and has averaged 35 points per game. Prior to the last two games, DSU's offense had gained just 490 yards (275 rushing/215 passing).

Meanwhile, the strength of this season's Delta State team is its defense as they are allowing just 233.5 yards per game and have limited its first four opponents to just 35 total points. The Statesmen defenders have recorded 45 tackles for 227 yards in losses, a league-best 15 quarterback sacks and 47 quarterback hurries. In addition, they have picked off seven passes, blocked three kicks and have forced four fumbles. Leading the way for the DSU defense is senior linebacker **Michael Eubanks**. Eubanks, who was one of nine Statesmen named a Preseason All-American, has recorded 24 total tackles, 5.0 tackles for loss and two sacks. In last Thursday's game against SAU, Eubanks tied the DSU career record for sacks (28) and is now 4.5 sacks shy of tying the career D-II sack mark held by Adams State's **Adam McGurk**. In addition to Eubanks, sophomore linebacker **Lardester Hicks** has recorded 21 total tackles, 5.5 tackles for loss, has picked off one pass and blocked a kick, while junior linebacker **Anthony King** has recorded 16 total tackles, including 6.0 tackles for loss, 3.0 sacks and two forced fumbles and senior linebacker **David Tahi** has had 14 total tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and a team-best 3.5 sacks. Senior free safety **Jamarcus Wiggins** and junior cornerback **Monterio James** have combined for 26 tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss, three interceptions, two fumbles recoveries and two blocked kicks, both of which are by Wiggins.

ON THIS DATE: Tech has played just 12 previous football games on Oct. 12 and Saturday's contest with Delta State is the first game on Oct. 6 since Tech played Delta State in Cleveland in 2005, a game that the Statesmen won 34-17. Tech is 8-4 all-time on Oct. 6 and has won three of the last five games on that date. Saturday's contest with Delta State marks the ninth road game overall and fourth straight road contest on Oct. 6.

TECH RECORDS 500TH ALL-TIME WIN: In its win last season on Oct. 27, 2006, at Southern Arkansas, the Wonder Boys made history as they became just the 11th NCAA Division II program to win 500 football games all-time. Since beginning football in 1911, Tech has compiled a 504-316-41 all-time record and is the 11th all-time winningest D-II football program. In addition, Tech is just the second football program in the state of Arkansas to record at least 500 all-time wins, as the Arkansas Razorbacks have won 638 games in 114 seasons of competition.

TECH IN THE NATIONAL POLLS: Tech enters this weekend's contest unranked in two of the three major Division II national polls. The Wonder Boys, who received five votes in the AFCA D-II Coaches Preseason poll, received no votes in this week's sixth poll and continues to be unranked in this week's D2Football.com Top 25 poll, but is ranked 23rd this week in *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* Top 40 Poll.

TECH IS 11TH ON D-II ALL-TIME WINNINGEST TEAMS LIST:

Since beginning football 93 years ago, Tech stands in 11th place on the list of all-time winningest NCAA Division II football programs. Tech has recorded 504 wins all-time entering Saturday's Delta State game and the Wonder Boys are one of 12 schools to win at least 495 all-time games. Tech enters Saturday's contest with a 504-319-41 all-time record, winning nearly 61 percent of their 864 games. Pittsburg [KS] State headlines the list of all-time winningest programs with 618 wins, while

Tuskegee [AL] is second all-time with 591 wins. North Dakota is third with 585 wins, while Central Oklahoma is fourth with 577 and Hillsdale [MI] is fifth in wins all-time with 558. Texas A&M-Kingsville is sixth all-time with 549 wins, Carson-Newman is seventh with 526 wins and Truman [Mo.] State is eighth with 517 all-time wins. Northern State is ninth with 511 all-time victories, while West Chester is 10th with 508 wins and Virginia Union is 12th with 498 wins.

TECH RANKS 21ST IN PRE-SEASON LINDY'S MAGAZINE DIVISION II POLL: *Lindy's* Annual Preseason Football Magazine has high hopes for the Wonder Boys this season as the publication ranked Tech 21st in the its preseason Division II poll. Tech was one of five GSC squads ranked in the D-II poll. Delta State headlines the contingent of GSC teams ranked as the Statesmen are ranked seventh, while Valdosta State is ranked eighth, North Alabama checks in at No. 16 and Henderson State is ranked 23rd in the poll. Two-time defending NCAA D-II national champions Grand Valley State sits atop the D-II poll, while NW Missouri State is ranked second and Chadron State is No. 3. North Dakota and Bloomsburg [PA] round out the Top 5 at No. 4 and No. 5 respectively. The

Wonder Boys face all four of the GSC ranked teams in the *Lindy's* poll on four successive weeks and they open the season tonight at No. 2 ranked Northwest Missouri State. In addition to ranking the Top 25 D-II teams, *Lindy's* also compiled a list of key D-II games this season and Tech's game on Oct. 6 at Delta State is one of those 25 key D-II games. Other key GSC games listed are Henderson State at Delta State on Sept. 15, Delta State at Valdosta State on Oct. 11 and North Alabama at Valdosta State on Oct. 27.

RECAP OF NORTH ALABAMA GAME: Arkansas Tech concluded its two-game homestand against two Top 5 nationally ranked teams last Saturday by falling 27-20 to third-ranked North Alabama in Gulf South Conference on Family Day at Buerkle Field. The UNA loss came on the heels of Tech's heartbreaking 28-27 loss to fourth-ranked Valdosta State on Sept. 22.

Tech, who fell to 3-2 overall and 1-2 in the GSC, couldn't overcome two costly fumbles and a missed field goal in falling to the Lions and dropping its second consecutive home game for the first time since losing four straight home games during the 2003 season.

Coach **Steve Mullins** said following the game. "We fought hard all the way to the end once again."

The Wonder Boys opened the game's scoring on a 98-yard interception return by sophomore free safety **Tario Dansby** (Ashdown, Ark.) just a little over four minutes into the game. The interception return was the second-longest in school history and the longest since former Wonder Boy **Joseph Wright** returned an interception 69 yards for a touchdown in 1996 against Ouachita Baptist. The school record interception return is 103 yards set in 1948 by former Wonder Boy **Carl Weatherton**.

UNA (4-0 overall, 3-0 GSC) tied the game at 7-all late in the first quarter on a 1-yard run by A.J. Milwee to complete a 7-play, 51-yard drive. The drive started after the Lions held Tech on downs after stopping senior running back **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.) for no gain on a fourth-and-one play.

In the second quarter, Tech took a 13-7 lead with a little over one minute remaining in the half as junior **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.) scored

STEVE MULLINS - HEAD COACH / ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

Steve Mullins is now his 11th season at the helm of the Wonder Boys. He enters Saturday's game with an overall record of 69-43 (.616) and a Gulf South Conference record of 57-34 (.626).

Since joining the sidelines as Tech's head coach in 1997, Mullins has brought the Wonder Boys into the upper echelon of the toughest NCAA Division II football conference in the country. He has led Tech to one Gulf South Championship (1999) and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory (2004).

Mullins enters the 2007 season as the second winningest active coach in terms of wins in the GSC and is the third winningest coach in Arkansas Tech's 93-year history of football.

Last season, Mullins led Tech to a 7-3 overall record and a 5-3 mark in the GSC. The seven wins was Mullins' sixth season of winning at least seven games with the Wonder Boys.

In 2004, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to the school's fourth-ever 10-win season and first since 1971 and led the squad to the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the second time in five seasons. In addition, Tech won its first ever playoff game at the Division II level and set the school record for total offense (4,949 yards).

For the season, Tech finished the season with a 10-2 record and an 8-1 mark in the Gulf South Conference, which led Mullins to be named the GSC and AFCA Division II Region Coach of the Year.

In his first two seasons at Tech, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to records of 4-7 in 1997 and 5-5 in 1998 before breaking through in 1999 with a 9-3 record and the school's first GSC Championship, which earned Mullins the league's Coach of the Year honor. The 1999 team featured three All-Americans and seven All-GSC selections.

Following the 1999 season, Mullins led Tech to records of 7-3 in 2000, including a 24-10 win over eventual national champion Delta State and 8-2 in 2001.

Since coming to Tech, Mullins' impact can't just be measured in mere wins and losses. In the past nine years, 38 Wonder Boys have been selected to the GSC All-Academic Team and 115 football players have qualified for the GSC Academic Honor Roll. In addition, 14 Wonder Boys have been named CoSIDA Academic All-District VI and four Tech players have received CoSIDA Academic All-American honors.

Along with that, five different Tech football players have been named to the GSC 'Top 10' Student-Athlete list and two Wonder Boys have received the GSC's Commissioner's Cup as the top male student-athlete in the league.

After six successful years at the helm of the football program, Mullins added the title of athletic director to his duties on April 16, 2003. In that capacity, he oversees the day-to-day operations of the athletic department and the school's 10 sport program.

Mullins began his Tech career in 1997 after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I-AA Northwestern State in Natchitoches, La.

Prior to Northwestern State, Mullins, the Camden, Ark., native, served for two seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State, two seasons as an assistant at Southwestern Oklahoma State and four years as an assistant coach at Lamar University.

The former University of Arkansas-Monticello defensive tackle began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Central Arkansas in 1981. As a player at UAM, Mullins was a three-time All-Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference selection, a three-time All-NAIA District 17 selection, a two-time NAIA All-American, an Associated Press Small College All-American as a senior in 1979 and is a member of the UAM Athletic Hall of Fame.

Mullins, who graduated from Camden [Ark.] High School in 1976, is married to the former Elizabeth (Liz) Morgan of Groves, Texas. The couple have three children, Katie (19), a sophomore at Tech, Hunter (16) and Mason (12).

Carter Hallock (Walnut Creek, Calif.), the third Tech signal caller of the night. Hallock's first career rushing touchdown completed a 6-play, 47-yard drive for the Wonder Boys. After holding UNA and forcing a punt with 43 seconds left in the game, Tech had a chance to a final game-

on a 5-yard run. The extra-point, though, by sophomore kicker **Travis Cockerham** (Bryant, Ark.) was missed. Ray, who began the game as a starting wide receiver, was playing quarterback for junior **Cole Barthel** (Decatur, Ala.), who was injured late in the second quarter. Prior to his injury, Barthel was 12-for-14 passing for 75 yards.

UNA, though, ended the half by connecting on a 27-yard field goal by Scott Shurden as time expired to cut Tech's halftime lead to 13-10. The field goal was set up following a 68-yard kickoff return by David McCants. McCants, who replaced injured UNA running back Tim Hicks on its first possession, finished the night with 100 yards rushing and also returned two kickoffs for 94 yards and caught three passes for 64 yards.

In the third quarter, UNA took the lead at 17-13 as Eric Denson returned a Tech fumble 31 yards for a touchdown and then the Lions pushed in front 24-13 on a 5-yard pass from Milwee to Reggie Hubbard with 6:21 left in the quarter. Milwee finished the night 27-for-35 passing for 251 yards.

The Lions lead grew to 27-13 just a little over a minute into the fourth quarter as Shurden connected on a 47-yard field goal. Shurden's field goal came 11 plays after Cockerham had his 28-yard field goal attempt blocked by **Antron Dillon** with 1:48 remaining in the third quarter.

Tech, though, rebounded as they pulled within 27-20 with 8:01 remaining in the game on a 2-yard touchdown run by junior quarterback

tying drive, but Hallock's pass to junior receiver **Landon Turner** (Desterhan, La.) from the UNA 43 yard line fell incomplete as time expired.

Hallock finished the night 8-for-14 for 62 yards, while Ray was 6-for-11 passing for 60 yards and also carried the ball 15 times for 55 yards and caught a 19-yard pass.

On the night, Tech's defense held the potent UNA offense to 326 yards. The Lions entered the game averaging 441 yards per game and 42.7 points per game.

"I thought our defense was outstanding tonight," the 11th-year Tech coach said. "They gave up two second half touchdowns, which came as a result of a fumble and missed field goal."

Tech's offense had a solid night as it collected 336 total yards in the game, including passing for 197 yards (26-for-39) and rushing for 139 yards. Junior receiver **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) paced the offense as he caught seven passes for a game-high 68 yards and also returned three kickoffs for 65 yards in the loss.

Both teams combined to record seven fumbles, as Tech lost two of its three fumbles and UNA lost one of its four fumbles on the night. In addition, both teams combined to commit 22 penalties for 196 yards. Tech had nine penalties for 83 yards and the Lions had 13 penalties for 113 yards.

season at Tech, stands tied for fifth with former Jacksonville State coach **Bill Burgess** (1985-92) all-time on the GSC career coaching victories list with 69. Former Mississippi College coach **John M. Williams** (1972-90) headlines the list with 124 wins, while former North Alabama head coach (1988-97) and current West Alabama coach **Bobby Wallace** is second on the list with 90 wins and former North Alabama coach **Wayne Grubb** (1977-87) is third with 82 all-time victories. Former Valdosta State coach **Chris Hatcher** is fourth with 76 wins, while former Delta State and Troy State coach **Rick Rhoades** (1985-87 and 2002-06) stands seventh on the list with 62 wins, while current Ouachita Baptist coach **Todd Knight** is eighth with 55 wins and former Jacksonville State coach **Jim Fuller** (1977-83) is ninth with 54 wins.

TECH THIRD WINNINGEST GSC TEAM SINCE

1999: Since 1999, Tech is the third winningest team in the GSC with 60 overall wins in 91 games and is also third in GSC wins with 49 over that same span. Valdosta State is the winningest team in the league since 2000 with 84 overall wins in 103 games and has recorded 61 GSC victories, while Delta State is second with 68 overall wins in 96 games and is second in GSC wins with 53.

In addition to being the third winningest team overall in the GSC since 1999, Tech is also tied with Division I-A Arkansas as the winningest football program at any level in the state of Arkansas over that same span with 60 wins. NCAA Division I-A FCS Central Arkansas is third with 57 wins, while Southern Arkansas is fourth with 49 wins and Harding is fifth with 47. NCAA Division I FCS Arkansas-Pine Bluff is in sixth place with 40 wins and is followed by NCAA Division I-A FCS Arkansas State with 35 victories and UAM is eighth with 33 wins. Henderson State is ninth with 29 wins and Ouachita Baptist is 10th with 27 wins round out the list.

OPENING THE SEASON AGAINST NORTH-WEST MISSOURI NOT ALL BAD:

Opening a season against Northwest Missouri State is not all bad as the last time Tech faced the Bearcats, in the 1999 opener, the Wonder Boys went on to finish the season with a 9-3 record and won their only GSC Football title and also earned the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff appearance. Following its 31-14 loss to the Bearcats that season, Tech won nine of its next 10 regular season games, including going 8-1 in GSC play to become the first Arkansas school to win a GSC football title. During league play, Tech collected home wins over both North Alabama (24-21) and Valdosta State (21-14), but suffered its only league loss at Delta State (17-10). The Wonder Boys ended the season by falling 40-28 at Carson-Newman in the first round of the D-II Playoffs.

DEFENSE HAS BEEN SOLID SO FAR THIS SEASON: Despite its 3-2 record, Tech's defense has been solid throughout most of this season. On the season, the Wonder Boys defense is allowing just 364 yards per game, which is sixth in the latest GSC statistics and they are allowing 21.6 points per game, which is fifth in the latest league statistics. Tech is allowing 243.2 yards passing and 120.8 yards rushing to their opponents. The Wonder Boys have recorded 38 tackles for 179 yards in losses and has had 14 quarterback sacks, which is second in the league and has forced nine fumbles and picked off five passes on the season.

VANHOOK NAMED PRESEASON ALL-GSC SELECTION: After earning First-Team All-GSC honors last season after rushing for 507 yards and scoring six touchdowns, senior running back **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.) enters his senior campaign as Tech's lone preseason All-GSC selection. Vanhook, who is 818 yards shy of becoming the fourth Wonder Boy to surpass the 3,000-yard career rushing plateau, was one of two running backs

named to the preseason offensive team and one of 15 returning First-Team All-GSC selections from last season. In addition to naming Vanhook a member of the Preseason All-GSC Team, junior offensive tackle **Jeremy Ashcraft** (Marshall, Texas), a transfer from East Texas Baptist University, was named to the league's Top Newcomers List. Ashcraft transferred to Tech before the beginning of the 2007 spring semester.

TECH COACHES NAME MVP'S FROM NORTH ALABAMA GAME: The Tech coaching staff named its MVP's from the North Alabama game this past Sunday.

The Offensive MVP honors went to sophomore offensive lineman **Torrence Wright** (Sulphur Springs, Texas). In the game against UNA, Wright graded out at 75 percent according to Tech Head Football Coach **Steve Mullins**. Wright, who played both left guard and center in the game, recorded two knockdown blocks against the Lions and helped Tech's offense gain 336 yards on 77 plays.

On defense, the coaches named junior linebacker **Cedric Cursh** (Foreman, Ark.) as its MVP. The Defensive MVP honor was the second of the season for Cursh as he was also named the Defensive MVP following Tech's 20-13 season-opening win at Northeastern State. Mullins said that Cursh graded out at 91 percent against the Lions after recording seven total tackles, including two tackles for loss, a

Ark.) is in his final season at Tech and is now just 718 yards shy of becoming just the fourth Wonder Boy to surpass the 3,000-yard rushing plateau. In his career, he has gained 2,282 yards (4.9 yards/carry) and has scored 25 total touchdowns, including 23 career rushing touchdowns. With his 25 touchdowns, Vanhook stands 12th on the school's career scoring chart with 152 points.

In Tech's 55-35 win last season at Ouachita Baptist, Vanhook gained 50 yards on the ground and became just the 11th player in Tech history to gain at least 2,000 rushing yards. Last season, he gained 507 yards (5.1 yards/carry) on the ground and scored six touchdowns. Vanhook's best season as a Wonder Boy came in as a red-shirt freshman in 2004 when he gained 1,089 yards (5.7 yards/carry) and scored 11 rushing touchdowns in helping Tech compile a 10-2 record. Vanhook has played in three games this season and has gained 100 yards on 18 carries and is averaging 5.6 yards per carry and has scored two touchdowns, including running 35 yards for a touchdown against Valdosta State.

CURSH MAKES RETURN TO FIELD: Tech's defense has already been bolstered this year by the return of the 2004 GSC Defensive Player of the Year, junior linebacker **Cedric Cursh** (Foreman, Ark.). Cursh, who sat out the past two seasons to deal with some off-the-field legal issues, has been a welcomed addition to a defense that returned just six starters from a year ago. As a sophomore in 2004, Cursh, who was also named an AP Little All-American, recorded 95 total tackles, including 21 tackles for loss, nine quarterback sacks, five forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and one interception as he helped lead the Wonder Boys to a 10-2 record and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory. In the NCAA Playoff victory against Catawba, Cursh finished with 10 tackles, including five solo stops and had two tackles for losses of nine yards, one sack, one forced fumble and recovered two fumbles enroute to earning National Defensive Player of the Week honors from *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*. His forced fumble and subsequent fumble recovery at Tech's 47-yard line with 38 seconds remaining in the game sealed Tech's 24-20 win over Catawba. Cursh enters Saturday's Delta State game with 15 career sacks, which

Cole Barthel and Tech assistant baseball coach **Wes McCrotty** share a common similarity. That similarity is that both of them were drafted in the 2001 Major League Baseball Draft, as Barthel was a second-round selection (71st pick overall) by the Atlanta Braves out of Decatur (Ala.) High School, while McCrotty, a graduate of Russellville High School, was drafted in the 23rd round (692nd overall) by the Florida Marlins after a stellar pitching career with the Arkansas Razorbacks.

puts him seventh on the school's career list and he has recorded 213 career tackles, including 116 solo stops and has had 33 career tackles for losses of 161 yards. On the season, Cursh leads the Wonder Boys with 34 total tackles, including collecting 21 solo stops and leads the GSC with four sacks and has forced two fumbles, broken up two passes and has had 5.0 tackles for 32 yards in losses.

SCORING STREAKS: Tech enters Saturday's game having scored in 36 straight games since being shutout 30-0 by Valdosta State in the next to last game of the 2003 season. In fact, since Mullins took over the program in 1997, Tech has failed to score in a game only twice and has scored in 125 of its last 127 games.

Meanwhile, Tech's opponents have scored in 49 consecutive games, including 12 of its last 24 opponents scoring 30-plus points, since the Wonder Boys held West Alabama scoreless on Nov. 2, 2002. In the last eight years, Tech has held only one opponent scoreless and has held 10 opponents under 10 points, including one opponent so far this season.

HALFTIME LEAD EQUALS WINS: Since Mullins took over the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, the Wonder Boys have been known as a second-half team as they are 53-4 when leading at halftime, but are just 3-2 this season after losing the past two games after leading at the half. In addition, the Wonder Boys are 58-3 when leading heading into the fourth quarter and are 4-1 in overtime during Mullins' tenure at Tech.

DANSBY NAMED GSC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: On Monday, Oct. 1, **Tario Dansby** was named the GSC Defensive Player of the Week after his play in last Saturday's 27-20 loss to third-ranked North Alabama. Dansby, a sophomore free safety from Ashdown, Ark., earns his first career honor from the league and becomes the third different Wonder Boy to earn Player of the Week honors this season as junior quarterback **Cole Barthel** has been named the league's Offensive Player of the Week two times (Northeastern State and West Georgia games) and redshirt junior punter **Michael Podobnik** (Frankfort, Ill.) earned Special Teams Player of the Week honors following the Texas College game. In last Saturday's game against the Lions, Dansby picked off an A.J. Milwee pass and returned it 98 yards for Tech's first touchdown with 10:53 remaining in the first quarter. The interception

return was the second-longest in Tech history, only **Carl Weatherton's** 103-yard return against Hendrix College in 1948 was longer. In addition, the interception was the longest for a Tech player since former Wonder Boy **Joseph Wright** returned an interception 68 yards against Ouachita Baptist in 1996. Along with the 98-yard interception return, Dansby also finished the game with five solo tackles.

BARTHEL HAS EARNED TWO GSC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS: On Monday, Sept. 17, **Cole Barthel** was named the GSC's Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season and third time in his Tech career as he was also honored this season on Sept. 3 following the Northeastern State game and was also honored following the Ouachita Baptist game on Oct. 23, 2006. Barthel's earns this week's honor after his record-setting performance in Tech's GSC opener against West Georgia last Saturday. Against UWG, Barthel accounted for seven touchdowns, including throwing for a Tech single-game school record six touchdowns in Tech's 52-34 win over the Wolves in Carrollton, Ga. With the six touchdown passes, Barthel became the 12th player in GSC history and also became the first Tech quarterback in the school's 93 year history to accomplish that feat. For the game, Barthel was 29-for-42 through the air for 310 yards and also carried

BARTHEL HONORED AS NATIONAL OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: In addition to earning GSC Offensive Player of the Week honors last week, Barthel was also honored as the co-National Offensive Player of the Week by D2Football.com and also was named the D-II National Offensive Player of the Week by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* following his record-setting performance against West Georgia. Barthel shared the offensive honor on D2Football.com with North Dakota running back **Ryan Chappell** and shared offensive honors with Chappell and Assumption running back **Herbert Woodard** in *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*. It was first National Player of the Week for Barthel since *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* honored him on Oct. 23, 2006, after the Ouachita Baptist game.

GSC HONORS PODOBNIK AS ITS SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK: On Monday, Sept. 10, redshirt junior **Michael Podobnik** was named the GSC's Special Teams Player of the Week after booting four punts for 178 yards and a 44.5 yard average in last Saturday's 21-6 win over Texas College. Against the Steers, Podobnik had a 56-yard punt and had one touchback in the game. He becomes the second consecutive Wonder Boy honored by the league this season after **Cole Barthel** took home the league's offensive honor the previous week.

RAY IS TECH'S DOUBLE-THREAT PLAYER: Junior **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.) has become one of Tech's most versatile players as he has played at both receiver and quarterback so far this season. On the season, Ray is 6-for-11 passing for 60 yards as a quarterback and has rushed 23 times for 67 yards with one touchdown, which came on a 5-yard run against UNA last Saturday and he has also caught eight passes for 136 yards, including a 48-yarder against Northeastern State. Ray split time at quarterback last season with Barthel and is expected to play more quarterback due to Barthel's season-ending knee injury suffered against UNA.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN: Tech had one player named a 2006 Preseason All-American by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* - senior defensive tackle **Andrew Murphy**.

As a junior in 2006, Murphy, who was named a Third-Team *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-Southeast Region selection, ranked sixth in the final NCAA D-II national football statistics in forced fumbles (0.4 per game) and recorded 38 total tackles, including 18 solo stops, 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 quarterback sacks. In addition, he forced four fumbles, had three fumble recoveries and an interception, which was returned 42

A native of Russellville, **Strasner** earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in journalism from Arkansas Tech in 2001 and a Master of Arts degree in multimedia journalism from Tech in 2006. He served as both a student assistant (1997-2001) and graduate assistant (2002-04) in the Tech sports information department under former Tech SID and CoSIDA Hall of Famer, **Larry Smith**.

Strasner currently serves as Director of Publications and Creative Services for University Relations at Arkansas Tech. He and his wife, Heather, live in Russellville.

Meanwhile, **Davis** serves as Tech's Director of Corporate and Athletic Relations in Tech's Development Office. Davis, who is a Russellville native, is married to Reta and the couple have two children, Will, a sophomore at Tech, who is a student assistant in Tech's SID office and Anna Grace, a 10th grader at Russellville High School.

yards for a touchdown against Valdosta State, which led to Murphy being named the GSC's Defensive Player of the Week.

Murphy, a native of Booneville, Miss., and a transfer from NE Mississippi Community College, was one of 20 GSC players named to the Preseason *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-American team.

This season's All-American team featured 154 players and was comprised of 86 seniors, 50 juniors and 18 sophomores from all four geographic regions of NCAA Division II.

QUINCY SKINNER NAMED TECH'S 28TH ALL-AMERICAN IN 2006: In his only season at Tech, cornerback **Quincy Skinner** (Coral Springs, Fla.) made quite an impression as the Florida Atlantic transfer became the school's 28th different Wonder Boy to earn All-American status and the 12th Wonder Boy to earn All-American recognition under Mullins. Skinner, who was a Second-Team All-GSC selection, finished last season ranked fifth nationally in Division II in interceptions (0.8 per game) and recorded 63 tackles, including a team-best 43 solo stops and had 2.5 tackles for loss, five pass break-ups, one fumble recovery, one forced fumble and defended 1.3 passes per game, which was 20th in the final D-II national statistics. Skinner became the third Wonder Boy to earn AFCA D-II Coaches' First-Team All-American honors and was the fifth-ever Tech player to be named an AP Little All-American as he was a third-team selection and also earned Third-Team *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-Southeast Region honors.

WONDER BOYS WELCOME NEW COORDINATORS THIS SEASON: For the first time since 2004, Tech enters a season with both a new offensive and defensive coordinator. During the offseason, Mullins

promoted **Benyard Jones** to defensive coordinator and brought in 18-year coaching veteran **Scott Preston** as the offensive coordinator. Jones, who is in his second tour of duty at Tech after spending five seasons from 1999-2004 at Tech as an assistant and then returning last season as the defensive line coach after spending the 2005 season as the defensive coordinator at Butler University, an NCAA Division I-AA member. Meanwhile, Preston brings a wealth of experience to Tech as he spent four seasons (2000-03) as the offensive coordinator, quarterback, running back and receivers coach at Illinois State University. In addition to Illinois State, Preston also had stints at Murray State University, Ventura [CA] College, Georgia Military College, San Francisco State and began his collegiate coaching career working with Hal Mumme at Valdosta State University.

Boys had a +0.6 margin for its 10 games. On the season, Tech's offense committed 22 turnovers as they had 11 interceptions and lost 11 fumbles, while its defense forced 14 fumbles and picked off 14 passes on the season. Tech was tied for the second in the GSC in turnover margin with Delta State. North Alabama led the league with a +0.7 margin as they committed 14 turnovers and forced 24 turnovers. So far this season, Tech has struggled taking care of the ball as they have 15 total turnovers, including 13 fumbles (losing seven of the them), while their opponents have had 12 fumbles (lost three of them) and have thrown four interceptions.

WONDER BOYS STRONG IN THE RED ZONE: Through the first five games this season, Tech is 15-for-17 in putting points on the scoreboard inside the red zone. On the season, the Wonder Boys have scored 15 touchdowns when they get inside the red zone (within 20 yards of the end zone), including scoring two times in three trips into the red zone in last Saturday's game against North Alabama. Last season, Tech was 28-for-35 (80 percent) in scoring chances inside the red zone

as they scored 24 touchdowns and had four field goals.

35 POINTS IS THE MAGIC NUMBER: Since taking the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, Coach Mullins' Tech teams are 25-2 all-time in games in which they score 35 or more points in a single game. In fact, Tech is 32-11 when it scores between 21-34 points during the Mullins era, including being 1-1 this season. Tech has won 23 straight games when scoring at least 35 or more points and hasn't lost since falling 53-36 to UCA in 1997 when scoring 35 or more points.

NOEL RACKING UP THE TACKLES: Senior line-backer **Zach Noel** (Paragould, Ark.) continues to climb up the school's career tackle charts. Noel enters Saturday's game with Delta State having recorded 188 total tackles, including 93 solo stops. In addition, he has had 8.0 tackles for 25 yards in losses and has picked off two passes, including one for a touchdown against Harding in 2005. In last Saturday's game against North Alabama, Noel had nine total tackles, including five solo stops.



BARTHEL IS AN ACE IN TWO SPORTS:

Sophomore **Cole Barthel**, who is in his second season at Tech after transferring from the University of Arkansas, was a second round draft pick (71st pick overall) in the 2001 Major League Draft by the Atlanta Braves out of high school. Barthel decided to forgo college originally (he signed a National Letter of Intent with the Razorbacks as a quarterback) and played four seasons in the Atlanta Braves organization as a third baseman, including playing two seasons in Rome, Ga., an A-level minor league affiliate of the Braves. In his four-year minor league career, Barthel hit .251 with five home runs and 36 RBIs. Last season as a freshman with the Razorbacks, Barthel went through spring drills and played in two games before leaving Fayetteville at the end of the first semester and enrolling at Tech. As a high school player, Barthel was selected as the North Alabama Player of the Year and was one of three finalists for the top back of the year and a finalist for the Class 6A Player of the Year as a senior after

throwing for 2,074 yards and 21 touchdowns on 269 passing attempts and also rushing for 700 yards. In addition, he was a three-time All-Area selection and was ranked 69th nationally among high school quarterbacks by Rivals100.com.

PODOBNIK IS PUNTING WEAPON FOR WONDER BOYS:

Through five games this season, redshirt junior **Michael Podobnik** is slowly becoming a huge weapon on special teams for the Wonder Boys. Podobnik has punted 20 times on the season and is averaging a GSC-best 45.9 yards per punt and has had four touchbacks and has downed four punts inside the 20-yard line. On the season, he has had seven punts travel over 50 yards, including a 75-yard punt in Tech's season-opener against Northeastern State.

CHILDRESS IS BECOMING TECH'S WORKHORSE ON THE GROUND:

Sophomore running back **Tim Childress** is becoming Tech's workhorse on the ground in his second season of competing for the Wonder Boys. Through five games this season, the Batesville, Ark., native has carried the ball 76 times for a team-leading 278 yards and is averaging 3.7 yards per carry and 55.6 yards per game overall, which ranks seventh in the latest GSC statistics. In addition, he has scored one touchdown, a 1-yard run in Tech's 21-6 win over Texas College and has caught 13 passes for 109 yards (8.4 yds/reception). As a redshirt freshman last season, Childress carried the ball 25 times for 80 yards in 10 games for the Wonder Boys.

STIGER LOOKING FOR MORE IN 2007:

Junior receiver and return specialist **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) is looking for more success on special teams this coming season. Stiger averaged 20.8 yards on 30 kickoff returns last season, despite missing the final two games of the season due to an injury. The 20.8 average was second in the GSC and helped Stiger earn Second-Team All-GSC honors. In addition to his kick returning, Stiger also averaged a team-best 118.6 all-purpose yards, which was fourth in the GSC and 38th nationally in NCAA Division II. On the season, he caught 32 passes for 319 yards (10.0 yards/reception) and scored five touchdowns. Stiger enters Saturday's DSU game having gained 2,753 all-purpose yards, including catching 68 passes for 641 yards, rushing for 340 yards on 93 carries and has returned 67 kickoffs for 1,414 yards (21.1 yards/return) and has scored 14 career touchdowns. On the season, Stiger has caught a team-

best 31 passes for 269 yards and has scored two touchdowns. In addition, he is averaging 134.6 all-purpose yards per game, which is ninth in the latest GSC statistics and is averaging 9.9 yards on punt returns.

NCAA RULES CHANGES FOR 2007 SEASON: In 2006, the NCAA changed the way it started the clock as it decided to start the game clock when the ball is kicked off, as opposed to previously starting the clock when the ball was touched legally in the field of play. This season, the NCAA has decided to abandon last year's new rule and return to the old clock rule that states, that on a kickoff, the game clock starts when the ball is touched legally in the field of play or crosses the goal line after the receiving team touches it in its end zone. In addition, on a change of possession, the clock will start on the snap of the ball. Other clock rules this season include that during televised games only, charged team timeouts will be one minute rather than 1:30. Another rule change this season is that teams will kickoff from its 30-yard line. Previously, the ball was kicked off from the 35. For fouls by the kicking team on kickoffs and punts (other than kick-catch interference), the receiving team has the option to tack on the penalty where it will subsequently have the ball. The receiving team still may choose to have the down replayed after enforcement of the penalty at the previous spot. A third rule change this season is that no defensive player in an attempt to block, bat or catch a kick may be picked up, elevated, propelled or pushed by a teammate. This is an addition to an existing rule, with "elevated, propelled or pushed" added a new language.

HISTORY MADE IN 2004: Tech Football made history in 2004 as the Wonder Boys won its first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff game with its 24-20 victory at Buerkle Field over Catawba. In addition, Tech was the first-ever team from the state of

Arkansas to host an NCAA Division II playoff game and they also was the first team from Arkansas to ever win an NCAA Division II playoff contest. The Wonder Boys, who finished with a 10-2 overall record in 2004, ended the season with its 42-24 loss at Albany State in the second round of the NCAA Playoffs. Prior to Tech's postseason win over Catawba, the Wonder Boys last postseason win came in 1971 against Northern State in the semifinals of the NAIA National Playoffs.

TECH UNVEILS NEW HELMETS, COLOR SCHEME THIS SEASON: During the offseason, Tech changed the color schemes for the school. Tech has switched from its traditional Green and Old Gold color to a Green (PMS 343) and Gold (PMS 116) scheme. The gold color is similar to the Green Bay Packers yellow that is worn on its helmets. With the change in colors, the Wonder Boys had to change its helmets this season from gold to yellow. In addition, they have added new uniforms for both home and away games this season.

TECH FINISHES 2006 RANKED 26TH IN ATTENDANCE: Despite playing all five of its home games last season at Russellville's Cyclone Stadium, Tech finished the year ranked 26th amongst 143 NCAA Division II teams in home attendance as the Wonder Boys averaged 5,467 for its five games at Cyclone Stadium. On the season, Tech had 27,336 fans attend their home contests. Fort Valley State led all of D-II in attendance with an average of 13,682 per game, while Tuskegee was second with an average of 11,195. UNA was the first GSC team ranked as they finished fourth with an average of 10,091 per game, while Delta State was 21st with an average of 6,030 per game and West Alabama was 22nd as they averaged 5,783 per game last season.

GSC RETURNS TO TELEVISION AGAIN IN 2007: For the third consecutive year, the GSC returns to live television this season.

This season's "GSC-TV Live" schedule features eight Thursday night contests, all of which will kick off at 7 p.m. CST and Tech's game with VSU, which will be aired on Saturday, Aug. 22 and will kickoff at 3 p.m. CST.

CSS will continue as the primary carrier for the "GSC-TV Live" games once again this season, bringing more than 5 million potential households, while Cox Sports (which is on channel 119 in Russellville) adds its 1.7 million customers to the mix for the second straight season. In addition, the GSC will also make the broadcasts available to other cable systems and open-air channels in non-conflicting areas, but the games will not be available on DirectTV or DishNetwork.

This year's "GSC-TV Live" package begins on Sept. 13 as defending GSC champion North Alabama plays at Harding. The

next broadcast is scheduled for Sept. 20 when West Alabama plays at Henderson State and is followed by Tech's home league opener against VSU on Sept. 22. Southern Arkansas' game at Delta State rounds out the first month of the schedule on Sept. 27.

In October, West Georgia's game at Henderson State on Oct. 4 opens up the coverage, followed by Delta State's game on Oct. 11 at Valdosta State. Following the VSU-DSU game, North Alabama's home game with Delta State will be aired on Oct. 18 and Arkansas-Monticello's game at West Alabama on Oct. 25 closes out the month.

The final two live television broadcasts are slated for Nov. 1 when Henderson State plays at Ouachita Baptist in its annual "Battle of the Ravine" match-up and the schedule concludes on Nov. 8 with West Georgia's game at Valdosta State.

TECH SCHEDULED FOR ONE GSC-LIVE TV GAME: As part of the "GSC-TV Live" Game of the Week Television package, Tech will have one its games broadcast on live television this season.

The Tech game selected for live television broadcast on the "GSC-TV Live" Game of the Week was last week's Valdosta State in Russellville. All of this year's "GSC-TV Live" broadcasts can be seen locally in the Russellville area on SuddenLink Digital Cable Channel 119 and also on SuddenLink Channel 2.

FORMER WONDER BOY JASON CAMPBELL SOARS IN FIRST SEASON OF ARENA FOOTBALL: Jason Campbell knows how to make a good first impression.

During his first season as a quarterback at Tech in 2004, Campbell threw for a school-record 2,922 yards and led the Wonder Boys to the second round of the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

Now, nearly three years later, Campbell has made a similar splash in the world of Arena Football while starting at quarterback for the 2007 Everett [Wash.] Hawks in his first season as a professional.

Campbell established new Everett franchise records for touchdown passes in a season (84) and passing yards in a season (3,663). In addition, he completed more than 60 percent of his passes during 2007 and ranked among the top 10 quarterbacks in AF2 (a developmental league under the Arena Football League umbrella) in passing efficiency.

And Campbell accomplished all of this despite the fact that he did not start until the fifth game of the season.

"It was rough at first because in Arena Football you have to get rid of the ball so fast," said Campbell. "I was in the shotgun most of the time at Arkansas Tech."

After seeing time as a back-up quarterback in Everett's first four games, he got his first start in week five. Campbell took advantage of the opportunity, throwing for 218 yards and five touchdowns to help the Hawks to their first win of the season.

Campbell went on to lead Everett to five more victories, including a three-game winning streak during the final month of the season. The Hawks finished their sea-

son on July 28 with a record of 6-10.

Victories were the norm when Campbell was at Tech. During his two years as the Wonder Boys' starting quarterback (2004-05), Tech accumulated an overall record of 17-5, including a 14-4 mark in GSC games. He completed his two-year Tech career with 5,100 yards of total offense (2nd-most in school history) and 5,079 passing yards (2nd-most in school history).

WHAT IS A WONDERBOY, YOU ASK?? Here is the story and history of the Wonder Boys. In 1919, Arkansas Tech's football team upset the highly-favored Jonesboro Aggies (now known as Arkansas State University) 14-0 behind a pair of 70-yard punt returns for touchdowns and two point-afters by a 17-year old quarterback by the name of **John Tucker**. The Jonesboro team had staked a claim to the mythical state football championship prior to the game.

Henry Loesch, the sports editor of the *Arkansas Gazette* in Little Rock, covered the game and coined the name "Wonder Boys" in complimenting the Tech team, then known as the Aggies, in his postgame story.

Tech's men's athletic teams have been known as the Wonder Boys ever since, and Tucker was thereafter labeled as "The Original Wonder Boy." Tucker went on to complete his education at the University of Alabama, but returned to Arkansas Tech and served in several capacities, including head football coach, athletics director and chemistry professor from 1925-72.

GREEN AND GOLD LUNCHEONS: The first of three Green and Gold Club Luncheons for 2007 was held on Monday, Aug. 20 at Western Sizzlin in Russellville and featured season previews by Mullins, Cross Country Coach **Tom Aspel** and Volleyball Coach **Kristy Bayer**. The next luncheon is scheduled for Oct. 22 and will serve as a preview of Tech 2007-08 men's and women's basketball seasons with Golden Suns first-year head coach **Dave Wilbers** and Wonder Boys second-year head coach **Mark Downey**.

Information includes updated schedules, rosters, statistics, results, current news releases, athlete bios and pre-game notes and press releases.

UP NEXT FOR TECH: Tech will conclude its two-game road swing on Saturday, Oct. 13, when they travel to Arkadelphia, Ark., to face Henderson State. Kickoff is set for 3 p.m. CDT at Carpenter-Haygood Stadium. Tech collected a 7-6 win in Russellville last season over the Reddies.
