TODAY'S GAME: Arkansas

Tech (4-3 overall / 2-3 GSC) returns home for **Homecoming 2007** on Saturday, Oct. 20 to face **Ouachita Baptist** (4-3, 2-3 GSC) in Gulf South Conference action at Buerkle Field (6,500/natural grass). Kickoff is set for 3 p.m. CDT.

Tech enters Saturday's game looking to continue its success against Arkansas' Division II schools as the Wonder Boys have won five straight over its in-state GSC foes and has won 14 of its last 17 games since 2004 against its in-state GSC rivals. Meanwhile, Ouachita Baptist enters the game looking to continue its stellar play as the Tigers have recorded its most wins since winning five games in 2003 and are fresh off a 38-17 win last Saturday at home over Southern Arkansas.

TECH RETURNS TO BUERKLE FIELD IN 2007:

After playing all five home games during the 2006 season at Russellville High School's Cyclone Stadium thanks to renovations on Tech's home stadium - Buerkle Field - as part of the school's \$4-million 'Return to Glory' capital campaign, the Wonder Boys returned to the renovated Buerkle Field when it played its first home game of the 2007 season on Sept. 8 against Texas College.

The 'Return to Glory' campaign raised money to support the construction of a residence hall as a wrap-around to the current football stadium, revitalization of the field, enhancements to the school's women's sports facilities and the addition of a permanent bandstand in the end zone for Tech's band. The new and improved Buerkle Field features a 226-bed residence hall, a new press box, controlled entrances to the stadium, new ticket booths, new concession stands, revamped restroom facilities, an auxiliary bookstore for the sale of Tech spirit merchandise, a new and improved scoreboard and four new and improved field lights.

THE AIR: Every Tech football game can be heard once again this season on the flagship station of Tech Athletics, **KWKK** (100.9 FM) in Russellville. Former Tech Assistant SID **Sam Strasner** provides the play-by-play with **Kelly Davis**, Tech's Director of Corporate and Athletic Relations alongside for the color commentary. The radio broadcasts begin 30 minutes prior the opening kickoff with the **Steve Mullins Pregame Show**.

Tech Talk is a 30-minute sports show devoted to Arkansas Tech athletics that airs each Monday night during the school year beginning at 6:30 p.m. on **KWKK** (100.9 FM) and also on the internet. The show, hosted by **Johnny Story**, features Tech coaches discussing their teams, a review of previous games, upcoming opponents and other news. The next show is scheduled for Oct. 15 and will feature Mullins and Tech Volleyball Coach **Kristy Bayer**.



THE COACHES: The Wonder Boys are coached by **Steve Mullins** (Ark.-Monticello, '80). Mullins is 70-44 in his 11th season as head coach and is 58-35 all-time in GSC games. Tech's assistant coaches for 2007 are: **Benyard Jones** (defensive coordinator/linebackers), **Scott Preston** (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks & running backs), **Les Boyum** (offensive line), **Erik Kruppe** (defensive line), **Ryan Wallace** (receivers), **Greg Williams** (defensive backs), **Brett Hobbs** (GA/linebackers), **Andrew Jackson** (SA/secondary), **Garren Rockwell** (GA/defensive line), **Kyle Shipp** (GA/offensive line) and **Antonio Whitfield** (GA/receivers). The Tigers are coached by **Todd Knight** (Ouachita Baptist, '86). Knight is 28-58 in his ninth season at his alma mater and is 56-90-2 in his 15th season as a collegiate head coach. Ouachita Baptist's assistant coaches for 2007 are: **Jay Derby** (offensive coordinator/quarterbacks), **Shane Handy** (defensive coordinator/defensive backs), **Osita Alaribe** (outside linebackers), **Tim Baker** (defensive line), **J.R. Eldridge** (inside linebackers), **Landon Keopple** (wide receivers) and **Brett Shockley** (offensive line).

THE OUACHITA BAPTIST SERIES: Saturday's game against Ouachita Baptist marks the 74th meeting all-time in the series that dates back to 1924, with Tech leading the series, 41-26-7. Tech has won four straight and 12 of the last 13 games in the series, including collecting last season's 55-35 win in Arkadelphia. Tech, who has won six straight

games in the series in Russellville, leads the series, 19-10-4 in Russellville and leads 20-13-2 in Arkadelphia, while OBU leads the series, 3-2-1 on neutral fields.

TECH IN HOME GSC GAMES:

Since joining the GSC in 1995, Tech is 30-15 all-time at home in GSC games and has won 11 of its last 15 at home in league play, with the only losses coming in the 2005 finale to Central Arkansas, in 2006 to Delta State and this season to Valdosta State and North Alabama. Last season, Tech was 3-1 at home in league play and is 22-10 at home in GSC play since the beginning of the 2000 season.

LAST GAME vs. OUACHITA BAPTIST:

In its last game against Ouachita Baptist on Oct. 21, 2006, at A.U. Williams Field in Arkadelphia, Tech scored two touchdowns in every quarter and racked up 571 yards in total offense in collecting a 55-35 win over the Tigers to spoil its homecoming. In the game, junior quarterback **Cole Barthel** (Decatur, Ala.) tied a then single-game record with five touchdown passes and finished the game 25-for-30 passing for 321 yards and threw touchdowns to four different receivers. Tech, who led 27-14 at the half, used a 6-yard touchdown run by senior running back **R.J. Vanhook** (Prescott, Ark.) late in the third quarter to push in front 41-28. Vanhook's score completed a six play, 72-yard drive. In the fourth quarter, Tech put the game away as **Shawn O'Connor** capped a five play drive with a 5-yard touchdown run. Tech's drive was set

up by a fumble from OBU senior running back **Willie Hopson**, which was returned 60 yards by linebacker **Anthony Robinson** and then the Wonder Boys sealed the win on its next possession as Barthel hit **Mark Caldwell** for a 24-yard touchdown pass. In the game, Caldwell caught seven passes for 103 yards and scored two touchdowns, while Vanhook carried the ball 12 times for 93 yards and junior quarterback **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.) rushed 10 times for 37 yards and was 2-for-3 passing for 52 yards. Meanwhile, OBU's offense gained 573 yards for the game, including senior quarterback **Lance Parker** going 35-for-52 passing for 478 yards, but threw two interceptions and had two touchdowns. In addition to Parker, Hopson caught 10 passes for 106 yards and also rushed the ball 12 times for 48 yards, while **Bruce Steele** caught nine passes for 115 yards and senior receiver **Tony Taylor** had six catches for 113 yards for the Tigers.

ABOUT THE OUACHITA BAPTIST TIGERS: Ouachita Baptist enters its third GSC road contest of the season sporting a 4-3 overall record and a 2-3 mark in the league after collecting a 38-17 win Saturday at home over Southern Arkansas. The SAU victory snapped a three-game losing skid for the Tiegars against the three ranked teams (Delta State, Valdosta State and North Alabama) in the league. The Tigers, who returns 18 starters and 31 lettermen from last season's 2-8 team that finished 1-7 in the

GSC, enter the Tech game with the most wins in a season since winning five games in 2003. Since 2004, OBU has gone a combined 10-26, including going 6-23 from 2004-06. OBU is one of the top teams in the league on offense as they are averaging 354.7 yards per game and lead the league in time of possession as they control the ball for almost 32 minutes per game. In addition to its offense, the Tigers are fourth in the league in passing defense (196 yards per game) and are third in the league in punting (35.0 yards/punt). Leading the way for OBU on offense is quarterback **Lance Parker**. Parker is 124-for-229 passing for 1,370 yards and has tossed 10 touchdowns and thrown four interceptions. Parker is averaging 207.9 passing yards per game and is averaging 194.1 yards in total offense, which is fifth in the latest GSC statistics. In addition to Parker, other strong performers on offense include **Willie Hopson** leads the GSC in rushing as he has gained 749 yards on 155 carries and has scored six times and is averaging a team and GSC-best 170.6 all-purpose yards per game and junior receiver **Julius Pruitt**, who has caught 37 passes for 558 yards (15.1 yards/reception) and has scored six touchdowns and is averaging 81.6 receiving yards per game, which is third in the league. One of OBU's biggest strengths is its special teams as senior punter **Craig McFarlin** is averaging 40.7 yards per punt, which is third in the league and junior kicker **Zach Wright** is 7-for-9 on field goals and is a perfect

(19-for-19) on extra points. Hopson is averaging 22.2 yards per kickoff return and **Tony Taylor** is third in the league in punt returns (6.3 yards/return). Meanwhile, on defense, the Tigers have recorded 42 tackles for loss, 15 sacks and have forced seven fumbles and picked off four passes. Leading the way for the defense is senior middle linebacker **Cliff Gardner**, who has recorded 52 total tackles and has forced two fumbles, while senior linebacker **Michael Blackwell** has had 42 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss. Sophomore defensive end **Channing Hill** has had 38 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss and 5.5 quarterback sacks, freshman defensive end **Bryan Church** has had 24 total tackles, of which, 10 have been for losses and he has had three sacks and freshman defensive tackle **Jerry McNeil** has recorded 26 tackles, 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 sacks on the season.

ON THIS DATE:

Tech has played just 12 previous football games on Oct. 20 and Saturday's contest with Ouachita Baptist is the first game on Oct. 20 since Tech played at Southern Arkansas in Magnolia in 2001, a game SAU won 28-25. Tech is 6-5-1 all-time on Oct. 20, but has lost two straight games on that date and hasn't won on Oct. 20 since defeating UAM, 7-0, at home in 1984. Ironically, Tech's highest scoring game in school history happened on Oct. 20 as Tech scored 118 points at home against Southern Arkansas in 1922.

TECH RECORDS 500TH ALL-TIME WIN: In its win last season on Oct. 27, 2006, at Southern Arkansas, the Wonder Boys made history as they became just the 11th NCAA Division II program to win 500 football games all-time. Since beginning football in 1911, Tech has compiled a 505-320-41 all-time record and is the 11th all-time winningest D-II football program. In addition, Tech is just the second football program in the state of Arkansas to record at least 500 all-time wins, as the Arkansas Razorbacks have won 641 games in 115 seasons of competition.

The Wonder Boys, who received five votes in the AFCA D-II Coaches Preseason poll, received no votes in this week's eighth poll and continues to be unranked in this week's D2Football.com Top 25 poll, but is ranked 34th this week in *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* Top 40 Poll.

TECH IS 11TH ON D-II ALL-TIME WINNINGEST TEAMS LIST:

Since beginning football 93 years ago, Tech stands in 11th place on the list of all-time winningest NCAA Division II football programs. Tech has recorded 504 wins all-time entering Saturday's Delta State game and the Wonder Boys are one

of 12 schools to win at least 495 all-time games. Tech enters Saturday's contest with a 504-320-41 all-time record, winning nearly 61 percent of their 865 games.

Pittsburg [KS] State headlines the list of all-time winningest programs with 69 wins, while Tuskegee [AL] is second all-time with 593 wins. North Dakota is third with 586 wins, while Central Oklahoma is fourth with 578 and Hillsdale [MI] is fifth in wins all-time with 559. Texas A&M-Kingsville is sixth all-time with 549 wins, Carson-Newman is seventh with 527 wins and Truman [Mo.] State is eighth with 518 all-time wins. Northern State is ninth with 511 all-time victories, while West Chester is 10th with 510 wins and Virginia Union is 12th with 499 wins.

TECH RANKS 21ST IN PRE-SEASON LINDY'S MAGAZINE DIVISION II POLL:

Lindy's Annual Preseason Football Magazine has high hopes for the Wonder Boys this season as the publication ranked Tech 21st in the its preseason Division II poll. Tech was one of five GSC squads ranked in the D-II poll. Delta State headlines the contingent of GSC teams ranked as the Statesmen are ranked seventh, while Valdosta State is ranked eighth, North Alabama checks in at No. 16 and Henderson State is ranked 23rd

STEVE MULLINS - HEAD COACH / ATHLETIC DIRECTOR

University of Arkansas-Monticello, 1980 (B.S. Science)

University of Central Arkansas, 1982 (M.Ed. Physical Education)

Steve Mullins is now his 11th season at the helm of the Wonder Boys. He enters Saturday's game with an overall record of 70-44 (.614) and a Gulf South Conference record of 58-35 (.624).

Since joining the sidelines as Tech's head coach in 1997, Mullins has brought the Wonder Boys into the upper echelon of the toughest NCAA Division II football conference in the country. He has led Tech to one Gulf South Championship (1999) and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory (2004).

Mullins enters the 2007 season as the second winningest active coach in terms of wins in the GSC and is the third winningest coach in Arkansas Tech's 93-year history of football.

Last season, Mullins led Tech to a 7-3 overall record and a 5-3 mark in the GSC. The seven wins was Mullins' sixth season of winning at least seven games with the Wonder Boys.

In 2004, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to the school's fourth-ever 10-win season and first since 1971 and led the squad to the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the second time in five seasons. In addition, Tech won its first ever playoff game at the Division II level and set the school record for total offense (4,949 yards).

For the season, Tech finished the season with a 10-2 record and an 8-1 mark in the Gulf South Conference, which led Mullins to be named the GSC and AFCA Division II Region Coach of the Year.

In his first two seasons at Tech, Mullins led the Wonder Boys to records of 4-7 in 1997 and 5-5 in 1998 before breaking through in 1999 with a 9-3 record and the school's first GSC Championship, which earned Mullins the league's Coach of the Year honor. The 1999 team featured three All-Americans and seven All-GSC selections.

Following the 1999 season, Mullins led Tech to records of 7-3 in 2000, including a 24-10 win over eventual national champion Delta State and 8-2 in 2001.

Since coming to Tech, Mullins' impact can't just be measured in mere wins and losses. In the past nine years, 38 Wonder Boys have been selected to the GSC All-Academic Team and 115 football players have qualified for the GSC Academic Honor Roll. In addition, 14 Wonder Boys have been named CoSIDA Academic All-District VI and four Tech players have received CoSIDA Academic All-American honors.

Along with that, five different Tech football players have been named to the GSC 'Top 10' Student-Athlete list and two Wonder Boys have received the GSC's Commissioner's Cup as the top male student-athlete in the league.

After six successful years at the helm of the football program, Mullins added the title of athletic director to his duties on April 16, 2003. In that capacity, he oversees the day-to-day operations of the athletic department and the school's 10 sport program.

Mullins began his Tech career in 1997 after spending seven seasons as an assistant coach at NCAA Division I-AA Northwestern State in Natchitoches, La.

Prior to Northwestern State, Mullins, the Camden, Ark., native, served for two seasons as an assistant coach at Northwest Missouri State, two seasons as an assistant at Southwestern Oklahoma State and four years as an assistant coach at Lamar University.

The former University of Arkansas-Monticello defensive tackle began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at the University of Central Arkansas in 1981. As a player at UAM, Mullins was a three-time All-Arkansas Intercollegiate Conference selection, a three-time All-NAIA District 17 selection, a two-time NAIA All-American, an Associated Press Small College All-American as a senior in 1979 and is a member of the UAM Athletic Hall of Fame.

Mullins, who graduated from Camden [Ark.] High School in 1976, is married to the former Elizabeth (Liz) Morgan of Groves, Texas. The couple have three children, Katie (19), a sophomore at Tech, Hunter (16) and Mason (12).



second straight game against the 11th-ranked defense in the latest D-II statistics, but used two blocked punts for touchdowns and four second-half interceptions by the Reddies to complete the comeback win and snap its three-game losing skid. In addition, the victory was Tech's fifth straight dating to last season against Arkansas Division II schools and its fourth straight over the Reddies.

"I thought our defense and our special teams played tremendous and were the difference today," Tech Head Football Coach **Steve Mullins** said. "We knew coming in with our offense in transition, it was going to be a fight to score points and I'm extremely proud of the team for hanging in there and playing with a lot of heart."

After allowing 20 points and 263 yards in total offense in the first half, Tech's defense stepped up in the second half as it forced HSU quarterbacks Garrett Manning and Roch Charpentier to throw four interceptions, including two picks by junior defensive back **Tito Jose** (San Diego, Calif.) and hold the Reddies to 192 yards of offense. Both of Jose's interceptions thwarted HSU scoring drives.

"Our defense was outstanding," the 11th-year Tech coach said.

Trailing 20-14 midway through the fourth quarter, redshirt freshman linebacker **Ronderrick Jackson** (Bossier City, La.) broke free and blocked a Garrett Manning punt. The blocked punt was recovered in the end zone by sophomore free safety **Tario Dansby** (Ashdown, Ark.) to give Tech a game-tying touchdown.

The extra-point by junior **Michael Podobnik** (Frankfort, Ill.) was good to give the Wonder Boys a 21-20 lead with a little more than five minutes remaining in the game.

Following the blocked punt, Tech forced another turnover as senior defensive back **Jonathan Webster** (Batesville, Ark.) picked off a Charpentier pass with 5:14 left in the contest. The interception was the Reddies' fourth of the game. After Tech turned the ball over on downs with 2:22 left in the game, the Wonder Boys defense sealed Tech's win as they forced four consecutive incompletions by Charpentier from Tech's 37-yard line, including senior linebacker **Zach Noel** (Paragould, Ark.) knocking down the fourth-down pass intended for Kevin Austin.

The Reddies opened the game's scoring by taking the opening possession and driving 70 yards in 9 plays and scored on a 15-yard run by Greg Godfrey, but the extra point by Bryan Mattox was blocked to give HSU a 6-0 lead. Tech got on the scoreboard thanks to its special teams as redshirt freshman linebacker **Danny Martin** (Tulsa, Okla.) blocked a Manning punt and freshman defensive back **Terrance Boykin** (Wynne, Ark.) fell on the ball in the end zone for a touchdown to give Tech a 7-6 lead. The blocked punt return for a touchdown was Tech's first for a touchdown since **Jeremy Lawson** returned a blocked punt 30 yards for a score against Henderson State in 2000.

The Reddies retook the lead with 11 seconds left in the first quarter as Troy Perry scored on a

13-yard pass from Charpentier and then added the two-point conversion when Charpentier hit Sean Stennis. In the second quarter, HSU's lead grew to 20-7 as Bernard Palmer scored on a 3-yard run, but the Wonder Boys blocked Mattox's extra point for the

second time in the game.

gained, 455 to 140, but HSU committed five turnovers and were penalized 10 times for 73 yards. Last week, Tech's offense was held to 145 yards and 14 points against eighth-ranked Delta State.

NCAA ANNOUNCES DECISION IN NORTHWEST MISSOURI STATE GAME: On Sept. 4, the NCAA announced that the result of its Aug. 23 game at Northwest Missouri State, which was limited to less than a quarter due to severe lightning and storms, was decided on a conference call on Friday, August 31 between the NCAA and the institutions. It was agreed on this call, which was coordinated by the NCAA, that the game was terminated and, therefore, neither school will be credited with a win or a loss. Play was terminated with two minutes and 30 seconds remaining in the first quarter.

NCAA statistics policies for football require at least three quarters of competition for inclusion, which was part of the rationale in making the decision. Input from both institutions and conferences, as well as the NCAA Football Rules Committee and NCAA Division II Football Committee were considered during the conference call.

DANSBY MAKES WAY ONTO SCHOOL'S RECORD BOOK: In Tech's 27-20 loss to North Alabama on Sept. 29, sophomore free safety **Tario Dansby** returned an A.J. Milwee interception 98 yards for a touchdown just a little over four minutes into the contest to give Tech a 7-0 lead. The interception return was the second

longest in school history and the longest interception return since **Joseph Wright** had a 69-yard return during the 1996 season. Former Wonder Boy **Carl Weatherton** holds the school's interception return record of 103 yards, which occurred in 1948 against Hendrix College.

TECH IN OCTOBER: Saturday's game marks the Wonder Boys 380th game all-time in the month of October. Tech is 226-133-20 all-time in games during the month, including winning 11 of its last 15 games in the month. Mullins is 28-16 all-time in the month of October as a head coach.

PRESEASON GSC POLL TABS TECH SIXTH: Tech was tabbed to finish sixth in the pre-season Gulf South Conference Coaches Poll, which was released on July 31. Tech received 55 points in the poll that was voted on by the league's head coaches and the coaches couldn't vote for their own teams. In the poll, Tech received three votes for fourth, two votes each for fifth and sixth

place and three votes for seventh. Defending GSC champion North Alabama was tabbed as the preseason favorite for the second consecutive season as the Lions garnered 95 points and six of a possible 11 first-place votes. Valdosta State was picked second as they received 89 points and three first-place votes, while Delta State was tabbed third as the Statesmen received 84 points and a first place vote. Henderson State was picked fourth as they earned 75 points and the final first place vote, while Harding was tabbed to finish one spot in front of Tech as the Bisons earned 56 points. Behind Tech in the poll was West Alabama (54 points), Southern Arkansas (33 points), West Georgia (30 points), Ouachita Baptist (19 points) and Arkansas-Monticello (15 points).

TECH STRONG AGAINST ARKANSAS' GSC SCHOOLS: Since Mullins took over the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, he has led the Wonder Boys to a 34-16 record against Arkansas' GSC schools, including being 14-3 since the 2004 season. The Wonder Boys have won five straight games against Arkansas' GSC schools. Prior to Mullins' arrival in 1997, Tech went 24-37-1 against Arkansas schools from 1986-96.

MULLINS FIFTH ON GSC CAREER COACHING WINS LIST: Mullins, who is in his 11th season at Tech, stands fifth all-time on the GSC career coaching victories list with 70. Former Mississippi College coach **John M. Williams** (1972-90) headlines the list with 124 wins, while former North Alabama head coach (1988-97) and current West Alabama coach **Bobby Wallace** is second on the list with 90 wins and former North Alabama coach **Wayne Grubb** (1977-87) is third with 82 all-time victories. Former Valdosta State coach **Chris Hatcher** is fourth with 76 wins, while former Jacksonville State coach **Bill Burgess** (1985-92) is sixth on the list with 69 wins and former Delta State and Troy State coach **Rick Rhodes** (1985-87 and 2002-06) stands seventh on the list with 62 all-time wins. Rounding out the list is current Ouachita Baptist coach **Todd Knight** at No. 8 with 56 wins and former Jacksonville State coach **Jim Fuller** (1977-83) is ninth with 54 wins.

TECH THIRD WINNINGEST GSC TEAM SINCE 1999: Since 1999, Tech is the third winningest team in the GSC with 61 overall wins in 93 games and is also third

in GSC wins with 50 over that same span. Valdosta State is the winningest team in the league since 2000 with 85 overall wins in 105 games and has recorded 62 GSC victories, while Delta State is second with 70 overall wins in 98 games and is second in GSC wins with 55.

In addition to being the third winningest team overall in the GSC since 1999, Tech is tied with Division I FBS Arkansas as the winningest football program at any level in the state of Arkansas over that same span with 61 wins. NCAA Division I-A FCS Central Arkansas is third with 59 wins, while Southern Arkansas is fourth with 49 wins and Harding is fifth with 48. NCAA Division I FCS Arkansas-Pine Bluff is in sixth place with 40 wins and is followed by NCAA Division I FBS Arkansas State with 36 victories and UAM is eighth with 33 wins. Henderson State is ninth with 30 wins and Ouachita Baptist is 10th with 28 wins to complete the list.

OPENING THE SEASON AGAINST NORTH-WEST MISSOURI NOT ALL BAD: Opening a season against Northwest Missouri State is not all bad as the last time Tech faced the Bearcats, in the 1999 opener, the Wonder Boys went on to finish the season with a 9-3 record and won their only GSC Football title and also earned the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff

appearance. Following its 31-14 loss to the Bearcats that season, Tech won nine of its next 10 regular season games, including going 8-1 in GSC play to become the first Arkansas school to win a GSC football title. During league play, Tech collected home wins over both North Alabama (24-21) and Valdosta State (21-14), but suffered its only league loss at Delta State (17-10). The Wonder Boys ended the season by falling 40-28 at Carson-Newman in the first round of the D-II Playoffs.

DEFENSE HAS BEEN SOLID SO FAR THIS SEASON: Despite its 4-3 record, Tech's defense has been solid throughout most of this season. On the season, the Wonder Boys defense is allowing just 397.4 yards per game, which is seventh in the latest GSC statistics and they are allowing 24.4 points per game, which is fifth in the latest league statistics. Tech is allowing 244.7 yards passing and 152.7 yards rushing to their opponents. The Wonder Boys

have recorded 49 tackles for 220 yards in losses and has had 18 quarterback sacks, which is second in the league and has forced 14 fumbles and picked off 10 passes on the season and has returned them for 248 yards.

TECH COACHES NAME MVP'S FROM NORTH ALABAMA GAME: The Tech coaching staff named its MVP's from the Henderson State game this past Sunday.

The defensive MVP honors went to junior defensive back **Tito Jose** (San Diego, Calif.). In Saturday's 21-20 come from behind win over the Reddies, Jose, a transfer from Mesa [CA] Community College, graded out at 88 percent according to Tech Head Football Coach **Steve Mullins**. Against the Reddies, Jose recorded three total tackles, including a solo stop and picked off two HSU passes. The two interceptions, one of which was returned 54 yards in the third quarter, thwarted two possible Reddie scoring drives. Jose leads Tech with five interceptions this season.

On special teams, the coaches awarded MVP honors to redshirt freshman linebacker **Ronderrick Jackson** (Bossier City, La.). Jackson helped Tech earn its comeback win as he blocked a Garrett Manning punt with 5:23 remaining in the game. The punt was recovered in the end zone by sophomore free safety **Tario Dansby** for a touchdown to give Tech a 21-20 lead. The blocked punt was one of four kick blocks in the game for the

CAREER RUSHING CHART: R.J. Vanhook is in his final season at Tech and is just 711 yards shy of becoming just the fourth Wonder Boy to surpass the 3,000-yard rushing plateau. In his career, he has gained 2,289 yards (4.7 yards/carry) and has scored 27 total touchdowns, including 25 career rushing touchdowns. With his 27 touchdowns, Vanhook stands 12th on the school's career scoring chart with 164 points. In Tech's 55-35 win last season at Ouachita Baptist, Vanhook gained 50 yards on the ground and became just the 11th player in Tech history to gain at least 2,000 rushing yards. Last season, he gained 507 yards (5.1 yards/carry) on the ground and scored six touchdowns. Vanhook's best season as a Wonder Boy came in as a redshirt freshman in 2004 when he gained 1,089 yards (5.7 yards/carry) and scored 11 rushing touchdowns in helping Tech compile a 10-2 record. This season, Vanhook has played in five games and has gained 107 yards on 40 carries and is averaging 2.7 yards per carry and has scored a team-best four touchdowns, including running one yard for a touchdown in his last game against Henderson State.

CURSH MAKES RETURN TO FIELD: Tech's defense has already been bolstered this year by the return of the 2004 GSC Defensive Player of the Year, junior linebacker **Cedric Cursh** (Foreman, Ark.). Cursh, who sat out the past two seasons to deal with some off-the-field legal issues, has been a welcomed addition to a defense that returned just six starters from a year ago. As a sophomore in 2004, Cursh, who was also named an AP Little All-American, recorded 95 total tackles, including 21 tackles for loss, nine quarterback sacks, five forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and one interception as he helped lead the Wonder Boys to a 10-2 record and the school's first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff victory. In the NCAA Playoff victory against Catawba, Cursh finished with 10 tackles, including five solo stops and had two tackles for losses of nine yards, one sack, one forced fumble and recovered two fumbles enroute to earning National Defensive Player of the Week honors from *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*. His forced fumble and subsequent fumble recovery at Tech's 47-yard line with 38 seconds remaining in the game sealed Tech's 24-20 win over Catawba. He enters Saturday's Ouachita Baptist game with 16 career sacks, which puts him tied for fourth on the school's career list and he has recorded 222 career tackles, including 122 solo stops and has had 35 career tackles

for losses of 171 yards. On the season, Cursh is second on the team with 43 total tackles, including collecting 27 solo stops and leads the GSC with five sacks and has forced two fumbles, broken up two passes and has had a team-best 7.0 tackles for 42 yards in losses.

SCORING STREAKS: Tech enters Saturday's game having scored in 38 straight games since being shutout 30-0 by Valdosta State in the next to last game of the 2003 season. In fact, since Mullins took over the program in 1997, Tech has failed to score in a game only twice and has scored in 127 of its last 129 games.

Meanwhile, Tech's opponents have scored in 51 consecutive games, including 13 of its last 26 opponents scoring 30-plus points, since the Wonder Boys held West Alabama scoreless on Nov. 2, 2002. In the last eight years, Tech has held only one opponent scoreless and has held 10 opponents under 10 points, including one opponent, Texas College, so far this season.

HALFTIME LEAD EQUALS WINS: Since Mullins took over the

reigns of the Tech program in 1997, the Wonder Boys have been known as a second-half team as they are 53-4 when leading at halftime, but are just 3-2 this season when leading the half as they lost to North Alabama and Valdosta State when holding the halftime lead. In addition, the Wonder Boys are 58-3 when leading heading into the fourth quarter and are 4-1 in overtime during Mullins' tenure at Tech.

GSC HONORS JOSE AS ITS DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK:

On Monday, Oct. 15, **Tito Jose** was named the GSC Defensive Player of the Week after his play in Tech's 21-20 come-from-behind win last Saturday at Henderson State. Jose, a junior from San Diego, Calif., earns his first career honor from the league and becomes the fourth different Wonder Boy to earn Player of the Week honors this season as junior quarterback **Cole Barthel** has been named the league's Offensive Player of the Week two times (Northeastern State and West Georgia games), redshirt junior punter **Michael Podobnik** earned Special Teams Player of the Week honors following the Texas College game and sophomore free safety **Tario Dansby** (Ashdown, Ark.) was named the Defensive Player of the Week following the North Alabama game. In last Saturday's game against the Reddies, Jose picked off two HSU passes and broke up another pass attempt. Both of Jose's interceptions came inside Tech's 12-yard line and thwarted possible HSU scoring drives, including returning one interception 54 yards in the third quarter. In addition to the two interceptions, Jose also had three total tackles in the game, including one solo stop.

JOSE HAS A NOSE FOR THE FOOTBALL:

Through seven games, **Tito Jose** has developed a nose for the football as he has picked off a GSC-best five passes on the season and is averaging 0.71 interceptions per game. In addition to leading the league in interceptions, Jose stands 28th in the latest NCAA D-II National statistics in that same category. Jose

DANSBY NAMED GSC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: On Monday, Oct. 1, **Tario Dansby** was named the GSC Defensive Player of the Week after his play in last Saturday's 27-20 loss to third-ranked North Alabama. Dansby, a sophomore free safety from Ashdown, Ark., earns his first career honor from the league and becomes the third different Wonder Boy to earn Player of the Week honors this season as junior quarterback **Cole Barthel** has been named the league's Offensive Player of the Week two times (Northeastern State and West Georgia games) and redshirt junior punter **Michael Podobnik** (Frankfort, Ill.) earned Special Teams Player of the Week honors following the Texas College game. In last Saturday's game against the Lions, Dansby picked off an A.J. Milwee pass and returned it 98 yards for Tech's first touchdown with 10:53 remaining in the first quarter. The interception return was the second-longest in Tech history, only **Carl Weatherton's** 103-yard return against Hendrix College in 1948 was longer. In addition, the interception was the longest for a Tech player since former Wonder Boy **Joseph Wright** returned an interception 68 yards against Ouachita Baptist in 1996. Along with the 98-yard interception return, Dansby also finished the game with five tackles.

BARTHEL HAS EARNED TWO GSC OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK HONORS: On Monday, Sept. 17, **Cole Barthel** was named the GSC's Offensive Player of the Week for the second time this season and third time in his Tech career as he was also honored this season on Sept. 3 following the Northeastern State game and was also honored following the Ouachita Baptist game on Oct. 23, 2006. Barthel's earns this week's honor after his record-setting performance

in Tech's GSC opener against West Georgia last Saturday. Against UWG, Barthel accounted for seven touchdowns, including throwing for a Tech single-game school record six touchdowns in Tech's 52-34 win over the Wolves in Carrollton, Ga. With the six touchdown passes, Barthel became the 12th player in GSC history and also became the first Tech quarterback in the school's 93 year history to accomplish that feat. For the game, Barthel was 29-for-42 through the air for 310 yards and also carried the ball two times for 48 yards, including scoring on a 39-yard run in the third quarter to give Tech a 38-27 lead. He threw touchdown passes to five different receivers in the game as junior **Tracey Stiger** caught two touchdown passes from Barthel.

BARTHEL HONORED AS NATIONAL OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: In addition to earning GSC Offensive Player of the Week honors last week, Barthel was also honored as the co-National Offensive Player of the Week by D2Football.com and also was named the D-II National Offensive Player of the Week by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* following his record-setting performance against West Georgia. Barthel shared the offensive honor on D2Football.com with North Dakota running back **Ryan Chappell** and shared offensive honors with Chappell and Assumption running back **Herbert Woodard** in *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*. It was first National Player of the Week for Barthel since *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* honored him on Oct. 23, 2006, after the Ouachita Baptist game.

GSC HONORS PODOBNIK AS ITS SPECIAL TEAMS PLAYER OF THE WEEK: On Monday, Sept. 10, redshirt junior **Michael Podobnik** was named the GSC's Special Teams Player of the Week after booting four punts for 178 yards and a 44.5 yard average in last Saturday's 21-6 win over Texas College. Against the Steers, Podobnik had a 56-yard punt and had one touchback in the game. He

becomes the second consecutive Wonder Boy honored by the league this season after **Cole Barthel** took home the league's offensive honor the previous week.

SPECIAL TEAMS PLAY HAS BEEN SPECIAL THIS SEASON: One of the biggest strengths of this season's Tech team as been the performance of its special teams. Junior punter **Michael Podobnik** is leading the GSC in punting (46.1 yards per punt), while junior receiver and return specialist **Tracey Stiger** (Russellville, Ark.) is averaging 24.7 yards per kickoff return, which is fourth in the latest GSC statistics and 9.9 yards per punt return. On the season, the Wonder Boys have blocked six kicks, includ-

ing blocking two punts for touchdowns in last week's game against Henderson State. In addition, Tech blocked two extra points in that same game.

RAY IS TECH'S DOUBLE-THREAT PLAYER:

Junior **Justin Ray** (Benton, Ark.) has become one of Tech's most versatile players as he has played at both receiver and quarterback so far this season. On the season, Ray is 23-for-45 passing for 185 yards as a quarterback and has rushed 49 times for 117 yards with one touchdown, which came on a 5-yard run against North Alabama and he has also caught eight passes for 136 yards, including a 48-yarder against Northeastern State in the season opener. Ray split time at quarterback last season with Barthel and is expected to play more quarterback due to Barthel's season-ending knee injury suffered against UNA.

BARTHEL TO SIT OUT REST OF SEASON DUE

TO INJURY: In the second quarter of Tech's home game against North Alabama on Sept. 29, Cole Barthel suffered a knee injury that will require season-ending surgery. It is the second knee injury for Barthel at Tech as he injured his knee in a non-contact drill on the first day of spring practice in 2006.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN: Tech had one player named a 2006 Preseason All-American by *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* - senior defensive tackle **Andrew Murphy**.

As a junior in 2006, Murphy, who was named a Third-Team *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-Southeast Region selection, ranked sixth in the final NCAA D-II national football statistics in forced fumbles (0.4 per game) and recorded 38 total tackles, including 18 solo stops, 3.5 tackles for loss and 2.5 quarterback sacks. In addition, he forced four fumbles, had three fumble recoveries and an interception, which was returned 42 yards for a touchdown

against Valdosta State, which led to Murphy being named the GSC's Defensive Player of the Week.

Murphy, a native of Booneville, Miss., and a transfer from NE Mississippi Community College, was one of 20 GSC players named to the Preseason *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-American team.

This season's All-American team featured 154 players and was comprised of 86 seniors, 50 juniors and 18 sophomores from all four geographic regions of NCAA Division II.

QUINCY SKINNER NAMED TECH'S 28TH ALL-AMERICAN IN 2006: In his only season at Tech, cornerback **Quincy Skinner** (Coral Springs, Fla.) made quite an impression as the Florida Atlantic transfer

became the school's 28th different Wonder Boy to earn All-American status and the 12th Wonder Boy to earn All-American recognition under Mullins. Skinner, who was a Second-Team All-GSC selection, finished last season ranked fifth nationally in Division II in interceptions (0.8 per game) and recorded 63 tackles, including a team-best 43 solo stops and had 2.5 tackles for loss, five pass break-ups, one fumble recovery, one forced fumble and defended 1.3 passes per game, which was 20th in the final D-II national statistics. Skinner became the third Wonder Boy to earn AFCA D-II Coaches' First-Team All-American honors and was the fifth-ever Tech player to be named an AP Little All-American as he was a third-team selection and also earned Third-Team *Don Hansen Football Gazette* All-Southeast Region honors.



WONDER BOYS WELCOME NEW COORDINATORS THIS SEASON: For the first time since 2004, Tech enters a season with both a new offensive and defensive coordinator. During the offseason, Mullins promoted **Benyard Jones** to defensive coordinator and brought in 18-year coaching veteran **Scott Preston** as the offensive coordinator. Jones, who is in his second tour of duty at Tech after spending five seasons from 1999-2004 at Tech as an assistant and then returning last season as the defensive line coach after spending the 2005 season as the defensive coordinator at Butler University, an NCAA Division I-AA member. Meanwhile, Preston brings a wealth of experience to Tech as he spent four seasons (2000-03) as the offensive coordinator, quarterback, running back and receivers coach at Illinois State University. In addition to Illinois State, Preston also had stints at Murray State University, Ventura [CA] College, Georgia Military College, San Francisco State and began his collegiate coaching career working with Hal Mumme at Valdosta State University.

TECH STRONG AT PROTECTING THE BALL IN 2006: Tech closed out the 2006 season ranked 28th in NCAA D-II Football in turnover margin as the Wonder Boys had a +0.6 margin for its 10 games. On the season, Tech's offense committed 22 turnovers as they had 11 interceptions and lost 11 fumbles, while its defense forced 14 fumbles and picked off 14 passes on the season. Tech was tied for the second in the GSC in turnover margin with Delta State. North Alabama led the league with a +0.7 margin as they committed 14 turnovers and forced 24 turnovers. So far this season, Tech has struggled taking care of the ball as they have 26 total turnovers, including 22 fumbles (losing 14 of the them), while their opponents have had 21 fumbles (lost nine of them) and have thrown 10 interceptions.

WONDER BOYS STRONG IN THE RED ZONE: Through the first seven games this season, Tech is 18-for-20 in putting points on the scoreboard inside the red zone. On the season, the Wonder Boys have scored 18 touchdowns when they get inside the red zone (within 20 yards of the end zone), including scoring in its only red zone opportunity in last Saturday's game against Henderson State. Last season, Tech was 28-for-35 (80 percent) in scoring chances inside the red zone as they

A native of Russellville, **Strasner** earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in journalism from Arkansas Tech in 2001 and a Master of Arts degree in multi-media journalism from Tech in 2006. He served as both a student assistant (1997-2001) and graduate assistant (2002-04) in the Tech sports information department under former Tech SID and CoSIDA Hall of Famer, **Larry Smith**.

Strasner currently serves as Director of Publications and Creative Services for University Relations at Arkansas Tech. He and his wife, Heather, live in Russellville.

Meanwhile, **Davis** serves as Tech's Director of Corporate and Athletic Relations in Tech's Development Office. Davis, who is a Russellville native, is married to Reta and the couple have two children, Will, a sophomore at Tech, who is a student assistant in Tech's SID office and Anna Grace, a 10th grader at Russellville High School.

scored 24 touchdowns and had four field goals.

35 POINTS IS THE MAGIC NUMBER: Since taking the reigns of the Tech program in 1997, Coach Mullins' Tech teams are 25-2 all-time in games in which they score 35 or more points in a single game. In fact, Tech is 33-11 when it scores between 21-34 points during the Mullins era, including being 2-1 this season. Tech has won 23 straight games when scoring at least 35 or more points and hasn't lost since falling 53-36 to UCA in 1997 when scoring 35 or more points.

NOEL RACKING UP THE TACKLES: Senior linebacker **Zach Noel** (Paragould, Ark.) continues to climb up the school's career tackle charts. Noel enters Saturday's game with Ouachita Baptist having recorded 212 total tackles, including 96 solo stops. In addition, he has had 10.0 tackles for 28 yards in losses and has picked off two passes, including one for a touchdown against Harding as a sophomore in 2005 and has recorded 13 career pass break-ups, including two in last week's game against Henderson State. In last Saturday's game against Henderson State, Noel had a game-high 10 total tackles, including one solo stop and a tackle for a loss.

PODOBNIK IS PUNTING WEAPON FOR WONDER BOYS: Through seven games this season, redshirt junior **Michael Podobnik** is slowly becoming a huge weapon on special teams for the Wonder Boys. Podobnik has punted 32 times on the season and is averaging a GSC-best 46.1 yards per punt and has had six touch-

backs, two fair catches and has downed five punts inside the 20-yard line. On the season, he has had 10 punts travel over 50 yards, including a 75-yard punt in Tech's season-opener against Northeastern State. In his last game against Henderson State, Podobnik had seven punts and averaged 43.7 yards per punt, including booming a 50-yard punt in the fourth quarter.

BARTHEL IS AN ACE IN TWO SPORTS:

Sophomore **Cole Barthel**, who is in his second season at Tech after transferring from the University of Arkansas, was a second round draft pick (71st pick overall) in the 2001 Major League Draft by the Atlanta Braves out of high school. Barthel decided to forgo college originally (he signed a National Letter of Intent with the Razorbacks as a quarterback) and played four seasons in the Atlanta Braves organization as a third baseman, including playing two seasons in Rome, Ga., an A-level minor league affiliate of the Braves. In his four-year minor league career, Barthel hit .251 with five home runs and 36 RBIs. Last season as a freshman with the Razorbacks, Barthel went through spring drills and played in two games before leaving Fayetteville at the end of the first semester and enrolling at Tech. As a high school player, Barthel was selected as the North Alabama Player of the Year and was one of three finalists for the top back of the year and a finalist for the Class 6A Player of the Year as a senior after throwing for 2,074 yards and 21 touchdowns on 269 passing attempts and also rushing for 700 yards. In addition, he was a three-time All-Area selection and was ranked 69th nationally among high school quarterbacks by Rivals100.com.

CHILDRESS IS TECH'S WORKHORSE ON THE GROUND:

Sophomore running back **Tim Childress** has become Tech's workhorse on the ground in his second season of competing for the Wonder Boys. Through seven games this season, the Batesville, Ark., native has carried the ball a team-high 96 times for a team-leading 304 yards and is averaging 3.2 yards per carry and 43.4

yards per game overall. In addition, he has scored one touchdown, a 1-yard run in Tech's 21-6 win over Texas College and has caught 14 passes for 118 yards (8.4 yds/reception). As a redshirt freshman last season, Childress carried the ball 25 times for 80 yards in 10 games for the Wonder Boys.

STIGER LOOKING FOR MORE IN 2007: Tracey

Stiger has picked up where he left off last season as a return specialist. Last season, Stiger averaged 20.8 yards on 30 kickoff returns, despite missing the final two games of the season due to an injury. The 20.8 average was second in the GSC and helped Stiger earn Second-Team All-GSC honors. In addition to his kick returning, Stiger also averaged a team-best 118.6 all-purpose yards, which was fourth in the GSC and 38th nationally in NCAA Division II. On the season, he caught 32 passes for 319 yards (10.0 yards/reception) and scored five touchdowns. Stiger enters Saturday's Ouachita Baptist game having gained 2,968 career all-purpose yards (118.7 yards/game), including catching 77 passes for 695 yards, rushing for 347 yards on 94 carries and has returned 73 kickoffs for 1,568 yards (21.5 yards/return) and has scored 15 career touchdowns. On the season, Stiger has caught a team-best 40 passes for 323 yards and has scored three touchdowns. In addition, he is averaging 126.9 all-purpose yards per game, which is sixth in the latest GSC statistics and is averaging 9.9 yards on punt returns and 24.7 on kickoff returns.

NCAA RULES CHANGES FOR 2007 SEASON:

In 2006, the NCAA changed the way it started the clock as it decided to start the game clock when the ball is kicked off, as opposed to previously starting the clock when the ball was touched legally in the field of play. This season, the NCAA has decided to abandon last year's new rule and return to the old clock rule that states, that on a kickoff, the game clock starts when the ball is touched legally in the field of play or crosses the goal line after the receiving team touches it in its end zone. In addition, on a change of possession, the clock will start on the snap of the ball. Other clock rules this season include that during televised games only, charged team timeouts will be one minute rather than 1:30. Another rule change this season is that teams will kickoff from its 30-yard line. Previously, the

ball was kicked off from the 35. For fouls by the kicking team on kickoffs and punts (other than kick-catch interference), the receiving team has the option to tack on the penalty where it will subsequently have the ball. The receiving team still may choose to have the down replayed after enforcement of the penalty at the previous spot. A third rule change this season is that no defensive player in an attempt to block, bat or catch a kick may be picked up, elevated, propelled or pushed by a teammate. This is an addition to an existing rule, with "elevated, propelled or pushed" added a new language.

HISTORY MADE IN 2004: Tech Football made history in 2004 as the Wonder Boys won its first-ever NCAA Division II Playoff game with its 24-20 victory at Buerkle Field over Catawba. In addition, Tech was the first-ever team from the state of Arkansas to host an NCAA Division II playoff game and they also was the first team from Arkansas to ever win an NCAA Division II playoff contest. The Wonder Boys, who finished with a 10-2 overall record in 2004, ended the season with its 42-24 loss at Albany State in the second round of the NCAA Playoffs. Prior to Tech's postseason win over Catawba, the Wonder Boys last postseason win came in 1971 against Northern State in the semifinals of the NAIA National Playoffs.

TECH UNVEILS NEW HELMETS, COLOR SCHEME THIS SEASON: During the offseason, Tech changed the color schemes for the school. Tech has switched from its traditional Green and Old Gold color to a Green (PMS 343) and Gold (PMS 116) scheme. The gold color is similar to the Green Bay Packers yellow that is worn on its helmets. With the change in colors, the Wonder Boys had to change its helmets this season from gold to yellow. In addition, they have added new uniforms for both home and away games this season.

TECH FINISHES 2006 RANKED 26TH IN ATTENDANCE: Despite playing all five of its home games last season at Russellville's Cyclone Stadium, Tech finished the year ranked 26th amongst 143 NCAA Division II teams in home attendance as the Wonder Boys averaged 5,467 for its five games at Cyclone Stadium. On the season, Tech had 27,336 fans attend their home contests. Fort Valley State

led all of D-II in attendance with an average of 13,682 per game, while Tuskegee was second with an average of 11,195. UNA was the first GSC team ranked as they finished fourth with an average of 10,091 per game, while Delta State was 21st with an average of 6,030 per game and West Alabama was 22nd as they averaged

5,783 per game last season.

GSC RETURNS TO TELEVISION AGAIN: For the third consecutive year, the GSC returns to live television this season.

This season's "GSC-TV Live" schedule features eight Thursday night contests, all of which will kick off at 7 p.m. CST and Tech's game with VSU, which will be aired on Saturday, Aug. 22 and will kickoff at 3 p.m. CST.

CSS will continue as the primary carrier for the "GSC-TV Live" games once again this season, bringing more than 5 million potential households, while Cox Sports (which is on channel 119 in Russellville) adds its 1.7 million customers to the mix for the second straight season. In addition, the GSC will also make the broadcasts available to other cable systems and open-air channels in non-conflicting areas, but the games will not be available on DirectTV or DishNetwork.

This year's "GSC-TV Live" package begins on Sept. 13 as defending GSC champion North Alabama plays at Harding. The next broadcast is scheduled for Sept. 20 when West Alabama plays at Henderson State and is followed by Tech's home league opener against VSU on Sept. 22. Southern Arkansas' game at Delta State rounds out the first month of the schedule on Sept. 27.

In October, West Georgia's game at Henderson State on Oct. 4 opens up the coverage, followed by Delta State's game on Oct. 11 at Valdosta State. Following the VSU-DSU game, North Alabama's home game with Delta State will be aired on Oct. 18 and Arkansas-Monticello's game at West Alabama on Oct. 25 closes out the month.

The final two live television broadcasts are slated for Nov. 1 when Henderson State plays at Ouachita Baptist in its annual "Battle of the Ravine" match-up and the schedule concludes on Nov. 8 with West Georgia's game at Valdosta State.

TECH SCHEDULED FOR ONE GSC-LIVE TV GAME: As part of the "GSC-TV Live" Game of the Week Television package, Tech will have one its games broadcast on live television this season.

The Tech game selected for live television broadcast on the "GSC-TV Live" Game of the Week was THE Sept. 22 Valdosta State in Russellville.

FORMER WONDER BOY JASON CAMPBELL SOARS IN FIRST SEASON OF ARENA FOOTBALL: Jason Campbell knows how to make a good first impression.

During his first season as a quarterback at Tech in 2004, Campbell threw for a school-record 2,922 yards and led the Wonder Boys to the second round of the NCAA Division II Playoffs.

Now, nearly three years later, Campbell has made a similar splash in the world of Arena Football while starting at quarterback for the 2007 Everett [Wash.] Hawks in his first season as a professional.

Campbell established new Everett franchise records for touchdown passes in a season (84) and passing yards in a season (3,663). In addition, he completed more

than 60 percent of his passes during 2007 and ranked among the top 10 quarterbacks in AF2 (a developmental league under the Arena Football League umbrella) in passing efficiency.

And Campbell accomplished all of this despite the fact that he did not start until the fifth game of the season.

"It was rough at first because in Arena Football you have to get rid of the ball so fast," said Campbell. "I was in the shotgun most of the time at Arkansas Tech."

After seeing time as a back-up quarterback in Everett's first four games, he got his first start in week five. Campbell took advantage of the opportunity, throwing for 218 yards and five touchdowns to help the Hawks to their first win of the season.

Campbell went on to lead Everett to five more victories, including a three-game winning streak during the final month of the season. The Hawks finished their season on July 28 with a record of 6-10.

Victories were the norm when Campbell was at Tech.

During his two years as the Wonder Boys' starting quarterback (2004-05), Tech accumulated an overall record of 17-5, including a 14-4 mark in GSC games. He completed his two-year Tech career with 5,100 yards of total offense (2nd-most in school history) and 5,079 passing yards (2nd-most in school history).

WHAT IS A WONDERBOY, YOU ASK?? Here is the story and history of the Wonder Boys. In 1919, Arkansas Tech's football team upset the highly-favored Jonesboro Aggies (now known as Arkansas State University) 14-0 behind a pair of 70-yard punt returns for touchdowns and two point-afters by a 17-year old quarterback by the name of **John Tucker**. The Jonesboro team had staked a claim to the mythical state football championship prior to the game.

Henry Loesch, the sports editor of the *Arkansas Gazette* in Little Rock, covered the game and coined the name "Wonder Boys" in complimenting the Tech team, then known as the Aggies, in his postgame story.

Tech's men's athletic teams have been known as the Wonder Boys ever since, and Tucker was thereafter labeled as "The Original Wonder Boy." Tucker went on to complete his education at the University of Alabama, but returned to Arkansas Tech and served in several capacities, including head football coach, athletics director and chemistry professor from 1925-72.

GREEN AND GOLD LUNCHEONS: The first of three Green and Gold Club Luncheons for 2007 was held on Monday, Aug. 20 at Western Sizzlin in Russellville and featured season previews by Mullins, Cross Country Coach **Tom Aspel** and Volleyball Coach **Kristy Bayer**. The next luncheon is scheduled for Oct. 22 and will serve as a preview of Tech 2007-08 men's and women's basketball seasons with Golden Suns first-year head coach **Dave Wilbers** and Wonder Boys second-year head coach **Mark Downey**.

Information includes updated schedules, rosters, statistics, results, current news releases, athlete bios and pre-game notes and press releases.

UP NEXT FOR TECH: Tech will conclude the home portion of its 2007 schedule on Saturday, Oct. 27, against Southern Arkansas for Senior Day. Kickoff for the SAU game is at 1 p.m. at Buerkle Field. Following the SAU game, Tech will conclude the regular season on Saturday, Nov. 3 at Harding. Tech collected a 36-29 win last season over the Muleriders in Magnolia. The victory was Tech's 500th all-time win.
